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# 1. Introduction, -

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra has published the rules on 24.04.2017 and its amendments on 05.06.2018, 04.06.2019 and 09.07.2020 to regulate the admissions to the **First year of Full Time Professional Undergraduate Technical Courses** (Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Hotel Management and Catering Technology) **and Direct Second Year** (Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy and Hotel Management and Catering Technology). These rules also includes the admissions in first year of degree in Planning.

These rules are also applicable for admissions in Government and Government Aided professional educational institutions vide Government Resolution of Higher & Technical Education Department No. TEM-2016/CR (473/16)/ TE-4 Dated 25<sup>th</sup> April 2017 and amendments vide Gr No. TEM-2019/CR 46/ TE-4 dated 04<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

This brochure gives information regarding the eligibility and rules of admission to First and Second year of various technical professional undergraduate degree courses in the State of Maharashtra. This also provides information about invitation of applications for admission, preparation of merit list, distribution of seats, details of reservation, various rounds and stages of Centralised Admission Process (CAP), admissions in Institutional Quota seats and vacant seats after CAP, supernumerary seats, refund of fees, etc.

#### 2. Definitions. -

- (a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015);
- (b) "Admission Reporting Centre" means a centre where the Candidate shall report for confirmation of admission by verification of documents and payment of fees;
- (c) "All India Seats" means seats available to an eligible Indian National Candidate;
- (d) "Application Form" means prescribed form filled up online by the Candidate for admission;
- (e) "Autonomous Institution" means the institution to which autonomy is granted by the University Grants Commission;
- (f) "CAP" means Centralised Admission Process;
- (g) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority;
- (h) "CET" means Common Entrance Test;
- (i) "Competent Authority" means the Commissioner of State CET appointed by the Government under section 10 of the Act, for conducting CET through CAP for the admissions into Private Professional Educational Institutions;
- (j) "Courses" means the full time Undergraduate technical courses in

- Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture, Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Planning and Pharm. D.;
- (k) "Department" means Higher and Technical Education Department of Government of Maharashtra;
- (1) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;
- (m) "Facilitation Centre" means a centre where the facilities like sale of application kits, filling online forms, verification of documents and redressal of grievances, etc, are provided;
- (n) "Home University (HU)" means the university area as specified in rule 5(1) herein;
- (o) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (p) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time;
- (q) "Inter-Se-Merit" means the order of merit declared by the Competent Authority in respect of various classes/category of Candidates;
- (r) "Jammu and Kashmir" means the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Territory of Ladakh;
- (s) "JEE Main" means the Joint Entrance Examination conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA), New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (t) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;
- (u) "NATA" means National Aptitude Test in Architecture;
- (v) "NEET" means the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA) , New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (w) "Non-Autonomous Institution" means those institutions which are not 'Autonomous Institutions';
- (x) "OHU" means the area Outside Home University area;
- (y) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate/person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955 and includes Persons of Indian Origin(PIO).

**Explanation:** For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders registered under notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F. No. 26011/04/98- F. I dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I. Dated 9th January, 2015;

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- (z) "Qualifying Examination" means examinations on the basis of which a candidate becomes eligible for admission or its equivalent examination;
- (aa) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (bb) "Supernumerary Seats" means seats which are over and above the Sanctioned Intake approved by the appropriate authority and the Government, from time to time;
- (cc) "TFWS" means the Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme of All India Council for Technical Education.

# 3. Invitation of Application.

- (1) The Competent Authority shall invite Online Applications from Candidates for participating in CET and / or CAP for seeking admission to the Professional Courses for which State CET or alternative entrance examination is required for the academic year.
- (2) The Competent Authority shall invite online applications in the prescribed form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for seeking admission to the undergraduate technical courses, which are exempted from CET as per provisions of the Act.
- (3) The Competent Authority shall invite online application form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) to the undergraduate technical courses for which the entrance test is conducted by the appropriate authority under any Central Act and shall be applicable for seeking admission to such professional courses, as per the provisions of the Central Act, rules and regulations made there under.
- (4) The Candidates seeking admissions to the professional courses for the seats provided in -
  - (a) 7(1)-Maharashtra State Candidature Seats,7(2)- All India Candidature Seats, 7(3)- Minority Quota Seats and 7(5)(b)- Supernumerary Seats for Union Teritory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Teritory of Ladakh Migrant Candidature- For these seats the candidates shall apply to the Competent Authority for admission through Centralised Admission Process(CAP).
  - (b) 7(4)- Institutional Quota Seats and 7(5)(a) Supernumerary Seats for OCI/ PIO, Foreign Students and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries Candidates -For these seats the candidates shall initially apply to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to respective institutes, to enable the institutions to give admissions to such eligible applicants on the basis of inter-se merit. It is pre-requisite and mandatory to apply for verification of documents to the Competent Authority to be eligible for admission under these quota.

(5) The Candidate should submit the necessary Certificates issued by the concerned Authority, along-with the application, in the given Proforma. The list of documents to be submitted is given in this Information Brochure.

# 4. Role of Competent Authority in the process of Admission. -

- a) The Competent Authority, the Commissioner of State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra State, shall be the authority for Centralised Admission Process and shall direct the students as per their allotment through CAP to all institutions i.e. Government, Government Aided, University Department, University Managed Colleges, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University, Lonere (BATU) & Institute of Chemical Technology (ICT), Mumbai and Unaided Private Professional Technical Educational Institutions.
- b) The Competent Authority shall deal with the representations received from the candidates pertaining to allotment and admissions as Grievance Redressal Authority.
- c) All the decisions taken in relation to Admission to First/ Direct Second Year of courses, by the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all concerned.

(1) Maharashtra State Candidature. -A Candidate can claim only one type of Maharashtra State Candidature Type i.e. from Type A to E.

- **(2) All India Candidature.** -The Candidates having Indian Nationality are eligible under this Category.
- **(3) Minority Candidature.** -The Maharashtra domiciled Candidate belonging to a particular Linguistic or Religious Minority Community from within the State and as notified by the Government are eligible under this Category.
- **(4) NRI Candidature.** -The Candidates who fulfils the conditions as defined in clause (n) of section 2 of the Act are eligible under this Category.
- (5) Foreign Student or OCI or PIO Candidature. -The Foreign Student Candidates, as defined in clause (i) of section 2 of the Act, the Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) candidate, as defined under clause (s) of section 2 and Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) as defined in clause (o) of Section 2 of the Act are eligible under this Category.

# (6) Jammu and Kashmir & Ladakh Migrant Candidature. -

- (a) The children of citizens, who are displaced from Union Teritory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Teritory of Ladakh to any part of India or from unsafe border area of Union Teritory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Teritory of Ladakh to a relatively safer place in Union Teritory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Teritory of Ladakh from 1990 onwards due to terrorist activities; or
- (b) The children of officers belonging to Indian Administrative Services (IAS) or Indian Police Services (IPS) or Indian Foreign Services (IFS) and children of staff belonging to military and paramilitary forces transferred to Union Teritory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Teritory of Ladakh to combat terrorist activities and joined the post on or before the last date for submission of application for admission; or
- (c) The children of staff and officers of Union Teritory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Teritory of Ladakh police engaged in combating terrorism are eligible under this category;

# 6. Sanctioned Intake and Supernumerary Seats for various Courses. -

(1) The Sanctioned Intake for First Year Degree Course, Direct Second Year (Lateral entry) shall be as per the approval given by the authority which is competent for giving approval to respective courses and affiliation given by the respective affiliating University.

The Institute Information, Courses and the Sanctioned Intake displayed on the web site of the Competent Authority shall be treated as authentic for admissions for the year 2020-21. Candidates shall refer the web site for the revised and final Institute Information before filling the Option/Preference Form.

For admission to Direct Second Year (Lateral entry), the number of seats available shall be calculated as given in **Schedule** - **II**.

- (2) The supernumerary seats shall be available to the Institutions as approved by the appropriate authority, from time to time.
- 7. Allocation of Seats. -The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates in the Home University, Other than Home University and State Level shall be in accordance with the policy of the Government as specified in **Schedule-II** for First Year and **Schedule-II** for Direct Second Year of various Under Graduate Courses.
- (1) Maharashtra State Candidature Seats. -The Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature as specified in 5(1), shall be eligible for these seats.
- **(2) All India Candidature Seats.** -The Candidates having Candidature as given in 5(2) shall be eligible for these seats.
- (3) **Minority Quota Seats.** -The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in 5(3) shall be eligible for these seats as specified in **Schedule-II**.

These seats shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 6, of the Act.

- **(4) Institutional Quota Seats. -** The Institution can admit Eligible Candidates as specified in Schedule-I and Schedule-II, subject to following conditions. -
  - (i) The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in 5(1), 5(2) 5(3), 5(4) and 5(6) shall be eligible for these seats;
  - (ii) The maximum 5% seats may be filled in from the NRI Candidates, if it is approved by the Appropriate Authority, at the Institution level.
  - (iii) If the seats reserved for NRI quota remains vacant, those vacant seats may be filled in by the Institution, from the Eligible Candidates of All India Candidature;

NOTE:- While filling these seats the preference shall be given to the Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit*.

# (5) Supernumerary Seats for, -

# (a) OCI/ PIO, Foreign Students and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries (CIWGC) Candidates. -

- (i) The Candidates having candidature as given in 5(5) and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries shall be eligible for these supernumerary seats.
- (ii) These seats shall be subject to the maximum of 15% of the Sanctioned Intake seats or as prescribed by the Appropriate Authority, from time to time. Out of 15% seats, one third shall be reserved for the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries and two third seats shall be reserved for OCI / PIO or Foreign Students candidates or as prescribed by the Appropriate Authority, from time to time.

Provided that, if seats in a course reserved for Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries remains vacant, then such vacant seats shall be filled in from the candidates of OCI, PIO or Foreign Students and if seats reserved for candidates of OCI, PIO or Foreign Students remains vacant then such vacant seats shall be filled in from the children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries:

Provided further that, any vacant seat in both the above quota may be filled in from NRI Candidature Candidates, subject to the approval from appropriate authority for the NRI seats.

- (iii) These seats shall be filled in by the institution on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of candidates as given in section 8 of this brochure.
- (iv) Candidates' fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Foreign Nationals/PIOs/Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries/Child or Ward of NRI shall send their applications to the designated centers notified by the Competent Authority for this purpose.

# (b) Jammu and Kashmir & Ladakh Migrant Candidature:

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The Candidates having candidature as given in 5(6) shall be eligible for these seats.
- (iii) The number of seats for this quota shall be as per the policy of the Government.
- (iv) Candidates' fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Jammu and Kashmir & Ladakh Migrant Candidature shall send the printed copy of online filled & submitted application form & copy of uploaded documents by hand/speed post/courier for verification & confirmation to the designated centers notified by the Competent Authority for this purpose or as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority for this purpose.

# (c) Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) Seats:

## (I) Scheme

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The scheme shall be mandatory for all Technical Institutions offering undergraduate programs that are approved by the All India Council for Technical Education.
- (iii) Seats up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and will be available to such courses in an Institute where a minimum of 30% of sanctioned seats in the respective courses are filled up in respective CAP Round. For calculation of 30%, the Institutional Quota seats retained by institute for the course shall be considered as completely filled.
- (iv) The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the Fee Regulation Authority for unaided Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other fees except tuition fees shall be paid by the beneficiary.
- (v) The Candidates admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change Institution/course at any stage under any circumstances.
- (vi) These seats shall be available for admission to First Year of Engineering & Technology and Hotel Management & Catering Technology courses and Pharmacy.

# (II) Eligibility

- (i) Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates are eligible for these seats
- (ii) Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates having their parent's annual income less than Rs. 8 Lakh (Rupees Eight Lakh only) from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall submit Income certificate issued by Appropriate Authority.

# (III) Admissions Procedure

These seats are allotted by the Competent Authority as per inter-se merit. For this purpose, the Competent Authority shall invite applications, prepare a separate merit list for this category by following the same criteria as for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.

# (d) Jammu and Kashmir Candidates and North East States:

- (i) The admission to the candidates as per *Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)* for the students belonging to Jammu and Kashmir and the scheme of Government of India of allocation of supernumerary seats in AICTE approved colleges to North Eastern States and UTs (NEUT) which lack in such facilities of technical education shall be done by the competent authority appointed by the Central Government as per their eligibility criteria.
- (ii) The fee for the students belonging to Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Territory of Ladakh admitted under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS) to the Private Unaided Institutes shall be the minimum of the fee prescribed by the Fee Regulatory Authority (FRA) for that institute and the maximum fee ceiling amount prescribed by All India Council for Technical Education(AICTE).
- (iii) The fee for the students admitted under the scheme of Government of India of allocation of supernumerary seats in AICTE approved colleges to North Eastern States and UTs (NEUT) which lack in facilities of technical education shall be same as that for the Non Autonomous Government Institutes.

# (6) Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to **candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only** subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

# (a) Reservation for Backward Class category Candidates:

The percentage of seats reserved for candidates of backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra State is as given below. The percentage of reservation is the percentages of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates, coming under the CAP. Backward class candidates shall claim the category to which they belong to at the time of submission of application form for CAP.

# (b) Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five percent (5%) seats of the total seats for Maharashtra candidates coming under CAP per course shall be reserved for Children of ex- service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1), Children of active service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2), Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State, or who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

- (i) These seats are within the sanctioned intake and are available as **State Level seats**.
- (ii) A combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 and DEF3 candidates shall be prepared.
- (iii) Candidates claiming these seats shall produce additional documents in Proforma C, D and/or E as applicable.
- (iv) This provision is NOT available to the children of **CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working /who has worked in the Indian Defence Service.

# (c) Reservation for Persons with Disability Candidate:

Five percent (5%) seats of total seats for Maharashtra candidates per course coming under CAP shall be reserved for Candidates having any of the following minimum 40% benchmark disability.

A single merit list of all eligible candidates shall be prepared. The allotment of seats reserved for the Candidates with Disability shall be done on the basis of an inter-se merit. These seats are available for Maharashtra domiciled candidates in HU / SL seats.

The candidates claiming reservation under this category shall submit the certificates from the authority competent for issuing such certificate. The certificate (Pro-forma) should clearly state that the extent of disability is not less than 40% (Forty percent) and the disability is permanent in nature.

#### Note: -

Candidates with Disability should note that on admission to degree course they will not be given any exemptions or additional facility in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the respective Universities.

- (ii) The merit list for the NRI / OCI / PIO and Foreign Students Candidates stated at rules 5(4) and 5(5) and Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries shall be prepared on the basis of the percentage of marks in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together at Qualifying examination:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics at HSC:
- (b) higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- (c) higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.

# 9. Centralised Admission Process (CAP). -

# (1) Centralised Admission Process CAP stages

The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act.

The Government, Government Aided institutes, University Departments and University managed Institutions shall also admit the candidates through CAP. The stages of CAP shall be as stated below, -

- (a) Display or Publishing of Information Brochure by the Competent Authority. The Information Brochure shall be published on the website of the Competent Authority .The candidate should read the information brochure carefully.
- (b) The candidate should fill the Online Application Form as per the notified schedule for respective admission.

- (i) For admisions to First Year Engineering and Technology, Planning, Pharmacy, Pharm D., Hotel Management & Catering Technology, Architecture:
  - a. The eligible candidates aspiring for admission on the basis of CET conducted by the Competent Authority of Maharashtra State should apply online for admission. Such candidates need not have to pay application fee.
  - b. The eligible candidates aspiring for admission only on the basis of National Level Examinations mentioned in the eligibility criterion and approved by Maharashtra State time to time, except CET conducted by the Competent Authority of Maharashtra State should apply online for admission and shall pay required fees online (Non Refundable) as given in the table below.
- (ii) For Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy and Hotel Management and Catering Technology: The eligible candidates are required to fill the application form Online.
- (iii) Following are the details of the fees to be paid by the candidate through online mode only.

(iv) The Application processing fee shall be as notified by the competent

- authority from time to time and the amount is Non Refundable.
- (v) The list of the Facilitation Centers shall be published on the website. The Facilitation center shall facilitate the candidate to fill the Online Application Form, scan and upload the required documents.
- (vi) The Candidates will also be able to fill in Online Application Form and upload the scanned copies of the required documents through any computer/device connected to internet.
- (vii) Candidates are required to fill in all the details as per the instructions and Upload scanned images of valid necessary original documents as per the requirement of the admission while filling online application form.
- (viii) Candidate can edit/update the information in his application form before he confirms it at any of the Facilitation Centre.
- (ix) After filling the information and submission of Application Form, the Candidates shall verify the data filled and correct it, if required. The candidate shall take printout of the submitted application form and sign it.
- (x) The Printout of form shall have list of documents required to be produced by the candidate for substantiating his claim made in the application form. The candidate shall carry a set of Xerox copies of the required documents.
- (c) Document Verification at Facilitation Centre by the Candidate or through the method prescribed by the Competent Authority for this purpose. It is mandatory on the candidate's part to produce all original documents in support of the claim made in the application form.
  - After confirmation of application form, information cannot be changed by candidate.
- (d) Display or Publishing of Provisional merit list, Submission of grievances, if any, through the method prescribed by the Competent Authority for this purpose. and Display or Publishing of Final Merit Lists;
  - i. Provisional Merit List of eligible candidates will be displayed on the website.
  - ii. For discrepancy if any, in the provisional merit list, within specified grievance period, Candidates can submit the grievances through the method prescribed by the Competent Authority for this purpose.
  - iii. No document shall be accepted to substantiate the claim made in application after scheduled dates.
  - iv. Final merit lists will be displayed on the website.

# NOTE: - The merit list gives relative position of the candidate and it does not guarantee admission to any course/ institute.

(e) Display of Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) available for respective CAP Rounds. The Competent Authority shall publish the information on the website about institutes, courses offered, Sanctioned intake and number of seats available for each category before each round.

- (f) Filling up and confirmation of online option form having preferences of Courses and Institutions prior to respective CAP Rounds. Candidates may fill in preferences of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference as specified by Competent Authority. The option form once confirmed by the candidate through their login shall be considered for allotment in the respective CAP Rounds;
  - Candidates may fill in **maximum 300 choices** of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference;
    - (i) In order to participate in the CAP (subject to fulfillment of the eligibility requirements of respective CAP round), it is MANDATORY to fill the Online Option Form for respective CAP Round.
    - (ii) Candidates will be able to fill in the online option form through their login.
    - (iii) It is mandatory for all candidates to confirm the online option form.
    - (iv) After confirmation of Option form, the candidate will not be able to change the Options.
    - (v) Candidates should not disclose their Application ID & Password to others to avoid impersonation. Competent Authority shall not be responsible for submissions done by others on behalf of the candidate. For Security reasons, candidates are instructed to keep changing the password and keep note of it in secured place.
    - (vi) The serial number of block in the option form indicates preference of choice. Thus the choice code of the institute filled by the candidate in block No. 1 will be considered as first preference (Highest Priority Choice).
    - (vii) Option form received through online submission only will be considered for further processing.
    - (viii) Candidate shall confirm the submitted on-line Option Form by reentering Application ID and Password. The candidate can take a printout of the confirmed Option form for his record and future reference
    - (ix) The candidate can fill in minimum 1 and maximum 300 options. The candidate shall fill the institute choice code against the option number in the online option form.
- (g) Display of Provisional Allotment of respective CAP Round indicating allotted institute and Course.
- (h) Reporting and accepting the offered seat at Admission Reporting Centre by the Candidate as per the schedule declared by the Competent Authority through the method prescribed by the Competent Authority for the purpose of accepting the offered seat and rectifying the errors as per the clause (e) of sub-rule (4) of this rule.;
- (i) Only after reporting to ARC, the candidate should report to the allotted institute for seeking admission on the allotted seat as per final allotment in CAP rounds;

- (j) The time schedule prescribed by the competent authority for compliances for various stages of CAP is mandatory.
- (2) Conduct of CAP Round-I.- The seats available for Round- I shall be published on the Website. The Candidate whose names appear in the final merit list of CAP shall be eligible to participate in this round by filling online option form. The candidate shall fill and confirm the option form through candidate's Login.
- (3) During the CAP: (a) If a candidate is allotted the seat as per his first preference, such allotment shall be auto freezed and the candidate shall accept the allotment so made. Such candidate shall not be eligible for participation in the subsequent CAP rounds. Such candidates shall then report to ARC for verification of documents and payment of seat acceptance fee as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority. Thereafter such candidates shall report to the allotted institute and seek admission on the allotted seat. If such candidate does not report to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority, their claim on the allotted seat shall stand forfeited automatically and the seat shall become available for fresh allotment. For such candidate, the allotment so made shall be the final allotment;
- (b) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than the first preference given by the candidate and if the candidate is satisfied with such allotment and do not wish to participate in further CAP rounds, such candidate can freeze the offered seat through candidate's login. Once the candidate freezes the allotted seat, such candidate shall then report to ARC for verification of documents and payment of seat acceptance fee as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority. Thereafter such candidates shall report to the allotted institute and seek admission on the allotted seat. For such candidate, the allotment so made shall be the final allotment. If such candidate does not report to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority, their claim on the allotted seat shall stand forfeited automatically and the seat shall become available for fresh allotment. Such candidate shall then be not eligible for participation in the subsequent CAP rounds;
- (c) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than first preference and accepted the seat by reporting to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority shall be eligible for participation in the subsequent rounds for betterment;
- (d) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than first preference and not accepted the seat by not reporting to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance shall be eligible for participation in the subsequent rounds;
- **(4) Conduct of CAP Round-II**.- (a) The seats available for Rounds II shall be published on the website. The Candidates eligible for Round II are allowed to fill in and/or edit online option form filled in by the candidate for the previous round. The seats to be allotted during this round shall be available to the eligible candidates falling under the following categories.
  - (i) Candidates as per the sub-rule 3(c) and 3(d) above;

- (ii) Candidates who have not been allotted any seat in any of the previous round;
- (iii) Candidates who did not participate (failure of filling option form) in previous
- (b) Candidates who have been allotted seat other than first preference and reported to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance, whilst filling fresh option form, he/she need not fill the preference already allotted to the candidate in the previous round. Once upward preference is allotted to such candidate, his earlier seat allotment shall stand automatically cancelled. In the event of no such upward preference is allotted, his previous allotment stands retained;
- (c) There shall be no further betterment option available to the candidate after round II. The allotment made and/or allotment retained in round II for participating candidates in round II shall be final;
- (d) At the time of reporting to ARC for confirming the allotted seat as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority, the candidate shall submit all the original documents in support of the claims made in the application. In the event the candidate fails to produce the documents in support of the claim, so made in the application, the allotment shall stand cancelled automatically and the seat shall become available for allotment in further rounds.
- (e) The candidate will be entitled to rectify the following errors in the application form at the time of scrutiny of documents at ARC as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority *viz*.
  - (i) change of gender from male to female and vice-versa;
  - (ii) error while entering marks obtained by candidate in examination, CET. However, the change in the merit number due to increase in the marks will not be permitted;
  - (iii) error while mentioning the caste/sub-caste/the category of backward class but in no case a candidate will be allowed to change from General to Reserved Category. A reserved category candidate will be allowed to change his category from Reserved to General upon his failure to submit requisite documents like Caste/Tribe Certificate, Validity Certificate, Non-Creamy Layer Certificate etc. as the case may be.
  - (iv) removal of minority status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (v) removal of Disability status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (vi) removal of Defence status due to failure of submission of supporting documents
  - (vii) change in Type of Candidature;
  - (viii) change in Home University;
  - (ix) removal of Tuition Fee Waiver Seats (TFWS) status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (x) change in group/sub-group pertaining to direct second year engineering admissions;
  - (xi) change in Qualification.

Apart from the above no other change or rectification shall be allowed.

(5) The Candidate shall report to the institution finally allotted to him and confirm his admission in institution as per the schedule. The Institute shall verify the required documents and upload the admission of the candidates in the online system through Institute Login immediately and shall issue a system generated receipt of confirmation of admission to the candidate.

# (6) Fees and Concessions:

(a) Fees Prescribed for Government, Government Aided Institutes and University Managed Engineering / Technology Degree Courses:

Fee structure for these institutes shall be as prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra from time to time.

(b) Fees prescribed in Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions:

The Adhoc/Interim fee structure shall be as approved by the Fee Regulating Authority established under the Act. The final fee approved and published by the Fee Regulating Authority for that year shall be the fee payable by the candidate for that course for that academic year.

(c) Details of Concession in fees for Backward Class Category and Economically Weaker Section Candidates (belonging to Maharashtra State only)

For SC/ST/VJDT NT(A) /NT(B) /NT(C) /NT(D) /SBC /OBC and EWS category candidates, the scheme/mode of concessions, scheme of loan scholarship (if any) for eligible candidates, in tuition and other fees will be announced by the Central/ State Government. These candidates will get only that amount of waiver as notified in the circulars issued by the Government Department from time to time, subject to fulfillment of norms and conditions laid down by these Departments.

Candidates claiming fee concession under various categories shall produce the requisite certificates as may be specified by the respective Government Departments.

(d) Fees for Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh Migrant Candidates and North East and Union Territory Candidates admitted by appropriate authority:

These candidates shall pay the fees as applicable to the Non Autonomous Government institutes (as given in 9(6)(a)). Candidates shall also pay additional fees as prescribed by the concerned University from time to time.

(e) Caution Money Deposits:

Caution money deposit received from the students shall be refunded after successful completion of the course or after canceling the admission. Unless there is any recovery, no deduction shall be made from the caution

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money deposit. However, if candidate does not apply for refund, within 3 complete financial years after the student actually leaves the institution; or, within 3 complete financial years after the date of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier the amount of caution money deposit shall be transferred to Students Aid Fund in case of Un-Aided/Autonomous colleges and credited to Government in case of Government and Government-Aided Non Autonomous Colleges.

- **10. CAP allotment stages and process of allotment.** -Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner, -
- (1) Maharashtra State Candidature Candidate. -(1) The stages of computerised allotment are as follows, -

# Stage -I: For all the Candidates. -

- (a) All the Candidates (Open, Reserved, Male, Female, Tuition Fee Waiver) belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their *Inter-Se-*Merit.
- (a-1) Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and Orphan Candidates shall be considered for allotment of seats reserved for them as per their *Inter-Se-Merit*, and if seat is not available in their reserved category, then they shall be considered for allotment in Open Category as per the *Inter-Se-Merit*.
  - (b) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-Se-Merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.
  - (c) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category by virtue of their merit and in case of SBC Candidates who were in Backward Class prior to their inclusion in SBC Category shall be considered in their original Backward Class Category.
  - (d) Allotment to the Persons with Disability Category Candidates.-
    - (i) Allotment of seats to the Persons with Disability Category Candidates shall be within their respective Reserved or General category only.
    - (ii) The number of seats available for the Persons with Disability Category Candidates shall be indicated in total number for the specific course as per the seats available in the CAP for that course.
    - (iii) If the seat for Persons with Disability Category Candidates as per their prescribed reservation percentage within their respective reserved or general category comes out to be complete integer (no rounding off the fractional value is permissible) then only such seat shall be earmarked as reserved for that particular reserved or general category for Persons with Disability candidate and shall be allotted as per their Inter-Se-Merit.

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(iv) All other seats (except earmarked seats) available for Persons with Disability Category Candidates for that course shall be allotted as per their Inter-Se-Merit from combined list of all Persons with Disability Category Candidates:

Provided that, not more than one seat shall be filled in from same reserved category as per their Inter-Se-Merit:

Provided further that, the candidate not considered for allotment due to provision of above proviso, shall be considered for allotment of seat from general Persons with Disability Category as per their Inter-Se-Merit.

- (v) After allotment of the seat to Person with Disability Category Candidate, a seat from that General or respective Backward Class Category and Person with Disability Category shall be treated as utilized.
- (vi) If in the seat matrix for any course, total available seats for Reserved or General category comes out to be less than two, then in such case, no seat shall be allotted to the Person with Disability Category Candidate.
- (e) Allotment to the Defence Category Candidates.-
  - (i) Allotment of seat to the Defence Category Candidates shall be within their respective Reserved or General category only.
  - (ii) The number of seats available for the Defence Category Candidates shall be indicated in total number for the specific course as per the seats available in the CAP for that course.
  - (iii) If the seat for Defence Category Candidates as per their prescribed reservation percentage within their respective reserved or general category comes out to be complete integer (no rounding off the fractional value is permissible) then only such seat shall be earmarked as reserved for that particular reserved or general category for Defence Category candidate and shall be allotted as per their Inter-SeMerit.
  - (iv) All other seats (except earmarked seats) available for Defence Category Candidates for that course shall be allotted as per their Inter-Se-Merit from combined list of all Defence Category Candidates:

Provided that, not more than one seat shall be filled in from same reserved category as per their Inter-Se-Merit:

Provided further that, the candidate not considered for allotment due to the above provision, shall be considered for the allotment of seat from general seats for Defence Category as per their Inter-Se-Merit.

(v) After allotment of the seat to Defence Category Candidate a seat from that General or respective Backward Class Category and Defence Category shall be treated as utilized.

- (vi) If in the seat matrix for any course, total available seats for Reserved or General category comes out to be less than two, then in such case, no seat shall be allotted to the Defence Category Candidate.
- (f) If a seat is available for a candidate in more than one category, then the seat allotment shall be done in the sequence as given below,
  - (i) Seat for ladies
  - (ii) Seat for Persons with disability candidates
  - (iii) Seat for Defence category candidates
- (g) The TFWS seat shall be allotted to the eligible Candidate only to such course in an Institute where a minimum of 30 % of sanctioned seats in the respective course are allotted.
- <u>Stage II</u>: For allotment of seats reserved for Female to Male Candidates. -If the seat remains vacant after allotment to Female Candidates of the Backward Class Category or Open Category, such seat shall be allotted to the Male Candidates belonging to respective Backward Class or Open Category.
- <u>Stage -III</u>: For SBC Category Candidates. -If the Backward Class Category seat remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates of SBC Category, limited to the extent of 2% seats.
- **Stage -IV, Stage-V&Stage -VI:** Deleted (As per amendment dated 4th June 2019)
- <u>Stage -VII</u>: For all Candidates (without any type of Reservation). -The seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit*.

# Stage-VIII: For All Candidates (without any Candidature Type): -

- (i) The seats remaining vacant shall be allotted to the All Eligible Candidates.
- (ii) In case of Direct Admission to Second Year (Lateral Entry) of Engineering and Technology: if the seats remain vacant such seats shall be filled in on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Bachelor of Science Candidates.
- <u>Stage -IX</u>: For First Year Engineering admission to Diploma Candidates. After completion of stage VIII, If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to the Diploma Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit*.
- (2) In addition to above while allotting a seat for Direct Second Year of Engineering (Lateral Entry), seat shall be allotted as follows, -
  - (i) The seat of Degree Course shall be allotted to the Candidate having same sub-group Diploma Course;
  - (ii) Vacant seats, if any, shall be allotted to the Candidate having the same main group Diploma Course.
  - (iii) If further seats remain vacant, it shall be allotted to the Candidate having any other Diploma Course.
  - (iv) If the seats remain vacant such seats shall be filled in on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the Bachelor of Science Candidates.

The Groups and Subgroups are given in Schedule III.

- (3) For seats reserved for Female Candidate, the procedure for reservation as given in Government Circular of General Administration Department No. RSV 1012/CN-16/12/16A Dated 13th August 2014 shall be adopted.
- **(2) All India Candidature Candidates-** The allotment to these seats shall be done through CAP on the basis of score of, -
  - (a) First Year Engineering– JEE (Main) B.E./B.Tech 2020 score and then if the seats remains vacant, on the basis of MHT-CET 2020 score;
  - (b) First Year Planning JEE (Main) B.Planning 2020 score and then if the seats remains vacant, on the basis of MHT-CET 2020 score;
  - (c) First Year Pharmacy and Pharm. D. NEET 2020 score and then if seats remain vacant on the basis of MHT-CET 2020 Score;
  - (d) First Year Architecture Score obtained by giving 50% weightage to HSC marks and 50% weightage to valid score of National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA)2020 or normalised marks in JEE (Main) B.Arch score;
  - (e) First Year Hotel Management and Catering Technology NCHM JEE score and then if seats remain vacant on the basis of MAH-B.HMCT-CET 2020 Score.

All these seats are treated as "General Category" seats and no reservation is provided in these seats for Candidates of Backward Class Category, Ladies, Persons with Disability and Defence, etc.

(3) Minority Quota Seats: -The stages of computerised allotment are as follows, -

**Stage-I:** The seats under minority quota in the minority institution linguistic or religious) shall be allotted to the respective minority candidates.

**Stage-II:** If the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates.

**Stage-III:** Further, if the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the All India candidature Candidates.

(4) Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Territory of Ladakh Migrant Candidature Candidate-The supernumerary seats for Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Territory of Ladakh Migrant Candidature Candidates shall be allotted to the eligible candidates as in 5(6), on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit in the entrance test conducted by the appropriate authority and if seats remain vacant on the basis of CET conducted by competent authority.

### a) Application Form Filling, Submission and Admission Centres

The eligible candidate shall fill the Online Application Form within the notified schedule, as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority.

i. The Competent Authority shall publish the provisional Merit List. The candidates not appeared for CET conducted by competent authority but appeared for any other CET conducted by appropriate authority can also apply,

- however such candidates are required to pay the Application Fee through online mode (Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Net Banking).
- ii. The candidates whose names do not appear in the merit list(s) will not be able to participate in entire Admission Process.

### b) Counselling Round for J and K and ladakh Migrant Candidates at identified Admission Centre

- i. The counselling round shall be conducted as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority.
- ii. Candidate seeking admission against these seats shall report to the Admission Centre of Admission Authority for admission as per the schedule.
- iii. The candidates shall produce the documentary evidence strictly as per the Proforma(s) in support of their claims.
- iv. These Admissions will be made strictly in the order of merit from amongst the candidates who report in person for admission at the concerned identified admission centre (as per 10(4) a) as per schedule, against the seats available in the various institutes at the time when the candidate actually reports for admission.
- v. Admissions once confirmed shall be final and candidate shall not be allowed to seek transfer of their admission to any other institute and/or any other course during entire duration of the course.
- vi. The candidates reporting late for the admission shall be considered for allotment against seats which are available at that time. The decision of the admission centre in-charge shall be final and binding.

### Important note

Candidates admitted under this provision are not allowed to change course or college in any year of study.

### (5) Reporting at institutes:

- i. Candidate shall confirm the admission by paying the requisite amount of fee and by submitting required documents in original to respective institute, to which admission is granted as per schedule.
- ii. If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting necessary original documents within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- iii. If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured to some other institution, he or she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the institution where he/she has already taken admission indicating that he/she has been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of the certificates duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. Such candidates shall be required to pay the fees immediately at the time of admission and such candidates shall be permitted to submit the required

### original certificates within 04 working days after the date of payment of fees.

### 11. Allotment of seats by CAP Round I and II -

- (1) CAP Round I and II shall be conducted by computerised allotment.
- (2) In CAP Round I.-
  - (a) For Minority Institutes the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference, -
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
    - (i) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (3) In CAP Round II.-
  - (a) for Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Stage II of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (iv) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10,
    - (v) Stage III of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (vi) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference,
    - (i) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules;
    - (iii) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (4) If the seat remains vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting, such seat will be considered for allotment in subsequent round.
- (5) Every stage in CAP Round I and II shall be executed with HU and OHU tag and if the seats remain vacant then the same stage shall be executed without HU and OHU tag. If further seats remain vacant for any reason in 7(1), 7(2) and 7(3) of these rules they shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates as in 5(1), 5(2) and 5(3) irrespective of the seat type on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit*.

### 12. General provisions. -

(a) Allotment in CAP Round-I and II of Home University Seats, Other than Home University seats and State Level Seats will be carried out as per *Inter-Se-Merit* of Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature. The seats will be allotted to Candidates as per *Inter-Se-Merit*, options filled and seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAP Round-I and II;

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- (b) All Candidates eligible for a particular stage of allotment will be considered for allotment of a seat in that stage, even if they have been allotted or not allotted a seat in the previous stage;
- (c) During the allotment of any stage, the Candidate may get upward shift in the allotment with reference to the options filled by the Candidate according to availability of seats at that point of time;
- (d) There shall not be any reservation under different categories in an Unaided Professional Educational Institution, for allocation of seats stated in 7(2), 7(3), 7(4) and 7(5);
- (e) All reserved Category Candidates (including SBC in their original Category) shall be considered for allotment in all stages;
- (f) Due to upward shifts, the seats falling vacant shall be considered for allotment in further iterations of the same stage as per the provisions of that stage of allotment;
- (g) Allotment against the first available option in the order of preference filled in shall be retained as final allotment;
- (h) The allotment list displayed on website will show the provisional allotment offered to the Candidates. No personal communication or allotment letters in this regard shall be issued to the Candidates;
- (i) A Candidate who has been allotted a seat shall download the "Provisional Seat Allotment Letter". For Seat Acceptance, Candidate has to pay Seat Acceptance Fee through Online mode of Payment (Credit Card / Debit Card/Internet Banking/ etc) or the mode as decided by Competent Authority and shall report to any one of the identified Admission Reporting Centre as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority. (List of ARC shall be available on website). Seat will be confirmed by the Admission Reporting Centre after verification of the original documents and ensuring that the candidate meets all the eligibility norms. The centre in-charge shall issue the Online Receipt of acceptance or candidate can download from his/her login;
- (j) The Seat Acceptance Fee shall be Rs. 1,000/- for all admitted Candidates and the same shall be treated as non-refundable processing fee;
- (k) Failure to report for Seat acceptance as per the method prescribed by the Competent Authority will be considered as if the Candidate has rejected the offer;
- (l) Allotted Seat will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document or certificate is found to be invalid or fraudulent and/or the Candidate does not meet the eligibility norms;
- (m) Candidates who want to reject the allocated seat can do so by not remitting the seat acceptance fee at the Admission Reporting Centre in scheduled period. Candidates who reject allocated seat shall be considered for admission in subsequent rounds only if they submit fresh option form for subsequent round of admission as per schedule.
- (n) If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied by the candidate in connection with his admission is found to be false or incorrect in any material particular, the Principal shall cancel his admission and forfeit the fees. An appeal against the action of cancellation of admission,

- may be preferred within seven days to the Competent Authority. The Competent Authority shall, preferably, decide the appeal within fifteen days and his decision thereon shall be final.
- (o) Complaints regarding the use of fake certificates shall be investigated in time bound manner and if it is found that there is a truth in such complaint, such admission shall be cancelled. Further appropriate action shall be initiated with due intimation to Competent Authority.
- **13. Admissions in Institutional Quota and vacant seats after CAP.-** The Director or Principal of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these seats in the following manner. -
  - (a) Admissions shall be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Candidates who have applied to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to the Institution.
  - (b) Information brochure or prospectus of the Institution which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institution's website.
  - (c) Institution shall invite applications by notifying schedule of admission and the number of seats in each course to be filled by the institution, by advertisement on the website of the institution.
  - (d) Aspiring Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria as notified by the Government and specified by the appropriate authority, from time to time, shall apply to the Principal or Director of the respective institution for admission at the Institution level as provided in rule 3(4)(b) and shall be filled in on the basis of Inter-Se-Meirt prepared by following the procedure specified in 8(3).
  - (e) The institution after verification of all required documents shall prepare and display the Inter-Se-merit lists of the Candidates to be filled in at the institution level, in the Institutional Quota and Supernumerary Quota of OCI / PIO, Foreign National, Children's of Indian workers in Gulf Countries along with the vacant seats after CAP, on the notice board and shall publish the same on the website of the institution.
  - (f) The Minority or Non-Minority institution intending to surrender the Institutional Quota (in part or full) of specified courses to the CAP shall communicate two days before the display of seat matrix of CAP Round I and the same shall be allotted as per the rules of CAP. The Institutes shall not be allowed to surrender Institutional quota seats thereafter.
  - (g) All the admissions and cancellations shall be updated instantly through online system.
  - (h) If any CAP seat remains or becomes vacant after the CAP Rounds, then the same shall be filled in by the Candidate from the same Category for which it was earmarked during the CAP. Further if the seats remain vacant then the seats shall be filled on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the applicants.

- (i) While filling these seats the preference shall be given to Maharashtra State Candidature Candidate over All India Candidature Candidate on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit.
- (j) After exhausting Maharashtra State Candidature Candidate and All India Candidature Candidate, if any seat remain vacant in the Sanctioned Intake then these seats may be filled with NRI, Foreign Students (FS), Overseas Citizen of India (OCI), Persons of Indian Origin (PIO), Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries (CIWGC) Candidature Candidates, subject to the approval from appropriate authority for these seats.

### 14. Approval of Merit List and the Admitted Candidates List. -

- (1) After completion of Admission process every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission- approval proposal to the Director Technical Education and after DTE certification shall submit to the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the subsection (5) of the section 9 of the Act.
- (2) The Admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all Candidates admitted which shall have the quota, Candidature Type, Reservation, Qualification Marks, etc as well as the required documents of the Candidates admitted at institution level.
- (3) If a minority institution fails to admit minimum Fifty-One percent of its Sanctioned Intake from the persons belonging to the concerned minority, for a period of three consecutive years the Competent Authority shall inform the Department accordingly. The Department shall forward such cases along with observations to the Minorities Development Department as per provisions of Subsection (2) of the Section 6 of the Act.

### 15. Cancellation of Admission and Refund of fees, return of documents by Institutions. -

- (a) The Candidate shall apply online for cancellation and submit duly signed copy of system generated application for cancellation of admission to the institution. Once the candidate submits online request for cancellation, his/her admission shall be treated as cancelled. The Institute shall consider the online request made by Candidate for cancellation as final irrespective of whether he/she has submitted duly signed copy of system generated application to the Institute. Upon such cancellation, the candidate shall lose the claim on the seat and such seat shall become available for further allotment. The candidate shall then become entitled to and the Institute shall refund the entire fees to the candidate after deduction of Rs.1000/- towards processing charges and return all his/her original documents submitted to the Institute within two days from submission of duly signed copy of system generated application to the Institute;
- (b) Notwithstanding clause (a) above, candidate shall not be entitled to any refund of his/her fee except the Security Deposit and Caution Money Deposit if the online cancellation is effected by the candidate after 5.00 p.m. of the cut-off date prescribed by the Competent Authority;

- (c) No institution, who has in its possession or custody, of any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited with it by a person for the purpose of seeking admission in such institution, shall refuse to return such degree, certificate award or other document with a view to induce or compel such person to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or program of study which such person does not intend to pursue or avail any facility in such institution.
- (d) The institution shall not entitle to recover the fees for the subsequent years from the student seeking cancellation of his admission at any point of time.

### 16. Change of Course or Institution after First, Second or Third year. -

- (1) The Candidate seeking for a change in course or shift after successfully completing the First Year of studies or both first and Second Semester examination in full or failed in one of the heads of passing will be allowed to do so in the same institution subject to the availability of sets and changes will be carried out based on the marks of First Year or First and Second Semester together. The Principal shall be responsible for ascertaining the eligibility of the Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;
- (2) Transfer of Candidates (Course and/or Institution) after One/ Two/ Three year shall be made in the following manner,
  - i. The Candidate once admitted in First Year / Second Year shall not be eligible for transfer to any other institution during the same academic year;
  - ii. The Candidate passing the First Year (both first and second semester) or second year (both third and fourth semester) or third year (both fifth and sixth semester) examinations in full or failed in one of the heads of passing are considered as eligible for transfer of Institution or course, provided that for transfer after second year the candidate should have passed the first year, and for transfer after third year the candidate should have passed first and second year;
  - iii. There shall be no transfer of students at any stage in any case from Unaided Institutions to Government or Government Aided Institutions or University Departments or University Managed Institutions. However, the Candidate from Government or Government Aided Institution or University Departments or University Managed Institutions may seek transfer to Unaided Educational Institution;
  - iv. There shall be no transfer of students at any stage to Autonomous Institutions;
  - v. Transfer to Unaided Institutions. The Principals of Unaided institutions shall consider the Candidates from other institutions for transfer with prior approval from the Directorate of Technical Education on submission of No Objection Certificate (NOC) from institution, Eligibility Certificate from University and Vacancy position. The Principal or Director of the institute shall ascertain the eligibility of Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;

Transfer in Government or Government aided Institutions- Eligible Candidates aspiring for a transfer from Government or Government Aided or University Departments and University Managed Institutions to other Government or Government Aided or University Department or University Managed Institutions, shall apply in writing to the Principal/ Director of the institute in which he/she studied first year or second semester. The Principal or Director shall forward the consolidated branch wise merit list of eligible candidates giving details like Name, Course, percentage of Marks, Names of Courses and Institution in order of preference to which candidates desires to seek transfer, reasons for transfer and Remarks, along with course wise vacancy position in institution, to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, so as to reach him as per the schedule given by him. All the Principals of Government and Government Aided Institutions, University Departments and University Managed Institutions shall submit vacancy position of all courses to the Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai before stipulated date.

- vi. No application without recommendation of the Principal / Director of Institution shall be entertained by the Directorate of Technical Education;
- vii. If the result of the University or Institution is not declared before the process of transfer, Candidates of that University will lose claim on transfer;
- (3) The Candidates admitted under Supernumerary Quota seats are not eligible for change of Course or Institution;
- (4) The candidates from the professional educational institutions which are outside the purview of the act shall be eligible for transfer to the unaided private professional educational institutions subject to the fulfilment of eligibility criterion and requirements stipulated under the provisions of sub section (1) of section 3 of the Act and the fulfilment of the conditions stated in sub-rule (2).
- (5) List of all such transfers shall be communicated by the Directorate of Technical Education to the office of the Admissions Regulating Authority for final approval.

### 17. Documents required to be uploaded along with "Application Form for Centralized Admission Process". -

The candidates are required to upload **ALL Original Certificates/Documents** in support of their claim at the time of filling up of Application Form for Admission. The Candidates shall carry the original documents for scrutiny & verification at identified Facilitation Centre as per the process specified by the competent authority. The candidates are required to scan the document in .jpg or .gif format (minimum 150 dpi resolution, file size upto 1 MB) and upload the scanned copies of the required documents at the time of filling up Application Form for Admission. The Facilitation Center shall assist the candidate, free of cost, to scan and upload the documents.

### 18. Miscellaneous provisions

### a) Conduct and Discipline

- (i) Failure of the candidate in making **full and correct Statements** in the application form and/or **suppression** of any information and/or submission of false documents shall **lead to disqualification** of the candidate from the examination or at later stage during the Admission Process such candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.
- (ii) Adopting any unfair means or engaging in malpractice in the examination shall render a candidate liable for punishment under, "Maharashtra Prevention of Malpractices Act, Universities, Board and Other Specified Examination Act, 1982" and disqualify him/her for examination.
- (iii) Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority.
- (iv) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Government takes any policy decision pertaining to admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect from that point of time as per the directives from the Government from time to time.
- (v) Students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.
- **b) Action against ragging**: Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 and Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging (Appendix 12 published in AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2011-12) and their amendments which may be published from time to time. The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 is in effect from 15th May, 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.
- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited,
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty, which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.

- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is located, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that prima facie there is no substance, in the complaint received; he / she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final.
- e) If the Head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above.
- f) Undertaking from the candidate shall be taken while admitting the candidate in the Institute.
- g) Any Acts or its amendments which may be published from time to time by AICTE, Government or Judgments by Hon. Supreme Court of India, Hon. High Court of Bombay etc will be applicable to Candidates and Institutions covered under these rules of admission.
- h) If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied or any certificate(s) submitted by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal/Director. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be sent within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final. Such candidates are also liable for penal action as per the provisions in the law.

### c) Others:

- (i) The medium of instruction for degree courses is English.
- (ii) The candidates are advised to ensure before applying that he/she is eligible for admission to the program as per the prevailing eligibility norms of the University. Admission of candidate will be treated as finally confirmed only on production of the Eligibility Certificate from the University to which the college is affiliated.
- (iii) Physical fitness: Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action.
- (iv) The Head of the institution shall have the right to satisfy himself about the conduct and character of a candidate by verifying the antecedents of a candidate through the appropriate police-authority, before admitting him / her

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to the college / institution.

#### d) Hostel accommodation:

Accommodation in Hostel cannot be guaranteed to the admitted candidates. All the Candidates are advised to personally verify the availability of Hostel, Hostel fees payable etc. from the Director/Principal of the college to which they intend to take admission. The Director/Principal of the colleges shall consider on priority the applications of Persons with Disability candidates, Sons and Daughters of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and Union Territory of Ladakh migrant candidates and Government of India nominees for Hostel accommodation.

**e)** The English version of the notified gazette shall be considered for the purpose of interpretation of the meaning and correctness of any provisions made in the Admission Rule and its amendment.

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#### 1. Introduction, -

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra has published the rules on 24.04.2017 and its amendments on 05.06.2018 and 04.06.2019 to regulate the admissions to the **First year of Full Time Professional Undergraduate Technical Courses** (Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Hotel Management and Catering Technology) and Direct Second Year (Engineering and Technology and Pharmacy). These rules also includes the admissions in first year of degree in planning.

These rules are also applicable for admissions in Government and Government Aided professional educational institutions vide Government Resolution of Higher & Technical Education Department No. TEM-2016/CR (473/16)/ TE-4 Dated 25<sup>th</sup> April 2017 and amendments vide Gr No. TEM-2019/CR 46/ TE-4 dated 04<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

This brochure gives information regarding the eligibility and rules of admission to First and Second year of various technical professional undergraduate degree courses in the State of Maharashtra. This also provides information about invitation of applications for admission, preparation of merit list, distribution of seats, details of reservation, various rounds and stages of Centralised Admission Process (CAP), admissions in Institutional Quota seats and vacant seats after CAP, supernumerary seats, refund of fees, etc.

#### 2. Definitions. -

- (a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015);
- (b) "Admission Reporting Centre" means a centre where the Candidate shall report for confirmation of admission by verification of documents and payment of fees;
- (c) "All India Seats" means seats available to an eligible Indian National Candidate;
- (d) "Application Form" means prescribed form filled up online by the Candidate for admission;
- (e) "Autonomous Institution" means the institution to which autonomy is granted by the University Grants Commission;
- (f) "CAP" means Centralised Admission Process;
- (g) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority;
- (h) "CET" means Common Entrance Test;
- (i) "Competent Authority" means the Commissioner of State CET appointed by the Government under section 10, for conducting CET through CAP for the admissions into Private Professional Educational Institutions;
- (j) "Courses" means the full time Undergraduate technical courses in Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture, Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Planning and Pharm. D.;
- (k) "Department" means Higher and Technical Education Department of

- Government of Maharashtra:
- (1) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;
- (m) "Facilitation Centre" means a centre where the facilities like sale of application kits, filling online forms, verification of documents and grievances, etc, are provided;
- (n) "Home University (HU)" means the university area as specified in rule 5(1) herein;
- (o) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (p) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time;
- (q) "Inter-Se-Merit" means the order of merit declared by the Competent Authority in respect of various classes/category of Candidates;
- (r) "JEE Main" means the Joint Entrance Examination conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA), New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (s) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;
- (t) "NATA" means National Aptitude Test in Architecture;
- (u) "NEET" means the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA), New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (v) "Non-Autonomous Institution" means those institutions which are not 'Autonomous Institutions':
- (w) "OHU" means the area Outside Home University area;
- (x) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate/person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955and includes Persons of Indian Origin(PIO).
  - **Explanation:** For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders registered under notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F. No. 26011/04/98- F. I dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I. Dated 9th January, 2015;
- (y) "Qualifying Examination" means examinations on the basis of which a candidate becomes eligible for admission or its equivalent examination;
- (z) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (aa) "Supernumerary Seats" means seats which are over and above the Sanctioned Intake approved by the appropriate authority and the Government, from time to time;

(bb) "TFWS" means the Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme of All India Council for Technical Education.

#### 3. Invitation of Application.

- (1) The Competent Authority shall invite Online Applications from Candidates for participating in CET and / or CAP for seeking admission to the Professional Courses for which State CET or alternative entrance examination is required for the academic year
- (2) The Competent Authority shall invite online applications in the prescribed form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for seeking admission to the undergraduate technical courses, which are exempted from CET as per provisions of the Act.
- (3) The Competent Authority shall invite online application form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) to the undergraduate technical courses for which the entrance test is conducted by the appropriate authority under any Central Act and shall be applicable for seeking admission to such professional courses, as per the provisions of the Central Act, rules and regulations made there under.
- (4) The Candidates seeking admissions to the professional courses for the seats provided in -
  - (a) 7(1)-Maharashtra State Candidature Seats, 7(2)- All India Candidature Seats, 7(3)- Minority Quota Seats and 7(5)(b)- Supernumerary Seats for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature- For these seats the candidates shall apply to the Competent Authority for admission through Centralised Admission Process(CAP).
  - (b) 7(4)- Institutional Quota Seats and 7(5)(a) Supernumerary Seats for OCI/PIO, Foreign Students and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries Candidates -For these seats the candidates shall initially apply to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to respective institutes, to enable the institutions to give admissions to such eligible applicants on the basis of inter-se merit. It is pre-requisite and mandatory to apply for verification of documents to the Competent Authority to be eligible for admission under this quota.
- (5) The Candidate should submit the necessary Certificates issued by the concerned Authority, along-with the application, in the given Proforma. The list of documents to be submitted is given in this Information Brochure.

#### 4. Role of Competent Authority in the process of Admission. -

a) The Competent Authority, the Commissioner of State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra State, shall be the authority for Centralised Admission Process and shall direct the students as per their allotment through CAP to all institutions i.e. Government, Government Aided, University Department, University Managed Colleges, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University, Lonere (BATU) & Institute of Chemical Technology (ICT), Mumbai and Unaided Private Professional Technical Educational Institutions.

- b) The Competent Authority shall deal with the representations received from the candidates pertaining to allotment and admissions as Grievance Redressal Authority.
- c) All the decisions taken in relation to Admission to First/ Direct Second Year of courses, by the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all concerned.

- (iv) candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature shall send the printed copy of online filled & submitted application form & copy of uploaded documents by hand/speed post/courier for verification & confirmation to the designated centers notified by the Competent Authority for this purpose.

#### (c) Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) Seats:

#### (I) Scheme

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The scheme shall be mandatory for all Technical Institutions offering undergraduate programs and lateral entry (Separate Division) to these programs that are approved by the All India Council for Technical Education.
- (iii) Seats up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and will be available to such courses in an Institute where a minimum of 30% of sanctioned seats in the respective courses are filled up in respective CAP Round. For calculation of 30%, the Institutional Quota seats retained by institute for the course shall be

#### considered as completely filled.

- (iv) The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the Fee Regulation Authority for unaided Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other fees except tuition fees shall be paid by the beneficiary.
- (v) The Candidates admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change Institution/course at any stage under any circumstances.
- (vi) These seats shall be available for admission to First Year of Engineering & Technology and Hotel Management & Catering Technology courses as well as in Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology (Separate Division).

#### (II) Eligibility

- (i) Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates are eligible for these seats
- (ii) Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates having their parent's annual income less than Rs. 8 Lakh (Rupees Eight Lakh only) from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall submit Income certificate issued by Appropriate Authority.

#### (III) Admissions Procedure

These seats are allotted by the Competent Authority as per inter-se merit. For this purpose, the Competent Authority shall invite applications, prepare a separate merit list for this category by following the same criteria as for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.

#### (d) Jammu and Kashmir Candidates and North East States:

- (i) The admission to the candidates as per *Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)* for the students belonging to Jammu and Kashmir and the scheme of Government of India of allocation of supernumerary seats in AICTE approved colleges to North Eastern States and UTs (NEUT) which lack in such facilities of technical education shall be done by the competent authority appointed by the Central Government as per their eligibility criteria.
- (ii) The Fees shall be as that for the Non Autonomous Government Institutes.

#### (6) Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to **candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only** subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

#### (b) Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five percent (5%) seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAP shall be reserved for Children of ex- service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1), Children of active service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2), Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State, or who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

A single merit list of all eligible candidates shall be prepared. The allotment of seats reserved for the Candidates with Disability shall be done on the basis of an inter-se merit. These seats are available for Maharashtra domiciled candidates in HU / SL seats.

Note: -After exhausting the candidates with non zero score at CET, the candidates qualifying JEE conducted by National Council for Hotel Management & Catering Technology will be considered eligible for institutional level admission subject to vacancies.

# (2) NRI / OCI / PIO, Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries, Foreign National.-

- (i)Passed HSC or its equivalent examination and obtained at least 45% marks in aggregate.
- (ii)Any other criterion declared from time to time by the appropriate authority as defined under the Act.

#### 8. Preparation of Merit List. -

- **8(1)** Assignment of merit number. All the eligible Candidates who have submitted Application Form on or before the last date specified for the submission of Application Form for Admission through CAP shall be assigned a merit number.
- **8(2)** Change of Marks due to verification. If the marks in the qualifying examination are modified due to verification and the same is duly certified by the concerned Appropriate Authority or Board, the same shall be reported to the Competent Authority for admission through CAP prior to 5 p.m. on the day of display of final merit list.
- **8(3)** *Method of calculating marks at qualifying examination for deciding eligibility.* -While deciding the eligibility of the Candidates following procedure shall be adopted, -
  - (a) The percentage of marks shall be calculated by rounding off to nearest integer. i.e. if the percentage of marks comes out to be 44.50% to 44.99% then it shall be rounded to 45% and if the percentage of marks comes out to be 44.01% to 44.49% shall be rounded to 44% for deciding the eligibility.
  - (b) In case the maximum marks in an individual subject is other than 100, convert the marks out of 100 for individual subject without rounding, If sum of the converted marks of individual subjects without rounding off works out to be a figure with fraction then fraction up to two decimal places shall only be considered for calculation of percentage of marks considering maximum marks as 300 and, If the percentage comes in fraction, then rounding off shall be done as above to decide the eligibility.
  - (c) If letter grades are assigned at SSC, HSC, Diploma, Bachelor of Science or its equivalent examination, the Candidate must submit the certificate of conversion of letter grades into equivalent marks from the concerned competent authority or Board at the time of submission of Application Form. The eligibility shall be decided on the basis of equivalent marks.
  - (d) If the Candidate reappears for the qualifying examination with all subjects, then the marks obtained in the latest examination shall only be considered.

#### 8(4) Assignment of Merit Number for various Courses. -

(a) For admission to First Year Engineering and Technology & Planning - (i)For H S C Candidates: The merit list for the Candidates as per rule 5(1), 5(2), 5(3) and 5(6) of these rules, shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score secured by the Candidate in the MHT-CET 2019 conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses.

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) higher marks or score in Mathematics at CET;
- (b) higher marks or score in Physics at CET;
- (c) higher marks or score in Chemistry at CET;
- (d) higher percentage of marks in Board or qualifying examination for Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry taken together;
- (e) higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics at HSC:
- (f) higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- (g) higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.
- (ii) The merit list for the NRI /OCI / PIO and Foreign Students Candidates stated at 5(4) and 5(5) and Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries, shall be prepared on the basis of the percentage of marks in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together at Qualifying examination:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics at HSC;
- (b) higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC:
- (c) higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.
- (iii) For Diploma Candidates: The merit list of Diploma Candidates shall be prepared on the basis of percentage of marks obtained by the Candidate, on the basis of which Diploma is awarded by the examining authority:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, —

- (a) higher percentage of marks in SSC;
- (b) higher percentage of marks in Mathematics at SSC;
- (c) higher percentage of marks in Science at SSC;
- (d) higher percentage of marks in English at SSC.

(b) For admission to Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology.- The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained by the Candidate, on the basis of which Diploma / Degree is awarded by the examining authority:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) higher percentage of marks in SSC;
- (b) higher percentage of marks in Mathematics at SSC;

(c)	higher	percentage	of marks	in Science	at SSC;
(d)	higher	percentage	of marks	in English	at SSC.

#### (c) For Admission to First Year Pharmacy.-

(i) The merit list for the Candidates as per rule 5(1), 5(2), 5(3) and 5(6) of these rules shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score secured by the Candidate in the MHT-CET 2019 conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses.

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) higher marks or score in Mathematics or Biology at CET;
- (b) higher marks or score in Physics at CET;
- (c) higher marks or score in Chemistry at CET;
- (d) higher percentage of marks in Physics, Mathematics or Biology and Chemistry added together at Board or qualifying examination;
- (e) higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics or Biology at HSC;
- (f) higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- (g) higher percentage of marks in aggregate in HSC.
- (ii) The merit list for the NRI /OCI / PIO and Foreign Students Candidates stated at rule 5(4), 5(5) and Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries shall be prepared on the basis of the percentage of marks in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics/Biology added together at Qualifying examination:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, —

- (a) Higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics or Biology at HSC;
- (b) Higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- (c) Higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.

#### (d) For Admission to Direct Second Year Pharmacy.-

The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained by the Candidate on the basis of which Diploma is awarded by the examining authority:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) higher percentage of marks in Physics at HSC;
- (b) higher percentage of marks in Chemistry at HSC;
- (c) higher percentage of marks in SSC;

(e) First Year

Management
and Catering
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- (d) higher percentage of marks in Science at SSC.
- (i) The merit list for the Candidates as per rule 5(1), 5(2), 5(3) and 5(6) of these rules shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score secured by the Candidate in the MAH-B.HMCT-CET-2019 conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses.

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below,

- (a) higher percentage of marks in HSC or its equivalent;
- (b) Candidates having passed HSC with Science;
- (c) Candidates having passed HSC with Home Science;
- (d) Candidates having passed HSC with Minimum Competency Vocational Course;
- (e) Candidates having passed HSC with Commerce.
- (ii) The merit list for the Candidates at 5(4) and 5(5) and Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries, shall be prepared on the basis of the Higher percentage of marks at HSC or its equivalent:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) Candidates having passed HSC with Science;
- (b) Candidates having passed HSC with Home Science;
- (c) Candidates having passed HSC with Minimum Competency Vocational Course;
- (d) Candidates having passed HSC with Commerce.

#### (f) For admission to First Year Architecture.-

(i) The merit list for the all Candidates shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score secured by the Candidate in the CET conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority and in the manner by giving 50% weightage to CET Score and 50% weightage to HSC aggregate Marks for the purpose of admission to these Courses:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below, -

- (a) higher marks in NATA or normalised marks in JEE (Main) Paper II;
- (b) higher percentage of marks in Mathematics at SSC;
- (c) higher percentage of aggregate marks in SSC.

#### 9. Centralised Admission Process (CAP). -

#### (1) Centralised Admission Process CAP stages

The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act. The Government, Government Aided institutes, University Departments and University managed Institutions shall also admit the candidates through CAP. The stages of CAP shall be as stated below, -

- (a) Display or Publishing of Information Brochure by the Competent Authority. The Information Brochure shall be published on the website of the Competent Authority
- (b) Filling Online Application Form by Candidate for participation in the Centralised Admission Process.
  - (i) For First Year Engineering and Technology, Planning, Pharmacy, Pharm D., Hotel management & Catering Technology: All the aspiring candidates shall fill in the Online Application Form for admission through their login. For admissions to first year Engineering and Technology, the eligible candidates aspiring for admission on the basis of JEE (Main) Paper-I (who did not appear for MHT-CET 2019) should apply, by paying required fees, to be eligible for admission under All India Quota seats and Institutional Quota seats.
  - (ii) For First and Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology, and Pharmacy and First Year Architecture: The eligible candidates are required to fill the application form Online
  - (iii) following are the details of the fees to be paid by the candidate through online mode only.

- (iv) The Application processing fee shall be as notified by the competent authority from time to time and the amount is Non Refundable.
- (v) The candidate should read the information brochure carefully.
- (vi) The candidate should fill the Online Application Form as per the notified schedule for respective admission.
- (vii) The list of the Facilitation Centers shall be published on the website. The Facilitation center shall facilitate the candidate to fill the Online Application Form, scan and upload the required documents.
- (viii)The Candidates will also be able to fill in Online Application Form and upload the scanned copies of the required documents through any computer connected to internet.
- (ix) Candidates are required to fill in all the details as per the instructions and Upload scanned images of valid necessary original documents as per the requirement of the admission while filling online application form.
- (x) Candidate can edit/update the information in his application form before he confirms it at any of the Facilitation Centre.
- (xi) After filling the information and submission of Application Form, the Candidates shall verify the data filled and correct it, if required. The candidate shall take printout of the submitted application form and sign it.

The Printout of form shall have list of documents required to be produced by the candidate for substantiating his claim made in the application form. The candidate shall carry a set of Xerox copies of the required documents.

(c) Document Verification at Facilitation Centre by the Candidate. It is mandatory on the candidate's part to produce all original documents in support of the claim made in the application form.

# (iv) After confirmation of application form information cannot be changed by candidate.

- (d) Display or Publishing of Provisional merit list, Submission of grievances, if any, and Display or Publishing of Final Merit Lists;
  - i. Provisional Merit List of eligible candidates will be displayed on the website.
  - ii. For discrepancy if any, in the provisional merit list, within specified grievance period, Candidates can submit the grievances in writing along with necessary documents to substantiate, at Facilitation Centre where candidate has confirmed application form.
  - iii. No document shall be accepted to substantiate the claim made in

application after scheduled dates.

iv. Final merit lists will be displayed on the website.

NOTE: - The merit list gives relative position of the candidate and it does not guarantee admission to any course/ institute.

- (e) Display of Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) available for respective CAP Rounds The competent authority shall publish the information on the website about institutes, courses offered, Sanctioned intake and number of seats available for each category before each round.
- (f) Filling up and confirmation of online option form having preferences of Courses and Institutions prior to respective CAP Rounds. Candidates may fill in preferences of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference as specified by Competent Authority. The option form once confirmed by the candidate through their login shall be considered for allotment in the respective CAP Rounds;

Candidates may fill in **maximum 300 choices** of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference;

- (i) In order to participate in the CAP (subject to fulfillment of the eligibility requirements of respective CAP round), it is MANDATORY to fill the Online Option Form for respective CAP Round.
- (ii) Candidates will be able to fill in the online option form through their login.
- (iii) It is mandatory for all candidates to confirm the online option form.
- (iv) After confirmation of Option form, the candidate will not be able to change the Options.
- (v) Candidates should not disclose their Application ID & Password to others to avoid impersonation. Competent Authority shall not be responsible for submissions done by others on behalf of the candidate. For Security reasons, candidates are instructed to keep changing the password and keep note of it in secured place.
- (vi) The serial number of block in the option form indicates preference of choice. Thus the choice code of the institute filled by the candidate in block No. 1 will be considered as first preference (Highest Priority Choice).
- (vii) Option form received through online submission only will be considered for further processing.
- (viii) Candidate shall confirm the submitted on-line Option Form by reentering Application ID and Password. The candidate can take a printout of the confirmed Option form for his record and future reference
- (ix) The candidate can fill in minimum 1 and maximum 300 options. The candidate shall fill the institute choice code against the option number in the online option form.
- (g) Display of Provisional Allotment of respective CAP Round indicating

- allotted institute and Course.
- (h) Reporting and accepting the offered seat at Admission Reporting Centre by the Candidate as per the schedule declared by the Competent Authority;
- (i) Only after reporting to ARC, the candidate should report to the allotted institute for seeking admission on the allotted seat as per final allotment in CAP rounds:
- (j) The time schedule prescribed by the competent authority for compliances for various stages of CAP is mandatory.
- (2) Conduct of CAP Round-I.- The seats available for Round-I shall be published on the Website. The Candidate whose names appear in the final merit list of CAP shall be eligible to participate in this round by filling online option form. The candidate shall fill and confirm the option form through candidate's Login.
- (3) During the CAP: (a) If a candidate is allotted the seat as per his first preference, such allotment shall be auto freezed and the candidate shall accept the allotment so made. Such candidate shall not be eligible for participation in the subsequent CAP rounds. Such candidates shall then report to ARC for verification of documents and payment of seat acceptance fee. Thereafter such candidates shall report to the allotted institute and seek admission on the allotted seat. If such candidate does not report to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance, their claim on the allotted seat shall stand forfeited automatically and the seat shall become available for fresh allotment. For such candidate, the allotment so made shall be the final allotment;
- (b) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than the first preference given by the candidate and if the candidate is satisfied with such allotment and do not wish to participate in further CAP rounds, such candidate can freeze the offered seat through candidate's login. Once the candidate freezes the allotted seat, such candidate shall then report to ARC for verification of documents and payment of seat acceptance fee. Thereafter such candidates shall report to the allotted institute and seek admission on the allotted seat. For such candidate, the allotment so made shall be the final allotment. If such candidate does not report to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance, their claim on the allotted seat shall stand forfeited automatically and the seat shall become available for fresh allotment. Such candidate shall then be not eligible for participation in the subsequent CAP rounds;
- (c) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than first preference and accepted the seat by reporting to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance shall be eligible for participation in the subsequent rounds for betterment;
- (d) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than first preference and not accepted the seat by not reporting to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance shall be eligible for participation in the subsequent rounds;
- (4) Conduct of CAP Round-II and III.- (a) The seats available for Rounds II and III shall be published on the website. The Candidates eligible for respective rounds II and III are allowed to fill in and/or edit online option form filled in by the candidate for the previous round. The seats to be allotted during these rounds shall be available to the eligible candidates falling under the following categories.

- (i) Candidates as per the sub-rule 3(c) and 3(d) above;
- (ii) Candidates who have not been allotted any seat in any of the previous rounds;
- (iii) Candidates who did not participate (failure of filling option form) in previous rounds.
- (b) Candidates who have been allotted seat other than first preference and reported to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance, whilst filling fresh option form, he/she need not fill the preference already allotted to the candidate in the previous round. Once upward preference is allotted to such candidate, his earlier seat allotment shall stand automatically cancelled. In the event of no such upward preference is allotted, his previous allotment stands retained;
- (c) There shall be no further betterment option available to the candidate after round III. The allotment made and/or allotment retained in round III for participating candidates in round III shall be final;
- (d) At the time of reporting to ARC for confirming the allotted seat, the candidate shall submit all the original documents in support of the claims made in the application. In the event the candidate fails to produce the documents in support of the claim, so made in the application, the allotment shall stand cancelled automatically and the seat shall become available for allotment in further rounds. Candidate shall produce the set of copies certified by FC for verification to ARC. The ARC shall verify set of copies certified by FC from Original and put ARC stamp with date & Signature and return original and verified documents along with Receipt-cum-Acknowledgement of application form. (Candidate shall submit FC and ARC stamped &verified set of documents to the Institute at the time of reporting)
- (e) The candidate will be entitled to rectify the following errors in the application form at the time of scrutiny of documents at ARC *viz*.
  - (i) change of gender from male to female and vice-versa;
  - (ii) error while entering marks obtained by candidate in examination, CET. However, the change in the merit number due to increase in the marks will not be permitted;
  - (iii) error while mentioning the caste/sub-caste/the category of backward class but in no case a candidate will be allowed to change from General to Reserved Category. A reserved category candidate will be allowed to change his category from Reserved to General upon his failure to submit requisite documents like Caste/Tribe Certificate, Validity Certificate, Non-Creamy Layer Certificate etc. as the case may be.
  - (iv) removal of minority status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (v) removal of Disability status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (vi) removal of Defence status due to failure of submission of supporting documents
  - (vii) change in Type of Candidature;
  - (viii) change in Home University;
  - (ix) removal of Tuition Fee Waiver Seats (TFWS) status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;

- (x) change in group/sub-group pertaining to direct second year engineering admissions;
- (xi) change in Qualification.
- Apart from the above no other change or rectification shall be allowed. (f) In case of additional round (if any), the category of candidates mentioned in clause (a) above shall be entitled to participate and will be entitled to fill in fresh option Form. In such case, the candidate need not fill in the previously allotted preference in their preference list. Once the upward allotment is made, the earlier allotment shall stand automatically cancelled. In the event no such upward preference is allotted in this round, the candidate's previous allotment stands retained.
- (5) The Candidate shall report to the institution finally allotted to him and confirm his admission in institution as per the schedule. The Institute shall verify the required documents and upload the admission of the candidates in the online system through Institute Login immediately and shall issue a system generated receipt of confirmation of admission to the candidate.
- (6) Fees and Concessions:
- (a) Fees Prescribed for Government and Government Aided Institutes and University Managed Engineering / Technology Degree Programes:
  - I) For Engineering Course: As per the Government Resolution No. TEM-2003/(249/03)/TE-1, dated 11th September 2003, has decided the tuition fee, development fee and other fees per year for Government, Government Aided, University Managed Colleges and University Departments.
  - II) For Other Programs such as Pharmacy, Architecture, HMCT the fee structure is applicable as per Government Resolution No. TEM-2003/(249/03)/TE-1, dated 12th May 2004.
- (b) Fees prescribed in Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions: The Adhoc/Interim fee structure shall be as approved by the Fee Regulating Authority established under the Act. The final fee approved and published by the Fee Regulating Authority for that year shall be the fee payable by the candidate for that course for that academic year.
- (c) Details of Concession in fees for Backward Class Category Candidates (belonging to Maharashtra State only)
  - For SC/ST/VJ DT NT(A) /NT(B) /NT(C) /NT(D) /SBC /OBC /SEBC /EWS category candidates, the scheme/mode of concessions, scheme of loan scholarship (if any) for eligible candidates, in tuition and other fees will be announced by the Central/ State Government. These candidates will get only that amount of waiver as notified in the circulars issued by the Government Department from time to time, subject to fulfillment of norms and conditions laid down by these Departments.

Candidates claiming fee concession under various categories shall produce the requisite certificates as may be specified by the respective Government Departments.

- (d) Fees for Jammu & Kashmir Migrant Candidates and North East and Union Territory Candidates admitted by appropriate authority:

  These candidates shall pay the fees as applicable to the Non Autonomous Government institutes (as given in 9(5)(a)). Candidates shall also pay additional fees as prescribed by the concerned University from time to time.
- (e) Caution Money Deposits:

Caution money deposit received from the students shall be refunded after successful completion of the course or after canceling the admission. Unless there is any recovery, no deduction shall be made from the caution money deposit. However, if candidate does not apply for refund, within 3 complete financial years after the student actually leaves the institution; or, within 3 complete financial years after the date of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier the amount of caution money deposit shall be transferred to Students Aid Fund in case of Un-Aided/Autonomous colleges and credited to Government in case of Government and Government-Aided Non Autonomous Colleges.

- **10.** CAP allotment stages and process of allotment. -Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner, -
- (1) Maharashtra State Candidature Candidate. -(1) The stages of computerised allotment are as follows, -

#### Stage -I: For all the Candidates. -

- (a) All the Candidates (Open, Reserved, Male, Female, Tuition Fee Waiver) belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their *Inter-Se-*Merit.
- (a-1) Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and Orphan Candidates shall be considered for allotment of seats reserved for them as per their *Inter-Se-Merit*, and if seat is not available in their reserved category, then they shall be considered for allotment in Open Category as per the *Inter-Se-Merit*.";
- (b) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-Se-Merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.
- (c) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category by virtue of their merit and in case of SBC Candidates who were in Backward Class prior to their inclusion in SBC Category shall be considered in their original Backward Class Category.
- (d) Persons with Disability Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment of the seat reserved for them in their respective category, as per

- their Inter-Se-Merit and if seat in their respective reserve Category is not available, then they shall be considered for allotment in Open Category as per their Inter-Se- Merit .
- (e) Defence Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment of the seats reserved for them in their respective Category as per their Inter-Se-Merit and if seat in their respective reserve Category is not available then they shall be considered for allotment in Open Category as per their Inter-Se-Merit.";
- (f) If a seat is available for a candidate in more than one category, then the seat allotment shall be done in the sequence as given below,
  - (i) Seat for ladies
  - (ii) Seat for Persons with disability candidates
  - (iii) Seat for Defence category candidates
- (g) The TFWS seat shall be allotted to the eligible Candidate only to such course in an Institute where a minimum of 30 % of sanctioned seats in the respective course are allotted.
- <u>Stage II</u>: For allotment of seats reserved for Female to Male Candidates. If the seat remains vacant after allotment to Female Candidates of the Backward Class Category or Open Category, such seat shall be allotted to the Male Candidates belonging to respective Backward Class or Open Category.
- <u>Stage -III</u>: For SBC Category Candidates. -If the Backward Class Category seat remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates of SBC Category, limited to the extent of 2% seats.
- Stage -IV, Stage-V & Stage -VI: Deleted (As per amendment dated 4th June 2019)
- <u>Stage -VII</u>: For all Candidates (without any type of Reservation). The seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit*.
- <u>Stage-VIII:</u> For All Candidates (without any Candidature Type): The seats remaining vacant shall be allotted to the All India Candidates.
  - (ii) In case of Direct Admission to Second Year (Lateral Entry) of Engineering and Technology: If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Diploma Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit* and further, if the seats remain vacant such seats shall be filled in on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Bachelor of Science Candidates.
- <u>Stage -IX</u>: For First Year Engineering admission to Diploma Candidates. After completion of stage VIII, If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to the Diploma Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit*.
- (2) In addition to above while allotting a seat for Direct Second Year of Engineering (Lateral Entry) and separate division, seat shall be allotted as follows, -
  - (i) The seat of Degree Course shall be allotted to the Candidate having same sub-group Diploma Course;
  - (ii) Vacant seats, if any, shall be allotted to the Candidate having the same main group Diploma Course.
  - (iii) If further seats remain vacant, it shall be allotted to the Candidate having any other Diploma Course.

The Groups and Subgroups are given in **Schedule III**.

- (3) For seats reserved for Female Candidate, the procedure for reservation as given in Government Circular of General Administration Department No. RSV 1012/CN-16/12/16A Dated 13th August 2014 shall be adopted.
- (2) All India Candidature Candidates- The allotment to these seats shall be done through CAP on the basis of score of, -
  - (a) First Year Engineering– JEE (Main) 2019 -Paper I score and then if the seats remains vacant, on the basis of MHT-CET 2019 score;
  - (b) First Year Planning JEE (Main) 2019 -Paper II score and then if the seats remains vacant, on the basis of MHT-CET 2019 score;
  - (c) First Year Pharmacy and Pharm. D. NEET and then if seats remain vacant on the basis of MHT-CET 2019 Score;
  - (d) First Year Architecture Score obtained by giving 50% weightage to HSC marks and 50% weightage to valid score of National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA) 2019 or normalised marks in JEE (main) paper II score;
  - (e) First Year Hotel Management and Catering Technology MAH-B.HMCT-CET 2019 Score.

All these seats are treated as "General Category" seats and no reservation is provided in these seats for Candidates of Backward Class Category, Ladies, Persons with Disability and Defence, etc.

- (3) Minority Quota Seats: The stages of computerised allotment are as follows, -
  - **Stage-I**: The seats under minority quota in the minority institution linguistic or religious) shall be allotted to the respective minority candidates.
  - **Stage-II:** If the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates.
  - **Stage-III:** Further, if the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the All India candidature Candidates.
- (4) Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature Candidate-The supernumerary seats for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature Candidates shall be allotted to the eligible candidates as in 5(6), on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit in the entrance test conducted by the appropriate authority and if seats remain vacant on the basis of CET conducted by competent authority.
  - a) Application Form Filling, Submission and Admission Centres
    - The eligible candidate shall fill the Online Application Form, take the printout, upload scanned copies of the required documents and send duly filled in and signed Application Form by speed post/courier/by hand delivery for verification & confirmation to Admission Centre designated by the Competent Authority for these admissions.
  - i. The application should reach on or before the last date as notified. Application received after last date or incomplete application will not be verified and confirmed and name of such candidate will not appear in the merit list prepared for the purpose of CAP.

- ii. The Competent Authority shall publish the provisional Merit List. The candidates not appeared for CET conducted by competent authority but appeared for any other CET conducted by appropriate authority can also apply, however such candidates are required to pay the Application Fee through online mode (Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Net Banking).
- iii. The candidates whose names do not appear in the merit list(s) will not be able to participate in entire Admission Process.

# b) Counselling Round for J and K Migrant Candidates at identified Admission Centre

- i. Candidate seeking admission against these seats shall report to the Admission Centre of Admission Authority for admission as per the schedule.
- ii. The candidates shall produce the documentary evidence strictly as per the Proforma(s) in support of their claims.
- iii. These Admissions will be made strictly in the order of merit from amongst the candidates who report in person for admission at the concerned identified admission centre (as per 10(4) a) as per schedule, against the seats available in the various institutes at the time when the candidate actually reports for admission.
- iv. Admissions once confirmed shall be final and candidate shall not be allowed to seek transfer of their admission to any other institute and/or any other course during entire duration of the course.
- v. The candidates reporting late for the admission shall be considered for allotment against seats which are available at that time. The decision of the admission centre in-charge shall be final and binding.

#### Important note

Candidates admitted under this provision are not allowed to change course or college in any year of study.

#### c) Reporting at institutes:

- i. Candidate shall confirm the admission by paying the requisite amount of fee and by submitting required documents in original to respective institute, to which admission is granted as per schedule.
- ii. If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting necessary original documents within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- iii. If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured to some other institution, he or she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the institution where he/she has already taken admission indicating that he/she has been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of the certificates duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. Such candidates shall be required to pay the fees immediately at the time of admission and such candidates shall be permitted to submit the required

original certificates within 04 working days after the date of payment of fees.

#### 11. Allotment of seats by CAP Round I, II and III-

- (1) CAP Round I, II and III shall be conducted by computerised allotment.
- (2) In CAP Round I.-
  - (a) For Minority Institutes the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference, -
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
    - (i) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules.

#### (3) In CAP Round II.-

- (a) for Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
  - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
  - (ii) Stages I to VII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
  - (iii) Stage II of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
  - (iv) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10,
  - (v) Stage III of sub-rule (3) of rule 10 of these rules;
- (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidate's asper following preference:
  - (i) Stages I to III and Stage VII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
  - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (4) In CAP Round III.-
  - (a) for Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Stage II of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (iv) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10,
    - (v) Stage III of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (vi) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference,
    - (i) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules;
    - (iii) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (5) If the seat remains vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting, such seat will be considered for allotment in subsequent round.
- (6) Every stage in CAP Round I, II and III shall be executed with HU and

OHU tag and if the seats remain vacant then the same stage shall be executed without HU and OHU tag. If further seats remain vacant for any reason in 7(1), 7(2) and 7(3) of these rules they shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates as in 5(1), 5(2) and 5(3) irrespective of the seat type on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit*.

#### 12. General provisions. -

- (a) Allotment in CAP Round-I, II and III of Home University Seats, Other than Home University seats and State Level Seats will be carried out as per *Inter-Se-Merit* of Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature. The seats will be allotted to Candidates as per *Inter-Se-Merit*, options filled and seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAP Round-I, II and III;
- (b) All Candidates eligible for a particular stage of allotment will be considered for allotment of a seat in that stage, even if they have been allotted or not allotted a seat in the previous stage;
- (c) During the allotment of any stage, the Candidate may get upward shift in the allotment with reference to the options filled by the Candidate according to availability of seats at that point of time;
- (d) There shall not be any reservation under different categories in an Unaided Professional Educational Institution, for allocation of seats stated in 7(2), 7(3), 7(4) and 7(5);
- (e) All reserved Category Candidates (including SBC in their original Category) shall be considered for allotment in all stages;
- (f) Due to upward shifts, the seats falling vacant shall be considered for allotment in further iterations of the same stage as per the provisions of that stage of allotment;
- (g) Allotment against the first available option in the order of preference filled in shall be retained as final allotment;
- (h) The allotment list displayed on website will show the provisional allotment offered to the Candidates. No personal communication or allotment letters in this regard shall be issued to the Candidates;
- (i) A Candidate who has been allotted a seat shall download the "Provisional Seat Allotment Letter". For Seat Acceptance, Candidate has to pay Seat Acceptance Fee through Online mode of Payment (Credit Card / Debit Card / Internet Banking / etc) or the mode as decided by Competent Authority and shall report to any one of the identified Admission Reporting Centre. (List shall be available on website). Seat will be confirmed by the Admission Reporting Centre after verification of the original documents and ensuring that the candidate meets all the eligibility norms. The centre in-charge shall issue the Online Receipt of acceptance;
- (j) The Seat Acceptance Fee shall be Rs. 1,000/- for all admitted Candidates and the same shall be treated as non-refundable processing fee;
- (k) Failure to report in person for Seat acceptance will be considered as if the Candidate has rejected the offer;
- (I) Allotted Seat will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document or certificate is found to be invalid or fraudulent and/or the Candidate does not meet the eligibility norms;

- (m) Candidates who want to reject the allocated seat can do so by not remitting the seat acceptance fee at the Admission Reporting Centre in scheduled period. Candidates who reject allocated seat shall be considered for admission in subsequent rounds only if they submit fresh option form for subsequent round of admission as per schedule.
- (n) If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied by the candidate in connection with his admission is found to be false or incorrect in any material particular, the Principal shall cancel his admission and forfeit the fees. An appeal against the action of cancellation of admission, may be preferred within seven days to the Competent Authority. The Competent Authority shall, preferably, decide the appeal within fifteen days and his decision thereon shall be final.
- (o) Complaints regarding the use of fake certificates shall be investigated in time bound manner and if it is found that there is a truth in such complaint, such admission shall be cancelled. Further appropriate action shall be initiated with due intimation to Competent Authority.
- 13. Admissions in Institutional Quota and vacant seats after CAP.- The Director or Principal of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these seats in the following manner. -
  - (a) Admissions shall be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Candidates who have applied to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to the Institution.
  - (b) Information brochure or prospectus of the Institution which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institution's website.
  - (c) Institution shall invite applications by notifying schedule of admission and the number of seats in each course to be filled by the institution, by advertisement on the website of the institution. Aspiring Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria as notified by the Government and specified by the appropriate authority, from time to time, shall apply to the Principal or Director of the respective institution for admission at the Institution level as provided in rule 3(4)(b) and shall be filled in on the basis of *Inter-Se-Meirt* prepared by following the procedure specified in 8(3).
  - (d) The institution after verification of all required documents shall prepare and display the *Inter-Se-merit* lists of the Candidates to be filled in at the institution level, in the Institutional Quota and Supernumerary Quota of OCI / PIO, Foreign National, Children's of Indian workers in Gulf Countries along with the vacant seats after CAP, on the notice board and shall publish the same on the website of the institution.
  - (e)The Minority or Non-Minority institution intending to surrender the Institutional Quota (in part or full) of specified courses to the CAP shall communicate two days before the display of seat matrix of CAP Round I and the same shall be allotted as per the rules of CAP. The Institutes shall not be allowed to surrender Institutional quota seats thereafter All the

- admissions and cancellations shall be updated instantly through online system.
- (h) If any CAP seat remains or becomes vacant after the CAP Rounds, then the same shall be filled in by the Candidate from the same Category for which it was earmarked during the CAP. Further if the seats remain vacant then the seats shall be filled on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the applicants.

NOTE:- While filling these seats the preference shall be given to the Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit*.

#### 14. Approval of Merit List and the Admitted Candidates List. -

- (1) After completion of Admission process every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission- approval proposal to the Director Technical Education and the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the subsection (5) of the section 9 of the Act.
- (2) The Admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all Candidates admitted which shall have the quota, Candidature Type, Reservation, Qualification Marks, etc as well as the required documents of the Candidates admitted at institution level.
- (3) If a minority institution fails to admit minimum Fifty-One percent of its Sanctioned Intake from the persons belonging to the concerned minority, for a period of three consecutive years the Competent Authority shall inform the Department accordingly. The Department shall forward such cases along with observations to the Minorities Development Department as per provisions of Subsection (2) of the Section 6 of the Act.
- **15.** Cancellation of Admission and Refund of fees, return of documents by Institutions. -
  - (a) The Candidate shall apply online for cancellation and submit duly signed copy of system generated application for cancellation of admission to the institution. Once the candidate submits online request for cancellation, his/her admission shall be treated as cancelled. The Institute shall consider the online request made by Candidate for cancellation as final irrespective of whether he/she has submitted duly signed copy of system generated application to the Institute. Upon such cancellation, the candidate shall lose the claim on the seat and such seat shall become available for further allotment. The candidate shall then become entitled to and the Institute shall refund the entire fees to the candidate after deduction of Rs.1000/- towards processing charges and return all his/her original documents submitted to the Institute within two days from submission of duly signed copy of system generated application to the Institute;
    - (b) Notwithstanding clause (a) above, candidate shall not be entitled to any refund of his/her fee except the Security Deposit and Caution Money Deposit if the online cancellation is effected by the candidate after 5.00 p.m. of the cut-off date prescribed by the Competent Authority;
    - (c) No institution, who has in its possession or custody, of any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited with it by a person for the purpose of seeking admission in such

- institution, shall refuse to return such degree, certificate award or other document with a view to induce or compel such person to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or program of study which such person does not intend to pursue or avail any facility in such institution.
- (d) The institution shall not entitle to recover the fees for the subsequent years from the student seeking cancellation of his admission at any point of time.

#### 16. Change of Course or Institution after First, Second or Third year. -

- (1)The Candidate seeking for a change in course or shift after successfully completing the First Year of studies or both first and Second Semester examination in full or failed in one of the heads of passing will be allowed to do so in the same institution subject to the availability of sets and changes will be carried out based on the marks of First Year or First and Second Semester together. The Principal shall be responsible for ascertaining the eligibility of the Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;
- (2) Transfer of Candidates (Course and/or Institution) after One/ Two/ Three year shall be made in the following manner, -
  - (a) The Candidate once admitted in First Year / Second Year shall not be eligible for transfer to any other institution during the same academic year;
  - (b) The Candidate passing the First Year (both first and second semester) or second year (both third and fourth semester) or third year (both fifth and sixth semester) examinations in full or failed in one of the heads of passing are considered as eligible for transfer of Institution or course, provided that for transfer after second year the candidate should have passed the first year, and for transfer after third year the candidate should have passed first and second year;
  - (c) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage in any case from Unaided Institutions, to Government or Government Aided Institutions or University Departments or University Managed Institutions. However, the Candidate from Government or Government Aided Institution or University Departments or University Managed Institutions may seek transfer to Unaided Educational Institution;
  - (d) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage to Autonomous Institutions;
  - (e) Transfer to Unaided Institutions. The Principals of Unaided institutions shall consider the Candidates from other institutions for transfer with prior approval from the Directorate of Technical Education on submission of No Objection Certificate (NOC) from institution, Eligibility Certificate from University and Vacancy position. The Principal or Director of the institute shall ascertain the eligibility of Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;
    - Transfer in Government or Government aided Institutions- Eligible Candidates aspiring for a transfer from Government or Government Aided or University Departments and University Managed Institutions to other Government or Government Aided or University Department or University

Managed Institutions, shall apply in writing to the Principal/ Director of the institute in which he/she studied first year or second semester. The Principal or Director shall forward the consolidated branch wise merit list of eligible candidates giving details like Name, Course, percentage of Marks, Names of Courses and Institution in order of preference to which candidates desires to seek transfer, reasons for transfer and Remarks, along with course wise vacancy position in institution, to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, so as to reach him as per the schedule given by him. All the Principals of Government and Government Aided Institutions, University Departments, and University Managed Institutions shall submit vacancy position of all courses to the Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai before stipulated date.

- (f) No application without recommendation of the Principal / Director of Institution shall be entertained by the Directorate of Technical Education;
- (g) If the result of the University or Institution is not declared before the process of transfer, Candidates of that University will lose claim on transfer;
- (3) The Candidates admitted under Supernumerary Quota seats are not eligible for change of Course or Institution;
- (4) The candidates from the professional educational institutions which are outside the purview of the act shall be eligible for transfer to the unaided private professional educational institutions subject to the fulfilment of eligibility criterion and requirements stipulated under the provisions of sub section (1) of section 3 of the Act and the fulfilment of the conditions stated in sub-rule (2).
- (5) List of all such transfers shall be communicated by the Directorate of Technical Education to the office of the Admissions Regulating Authority for final approval.

## 17. Documents to be attached along with "Application Form for Centralized Admission Process". -

The candidates are required to carry **ALL Original Certificates/Documents** in support of their claim at the time of filling up of Application Form for Admission for the scrutiny and verification at identified Facilitation Centre. The candidates are required to scan the document in .jpg or .gif format (minimum 150 dpi resolution, file size upto 1 MB) and upload the scanned copies of the required documents at the time of filling up Application Form for Admission. **The Facilitation Center shall assist the candidate, free of cost, to scan and upload the documents**.

#### 18. Miscellaneous provisions

#### a) Conduct and Discipline

(i) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct Statements in the

application form and/or **suppression** of any information and/or submission of false documents shall **lead to disqualification** of the candidate from the examination or at later stage during the Admission Process such candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.

- (ii) Adopting any unfair means or engaging in malpractice in the examination shall render a candidate liable for punishment under, "Maharashtra Prevention of Malpractices Act, Universities, Board and Other Specified Examination Act, 1982" and disqualify him/her for examination.
- (iii) Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority.
- (iv) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Government takes any policy decision pertaining to admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect from that point of time as per the directives from the Government from time to time.
- (v) Students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.
- **b) Action against ragging**: Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 and Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging (Appendix 12 published in AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2011-12) and their amendments which may be published from time to time. The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 is in effect from 15th May, 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.
- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited,
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty, which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is located, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that prima facie there is no substance, in the complaint received; he / she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final.

- e) If the Head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above.
- f) Undertaking from the candidate shall be taken while admitting the candidate in the Institute.
- g) Any Acts or its amendments which may be published from time to time by AICTE, Government or Judgments by Hon. Supreme Court of India, Hon. High Court of Bombay etc will be applicable to Candidates and Institutions covered under these rules of admission.
- h) If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied or any certificate(s) submitted by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal/Director. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be sent within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final. Such candidates are also liable for penal action as per the provisions in the law.

#### c) Others:

- (i) The medium of instruction for degree courses is English.
- (ii) The candidates are advised to ensure before applying that he/she is eligible for admission to the program as per the prevailing eligibility norms of the University. Admission of candidate will be treated as finally confirmed only on production of the Eligibility Certificate from the University to which the college is affiliated.
- (iii) Physical fitness: Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action.
- (iv) The Head of the institution shall have the right to satisfy himself about the conduct and character of a candidate by verifying the antecedents of a candidate through the appropriate police-authority, before admitting him / her to the college / institution.

#### d) Hostel accommodation:

Accommodation in Hostel cannot be guaranteed to the admitted candidates. All the Candidates are advised to personally verify the availability of Hostel, Hostel fees payable etc. from the Director/Principal of the college to which they intend to take admission. The Director/Principal of the colleges shall consider on priority the applications of Persons with Disability candidates, Sons and Daughters of Jammu and Kashmir migrant candidates and Government of India nominees for Hostel accommodation.

**e)** The English version of the notified gazette shall be considered for the purpose of interpretation of the meaning and correctness of any provisions made in the Admission Rule and its amendment.

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#### 1. Introduction, -

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra has published the rules on 24.04.2017 and its amendment on 05.06.2018 to regulate the admissions to the **First year of Full Time Professional Undergraduate Technical Courses** (Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Hotel Management and Catering Technology) **and Direct Second Year** (Engineering and Technology and Pharmacy).

These rules are also applicable for admissions in Government and Government Aided professional educational institutions vide Government Resolution of Higher & Technical Education Department No. TEM-2016/CR (473/16)/ TE-4 Dated 25<sup>th</sup> April 2017.

This brochure gives information regarding the eligibility and rules of admission to First and Second year of various technical professional undergraduate degree courses in the State of Maharashtra. This also provides information about invitation of applications for admission, preparation of merit list, distribution of seats, details of reservation, various rounds and stages of Centralised Admission Process (CAP), admissions in Institutional Quota seats and vacant seats after CAP, supernumerary seats, refund of fees, etc.

#### 2. Definitions. -

- (a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015):
- (b) "Admission Reporting Centre" means a centre where the Candidate shall report for confirmation of admission by verification of documents and payment of fees;
- (c) "All India Seats" means seats available to an eligible Indian National Candidate;
- (d) "Application Form" means prescribed form filled up online by the Candidate for admission:
- (e) "Autonomous Institution" means the institution to which autonomy is granted by the University Grants Commission;
- (f) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority;
- (g) "Competent Authority" means the Commissioner of State CET appointed by the Government under section 10, for conducting CET through CAP for the admissions into Private Professional Educational Institutions;
- (h) "Courses" means the full time Undergraduate technical courses in Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Hotel Management and Catering Technology;
- (i) "Department" means Higher and Technical Education Department of Government of Maharashtra;
- (j) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time under

- sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;
- (k) "Facilitation Centre" means a centre where the facilities like sale of application kits, filling online forms, verification of documents and grievances, etc, are provided;
- (1) "Home University (HU)" means the university area as specified in rule 5(1) herein:
- (m) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (n) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time;
- (o) "Inter-Se-Merit" means the order of merit declared by the Competent Authority in respect of various classes/category of Candidates;
- (p) "JEE Main" means the Joint Entrance Examination conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (q) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;
- (r) "NEET" means the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (s) "Non-Autonomous Institution" means those institutions which are not 'Autonomous Institutions';
- (t) "OHU" means the area Outside Home University area;
- (u) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate/person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955and includes Persons of Indian Origin(PIO). Explanation: For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders registered under notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F. No. 26011/04/98- F. I dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I. Dated 9th January, 2015;
- (v) "Qualifying Examination" means examinations on the basis of which a candidate becomes eligible for admission or its equivalent examination;
- (w) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (x) "Supernumerary Seats" means seats which are over and above the Sanctioned Intake approved by the appropriate authority and the Government, from time to time;
- (y) "TFWS" means the Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme of All India Council for Technical Education.

#### 3. Invitation of Application.

- (1) The Competent Authority shall invite Online Applications from Candidates for participating in CET and / or CAP for seeking admission to the Professional Courses for which State CET or alternative entrance examination is required for the academic year
- (2) The Competent Authority shall invite online applications in the prescribed form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for seeking admission to the undergraduate technical courses, which are exempted from CET as per provisions of the Act.
- (3) The Competent Authority shall invite online application form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) to the undergraduate technical courses for which the entrance test is conducted by the appropriate authority under any Central Act and shall be applicable for seeking admission to such professional courses, as per the provisions of the Central Act, rules and regulations made there under.
- (4) The Candidates seeking admissions to the professional courses for the seats provided in -
  - (a) 7(1)-Maharashtra State Candidature Seats, 7(2)- All India Candidature Seats, 7(3)- Minority Quota Seats and 7(5)(b)- Supernumerary Seats for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature- For these seats the candidates shall apply to the Competent Authority for admission through Centralised Admission Process(CAP).
  - (b) 7(4)- Institutional Quota Seats and 7(5)(a) Supernumerary Seats for OCI/PIO, Foreign Students and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries Candidates -For these seats the candidates shall initially apply to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to respective institutes, to enable the institutions to give admissions to such eligible applicants on the basis of inter-se merit. It is pre-requisite and mandatory to apply for verification of documents to the Competent Authority to be eligible for admission under this quota.
- (5) The Candidate should submit the necessary Certificates issued by the concerned Authority, along-with the application, in the given Proforma. The list of documents to be submitted is given in this Information Brochure.

## 4. Role of Competent Authority and its representatives in the process of Admission. -

a) The Competent Authority, the Commissioner of State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra State, shall be the authority for Centralised Admission Process and shall direct the students as per their allotment through CAP to all institutions i.e. Government, Government Aided, University Department, University Managed Colleges, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University, Lonere (BATU) & Institute of Chemical Technology (ICT), Mumbai and Unaided Private Professional Technical Educational Institutions.

- b) The Competent Authority shall deal with the representations received from the candidates pertaining to allotment and admissions as Grievance Redressal Authority.
- c) All the decisions taken in relation to Admission to First/ Direct Second Year of courses, by the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all concerned.
- d) The Director, Technical Education shall act as a Nodal Officer to carry out the admission process under the supervision & control of the Competent Authority.

#### (c) Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) Seats:

#### (I) Scheme

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The scheme shall be mandatory for all Technical Institutions offering undergraduate programs and lateral entry (Separate Division) to these programs that are approved by the All India Council for Technical Education.
- (iii) Seats up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and will be available to such courses in an Institute where a minimum of 30% of sanctioned seats in the respective courses are filled up in respective CAP Round. For calculation of 30%, the Institutional Quota seats retained by institute for the course shall be considered as completely filled.
- (iv) The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the Fee Regulation Authority for unaided Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other fees except tuition fees shall be paid by the beneficiary.
- (v) The Candidates admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change Institution/course at any stage under any circumstances.
- (vi) These seats shall be available for admission to First Year of Engineering & Technology and Hotel Management & Catering Technology courses as well as in Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology (Separate Division).

#### (II) Eligibility

(i) Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates are eligible for these seats

(ii) Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates having their parent's annual income less than Rs.6.00 Lakhs from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall submit Income certificate issued by Appropriate Authority.

#### (III) Admissions Procedure

These seats are allotted by the Competent Authority as per inter-se merit. For this purpose, the Competent Authority shall invite applications, prepare a separate merit list for this category by following the same criteria as for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.

#### (d) Jammu and Kashmir Candidates and North East States:

- (i) The admission to the candidates as per *Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)* for the students belonging to Jammu and Kashmir and the scheme of Government of India of allocation of supernumerary seats in AICTE approved colleges to North Eastern States and UTs (NEUT) which lack in such facilities of technical education shall be done by the competent authority appointed by the Central Government as per their eligibility criteria.
- (ii) The Fees shall be as that for the Non Autonomous Government Institutes.

#### (6) Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to **candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only** subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

#### (b) Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five percent (5%) seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAP shall be reserved for Children of ex- service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1), Children of active service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2), Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State, or who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

#### 8. Preparation of Merit List. -

- **8(1)** Assignment of merit number. All the eligible Candidates who have submitted Application Form on or before the last date specified for the submission of Application Form for Admission through CAP shall be assigned a merit number.
- **8(2)** Change of Marks due to verification. If the marks in the qualifying examination are modified due to verification and the same is duly certified by the concerned Appropriate Authority or Board, the same shall be reported to the Competent Authority for admission through CAP or its designated representatives prior to 5 p.m. on the day of display of final merit list.
- **8(3)** *Method of calculating marks at qualifying examination for deciding eligibility.* -While deciding the eligibility of the Candidates following procedure shall be adopted, -
  - (a) The percentage of marks shall be calculated by rounding off to nearest integer. i.e. if the percentage of marks comes out to be 44.50% to 44.99% then it shall be rounded to 45% and if the percentage of marks comes out to be 44.01% to 44.49% shall be rounded to 44% for deciding the eligibility.

#### 9. Centralised Admission Process (CAP). -

#### (1) Centralised Admission Process CAP stages

The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act. The Government, Government Aided institutes, University Departments and University managed Institutions shall also admit the candidates through CAP. The stages of CAP shall be as stated below, -

- (a) Display or Publishing of Information Brochure by the Competent Authority. The Information Brochure shall be published on the website of the Competent Authority
- (b) Filling Online Application Form by Candidate for participation in the Centralised Admission Process.
  - (i) For First Year Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Pharm D., Hotel management & Catering Technology: All the aspiring candidates shall fill in the Online Application Form for admission through their login which is provided to them at the time of applying to the Common Entrance Test (CET)conducted for that course. For admissions to first year Engineering and Technology, the eligible candidates aspiring for admission on the basis of JEE (Main) Paper-I (who did not appear for MHT-CET 2018) should apply, by paying required fees, to be eligible for admission under All India Quota seats and Institutional Quota seats.
  - (ii) For First and Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology, and Pharmacy and First Year Architecture: The eligible candidates are required to fill the application form Online
  - (iii) following are the details of the fees to be paid by the candidate through online mode only.

- (iv) The Application processing fee shall be as notified by the competent authority from time to time and the amount is Non Refundable.
- (v) The candidate should read the information brochure carefully.
- (vi) The candidate should fill the Online Application Form as per the notified schedule for respective admission.
- (vii) The list of the Facilitation Centers shall be published on the website. The Facilitation center shall facilitate the candidate to fill the Online Application Form, scan and upload the required documents without any charges.
- (viii)The Candidates will also be able to fill in Online Application Form and upload the scanned copies of the required documents through any computer connected to internet.
- (ix) Candidates are required to fill in all the details as per the instructions and Upload scanned images of valid necessary original documents as per the requirement of the admission while filling online application form.
- (x) Candidate can edit/update the information in his application form before he confirms it at any of the Facilitation Centre.
- (xi) After filling the information and submission of Application Form, the Candidates shall verify the data filled and correct it, if required. The candidate shall take printout of the submitted application form and sign it.

The Printout of form shall have list of documents required to be produced by the candidate for substantiating his claim made in the application form. The candidate shall carry a set of Xerox copies of the required documents.

- (c) Document Verification at Facilitation Centre by the Candidate. It is mandatory on the candidate's part to produce all original documents in support of the claim made in the application form.
  - (i) The Candidates shall report to any convenient Facilitation Centre along with signed printout of application form filled online and the required original documents for verification.
  - (ii) The Facilitation Centre In-charge shall verify the information from the original copies of required documents and collect the duly signed application.
  - (iii) The Facilitation Centre In-charge shall confirm candidate's Application Form through online system and issue the Receipt cum Acknowledgement of Application Form.
  - (iv) FC shall verify all documents from Original and put FC stamp with date & Signature on Xerox copies and return original and verified documents along with Receipt-cum-Acknowledgement of application form.

# (iv) After confirmation of application form information cannot be changed by candidate.

- (d) Display or Publishing of Provisional merit list, Submission of grievances, if any, and Display or Publishing of Final Merit Lists;
  - i. Provisional Merit List of eligible candidates will be displayed on the website.
  - ii. For discrepancy if any, in the provisional merit list, within specified grievance period, Candidates can submit the grievances in writing along with necessary documents to substantiate, at Facilitation Centre where candidate has confirmed application form.
  - iii. No document shall be accepted to substantiate the claim made in application after scheduled dates.
  - iv. Final merit lists will be displayed on the website.

NOTE: - The merit list gives relative position of the candidate and it does not guarantee admission to any course/ institute.

- (e) Display of Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) available for respective CAP Rounds The competent authority shall publish the information on the website about institutes, courses offered, Sanctioned intake and number of seats available for each category before each round.
- (f) Filling up and confirmation of online option form having preferences of

Courses and Institutions prior to respective CAP Rounds. Candidates may fill in preferences of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference as specified by Competent Authority. The option form once confirmed by the candidate through their login shall be considered for allotment in the respective CAP Rounds;

Candidates may fill in **maximum 300 choices** of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference;

- (i) In order to participate in the CAP (subject to fulfillment of the eligibility requirements of respective CAP round), it is MANDATORY to fill the Online Option Form for respective CAP Round.
- (ii) Candidates will be able to fill in the online option form through their login.
- (iii) It is mandatory for all candidates to confirm the online option form.
- (iv) After confirmation of Option form, the candidate will not be able to change the Options.
- (v) Candidates should not disclose their Application ID & Password to others to avoid impersonation. Competent Authority shall not be responsible for submissions done by others on behalf of the candidate. For Security reasons, candidates are instructed to keep changing the password and keep note of it in secured place.
- (vi) The serial number of block in the option form indicates preference of choice. Thus the choice code of the institute filled by the candidate in block No. 1 will be considered as first preference (Highest Priority Choice).
- (vii) Option form received through online submission only will be considered for further processing.
- (viii) Candidate shall confirm the submitted on-line Option Form by reentering Application ID and Password. The candidate can take a printout of the confirmed Option form for his record and future reference
- (ix) The candidate can fill in minimum 1 and maximum 300 options. The candidate shall fill the institute choice code against the option number in the online option form.
- (g) Display of Provisional Allotment of respective CAP Round indicating allotted institute and Course.
- (h) Reporting and accepting the offered seat at Admission Reporting Centre by the Candidate as per the schedule declared by the Competent Authority;
- (i) Only after reporting to ARC, the candidate should report to the allotted institute for seeking admission on the allotted seat as per final allotment in CAP rounds;

Once the candidate freezes the allotted seat, such candidate shall then report to ARC for verification of documents and payment of seat acceptance fee. Thereafter such candidates shall report to the allotted institute and seek admission on the allotted seat. For such candidate, the allotment so made shall be the final allotment. If such candidate does not report to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance, their claim on the allotted seat shall stand forfeited automatically and the seat shall become available for fresh allotment. Such candidate shall then be not eligible for participation in the subsequent CAP rounds;
- (c) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than first preference and accepted the seat by reporting to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance shall be eligible for participation in the subsequent rounds for betterment;
- (d) Candidate who have been allotted seat other than first preference and not accepted the seat by not reporting to ARC for confirmation of seat acceptance shall be eligible for participation in the subsequent rounds;
- (4) Conduct of CAP Round-II and III.- (a) The seats available for Rounds II and III shall be published on the website. The Candidates eligible for respective rounds II and III are allowed to fill in and/or edit online option form filled in by the candidate for the previous round. The seats to be allotted during these rounds shall be available to the eligible candidates falling under the following categories.

  - (ii) error while entering marks obtained by candidate in examination, CET. However, the change in the merit number due to increase in the marks will not be permitted;
  - (iii) error while mentioning the caste/sub-caste/the category of backward class but in no case a candidate will be allowed to change from General to Reserved Category. A reserved category candidate will be allowed to change his category from Reserved to General upon his failure to submit requisite documents like Caste/Tribe Certificate, Validity Certificate, Non-Creamy Layer Certificate etc. as the case may be.
  - (iv) removal of minority status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (v) removal of Disability status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (vi) removal of Defence status due to failure of submission of supporting documents
  - (vii) change in Type of Candidature;
  - (viii) change in Home University;
  - (ix) removal of Tuition Fee Waiver Seats (TFWS) status due to failure of submission of supporting documents;
  - (x) change in group/sub-group pertaining to direct second year engineering admissions;
  - (xi) change in Qualification.

Apart from the above no other change or rectification shall be allowed. (f) In case of additional round (if any), the category of candidates mentioned in clause (a) above shall be entitled to participate and will be entitled to fill in fresh option Form. In such case, the candidate need not fill in the previously allotted preference in their preference list. Once the upward allotment is made, the earlier allotment shall stand automatically cancelled. In the event no such upward preference is allotted in this round, the candidate's previous allotment stands retained.

(5) The Candidate shall report to the institution finally allotted to him and confirm his admission in institution as per the schedule. The Institute shall verify the required documents and upload the admission of the candidates in the online system through Institute Login immediately and shall issue a system generated receipt of confirmation of admission to the candidate.

#### (6) Fees and Concessions:

# (a) Fees Prescribed for Government and Government Aided Institutes and University Managed Engineering / Technology Degree Programes:

I) For Engineering Course: As per the Government Resolution No. TEM-2003/(249/03)/TE-1, dated 11th September 2003, has decided the tuition fee, development fee and other fees per year for Government, Government Aided, University Managed Colleges and University Departments. As per the policy of State Government, the fees for Government, Government Aided Autonomous Institutes is raised by 10% every year after grant of Autonomous Status to the institute. Accordingly, the fee structure for the Engineering Programs for academic year 2018-19 shall be as follows.

II) For Other Programs such as Pharmacy, Architecture, HMCT the fee structure is applicable as per Government Resolution No. TEM-2003/(249/03)/TE-1, dated 12th May 2004.

#### **Important Notes:**

- 1. No tuition fee for SC/ST category and for candidates admitted under TFWS.
- 2. In case the Government revises the fees for the Government institutes for the year 2018-19, then the admitted candidates will be required to pay the difference in fees as per the Government order.
- 3. The Department of Technology, Shivaji University offers courses on Self Financing basis, and hence the fees shall be as per the Fees approved by Appropriate Authority.
- (b) Fees prescribed in Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions:

  The Adhoc/Interim fee structure shall be as approved by the Fee Regulating

  Authority established under the Act. The final fee approved and published

  by the Fee Regulating Authority for that year shall be the fee payable

  by the candidate for that course for that academic year.

# (c) Details of Concession in fees for Backward Class Category Candidates (belonging to Maharashtra State only)

For SC/ST/VJ DT NT(A)/NT(B)/NT(C)/NT(D)/SBC /OBC category candidates, the scheme/mode of concessions, scheme of loan scholarship (if any) for eligible candidates, in tuition and other fees will be announced by the Central/ State Government. These candidates will get only that amount of waiver as notified in the circulars issued by the Government Department from time to time, subject to fulfillment of norms and conditions laid down by these Departments.

Candidates claiming fee concession under various categories shall produce the requisite certificates as may be specified by the respective Government Departments.

# (d) Fees for Jammu & Kashmir Migrant Candidates and North East and Union Territory Candidates admitted by appropriate authority:

These candidates shall pay the fees as applicable to the Non Autonomous Government institutes (as given in 9(5)(a)). Candidates shall also pay additional fees as prescribed by the concerned University from time to time.

#### (e) Caution Money Deposits:

Caution money deposit received from the students shall be refunded after successful completion of the course or after canceling the admission. Unless there is any recovery, no deduction shall be made from the caution money deposit. However, if candidate does not apply for refund, within 3 complete financial years after the student actually leaves the institution; or, within 3 complete financial years after the date of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier the amount of caution money deposit shall be transferred to Students Aid Fund in case of Un-Aided/Autonomous colleges and credited to Government in case of Government and Government-Aided Non Autonomous Colleges.

- 10. CAP allotment stages and process of allotment. -Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner, -
- (1) Maharashtra State Candidature Candidate. -(1) The stages of computerised allotment are as follows, -

#### Stage -I: For all the Candidates. -

- (a) All the Candidates (Open, Reserved, Male, Female, Tuition Fee Waiver) belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their *Inter-Se-*Merit.
- (b) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-Se-Merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.

- (c) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category by virtue of their merit and in case of SBC Candidates who were in Backward Class prior to their inclusion in SBC Category shall be considered in their original Backward Class Category.
- (d) Persons with Disability Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them otherwise in Open Category as per their *Inter-Se-Merit* if the seats reserved for them are not available at their merit.
- (e) Defence Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them by virtue of their merit or in Open Category as per their *Inter-Se-Merit* if the seats reserved for them are not available at their merit.
- (f) If a seat is available for a candidate in more than one category, then the seat allotment shall be done in the sequence as given below,
  - (a) Seat for ladies
  - (ii) Seat for Persons with disability candidates
  - (iii) Seat for Defence category candidates
- (g) The TFWS seat shall be allotted to the eligible Candidate only to such course in an Institute where a minimum of 30 % of sanctioned seats in the respective course are allotted.
- <u>Stage II</u>: For allotment of seats reserved for Female to Male Candidates. If the seat remains vacant after allotment to Female Candidates of the Backward Class Category or Open Category, such seat shall be allotted to the Male Candidates belonging to respective Backward Class or Open Category.
- <u>Stage –III</u>: For SBC Category Candidates. -If the Backward Class Category seat remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates of SBC Category, limited to the extent of 2% seats.
- <u>Stage –IV</u>: For respective groups of Backward Class Category Candidates. If the seats remain vacant in the respective group of following Categories, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates from within the respective group, -
  - **Group 1**: (i) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Castes converted to Buddhism (SC),
    - (ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside the specified areas (ST).
  - **Group 2**: (i) Vimukta Jatis/De- Notified Tribes (VJ/DT), NT(A), (ii)Nomadic Tribes 1 (NT-B).
  - Group 3: (i) Nomadic Tribes 2 (NT-C),
    - (ii) Nomadic Tribes 3 (NT-D),
    - (iii) Other Backward Class (OBC).
- <u>Explanation.</u> For Group 1, if the seat remains vacant in ST Category due to non-availability of its Candidates, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate belonging to the SC Category or vice versa.
- <u>Stage-V</u>: For all Backward Class Category Candidates. -If the seat reserved for Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of any Backward Class Category.

- <u>Stage -VI</u>: For Persons with Disability Candidates. -If the seat reserved for Persons with Disability remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to any Persons with Disability Candidates.
- <u>Stage –VII</u>: For all Candidates (without any type of Reservation). The seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit*.
- <u>Stage-VIII:</u> For All Candidates (without any Candidature Type): The seats remaining vacant shall be allotted to the All India Candidates.
  - (ii) In case of Direct Admission to Second Year (Lateral Entry) of Engineering and Technology: If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Diploma Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit* and further, if the seats remain vacant such seats shall be filled in on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Bachelor of Science Candidates.
- <u>Stage -IX</u>: For First Year Engineering admission to Diploma Candidates. After completion of stage VIII, If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to the Diploma Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit*.
- (2) In addition to above while allotting a seat for Direct Second Year of Engineering (Lateral Entry) and separate division, seat shall be allotted as follows, -
  - (i) The seat of Degree Course shall be allotted to the Candidate having same sub-group Diploma Course;
  - (ii) Vacant seats, if any, shall be allotted to the Candidate having the same main group Diploma Course.
  - (iii) If further seats remain vacant, it shall be allotted to the Candidate having any other Diploma Course.
  - The Groups and Subgroups are given in Schedule III.
- (3) For seats reserved for Female Candidate, the procedure for reservation as given in Government Circular of General Administration Department No. RSV 1012/CN-16/12/16A Dated 13th August 2014 shall be adopted.
- (2) All India Candidature Candidates- The allotment to these seats shall be done through CAP on the basis of score of, -
  - (a) First Year Engineering JEE (Main) 2018 -Paper 1 score and then if the seats remains vacant, on the basis of MHT-CET 2018 score;
  - (b) First Year Pharmacy and Pharm. D. NEET and then if seats remain vacant on the basis of MHT-CET 2018 Score;
  - (c) First Year Architecture Score obtained by giving 50% weightage to HSC marks and 50% weightage to valid score of National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA)2018 or normalised marks in JEE (main) paper II score;
  - (d) First Year Hotel Management and Catering Technology MAH-B.HMCT-CFT 2018 Score.

All these seats are treated as "General Category" seats and no reservation is provided in these seats for Candidates of Backward Class Category, Ladies, Persons with Disability and Defence, etc.

(3) Minority Quota Seats: - The stages of computerised allotment are as follows, -

**Stage-I**: The seats under minority quota in the minority institution linguistic or religious) shall be allotted to the respective minority candidates.

**Stage-II:** If the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates.

**Stage-III:** Further, if the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the All India candidature Candidates.

(4) Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature Candidate-The supernumerary seats for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature Candidates shall be allotted to the eligible candidates as in 5(6), on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit in the entrance test conducted by the appropriate authority and if seats remain vacant on the basis of CET conducted by competent authority.

#### a) Application Form Filling, Submission and Admission Centres

The eligible candidate shall fill the Online Application Form, take the printout, upload scanned copies of the required documents and send duly filled in and signed Application Form by speed post/courier/by hand delivery for verification & confirmation to Admission Centre identified for these admissions.

- i. The application should reach on or before the last date as notified. Application received after last date or incomplete application will not be verified and confirmed and name of such candidate will not appear in the merit list prepared for the purpose of CAP.
- ii. The Competent Authority shall publish the provisional Merit List. The candidates not appeared for CET conducted by competent authority but appeared for any other CET conducted by appropriate authority can also apply, however such candidates are required to pay the Application Fee through online mode (Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Net Banking).
- iii. The candidates whose names do not appear in the merit list(s) will not be able to participate in entire Admission Process.

# b) Counselling Round for J and K Migrant Candidates at identified Admission Centre

- i. Candidate seeking admission against these seats shall report to the Admission Centre of Admission Authority for admission as per the schedule.
- ii. The candidates shall produce the documentary evidence strictly as per the Proforma(s) in support of their claims.
- iii. These Admissions will be made strictly in the order of merit from amongst the candidates who report in person for admission at the concerned identified

- admission centre (as per 10(4) a) as per schedule, against the seats available in the various institutes at the time when the candidate actually reports for admission.
- iv. Admissions once confirmed shall be final and candidate shall not be allowed to seek transfer of their admission to any other institute and/or any other course during entire duration of the course.
- v. The candidates reporting late for the admission shall be considered for allotment against seats which are available at that time. The decision of the admission centre in-charge shall be final and binding.

#### Important note

Candidates admitted under this provision are not allowed to change course or college in any year of study.

#### c) Reporting at institutes:

- i. Candidate shall confirm the admission by paying the requisite amount of fee and by submitting required documents in original to respective institute, to which admission is granted as per schedule.
- ii. If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting necessary original documents within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- iii. If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured to some other institution, he or she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the institution where he/she has already taken admission indicating that he/she has been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of the certificates duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. Such candidates shall be required to pay the fees immediately at the time of admission and such candidates shall be permitted to submit the required original certificates within 04 working days after the date of payment of fees.

#### 11. Allotment of seats by CAP Round I, II and III-

- (1) CAP Round I, II and III shall be conducted by computerised allotment.
- (2) In CAP Round I.-
  - (a) For Minority Institutes the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference, -
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
    - (i) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules.

(3) In CAP Round II.-

#### Information Brochure for Admission to Under Graduate Technical Courses (2018-19)

- (a) for Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
  - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
  - (ii) Stages I to V of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
  - (iii) Stage II of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
  - (iv) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10,
  - (v) Stage III of sub-rule (3) of rule 10 of these rules;
- (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidate's asper following preference:
  - (i) Stages I to V of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
  - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (4) In CAP Round III.-
  - (a) for Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Stage II of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (iv) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10,
    - (v) Stage III of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (vi) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference,
    - (i) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules;
    - (iii) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (5) If the seat remains vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting, such seat will be considered for allotment in subsequent round.
- (6) Every stage in CAP Round I, II and III shall be executed with HU and OHU tag and if the seats remain vacant then the same stage shall be executed without HU and OHU tag. If further seats remain vacant for any reason in 7(1), 7(2) and 7(3) of these rules they shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates as in 5(1), 5(2) and 5(3) irrespective of the seat type on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit*.

#### 12. General provisions. -

- (a) Allotment in CAP Round-I, II and III of Home University Seats, Other than Home University seats and State Level Seats will be carried out as per *Inter-Se-Merit* of Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature. The seats will be allotted to Candidates as per *Inter-Se-Merit*, options filled and seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAP Round-I, II and III;
- (b) All Candidates eligible for a particular stage of allotment will be considered for allotment of a seat in that stage, even if they have been allotted or not allotted a seat in the previous stage;
- (c) During the allotment of any stage, the Candidate may get upward shift in the allotment with reference to the options filled by the Candidate according to availability of seats at that point of time;

- (d) There shall not be any reservation under different categories in an Unaided Professional Educational Institution, for allocation of seats stated in 7(2), 7(3), 7(4) and 7(5);
- (e) All reserved Category Candidates (including SBC in their original Category) shall be considered for allotment in all stages;
- (f) Due to upward shifts, the seats falling vacant shall be considered for allotment in further iterations of the same stage as per the provisions of that stage of allotment;
- (g) Allotment against the first available option in the order of preference filled in shall be retained as final allotment;
- (h) The allotment list displayed on website will show the provisional allotment offered to the Candidates. No personal communication or allotment letters in this regard shall be issued to the Candidates;
- (i) A Candidate who has been allotted a seat shall download the "Provisional Seat Allotment Letter". For Seat Acceptance, Candidate has to pay Seat Acceptance Fee through Online mode of Payment (Credit Card / Debit Card / Internet Banking / etc) or the mode as decided by Competent Authority and shall report to any one of the identified Admission Reporting Centre. (List shall be available on website). Seat will be confirmed by the Admission Reporting Centre after verification of the original documents and ensuring that the candidate meets all the eligibility norms. The centre in-charge shall issue the Online Receipt of acceptance;
- (j) The Seat Acceptance Fee shall be Rs. 1,000/- for all Candidates the same shall be treated as non-refundable processing fee;
- (k) Failure to report in person for Seat acceptance will be considered as if the Candidate has rejected the offer;
- (I) Allotted Seat will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document or certificate is found to be invalid or fraudulent and/or the Candidate does not meet the eligibility norms;
- (m) Candidates who want to reject the allocated seat can do so by not remitting the seat acceptance fee at the Admission Reporting Centre in scheduled period. Candidates who reject allocated seat shall be considered for admission in subsequent rounds only if they submit fresh option form for subsequent round of admission as per schedule.
- **13.** Admissions in Institutional Quota and vacant seats after CAP.- The Director or Principal of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these seats in the following manner. -
  - (a) Admissions shall be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Candidates who have applied to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to the Institution.
  - (b) Information brochure or prospectus of the Institution which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institution's website.

- (c) Institution shall invite applications by notifying schedule of admission and the number of seats in each course to be filled by the institution, by advertisement on the website of the institution. Aspiring Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria as notified by the Government and specified by the appropriate authority, from time to time, shall apply to the Principal or Director of the respective institution for admission at the Institution level as provided in rule 3(4)(b) and shall be filled in on the basis of *Inter-Se-Meirt* prepared by following the procedure specified in 8(3).
- (d) The institution after verification of all required documents shall prepare and display the *Inter-Se-merit* lists of the Candidates to be filled in at the institution level, in the Institutional Quota and Supernumerary Quota of OCI / PIO, Foreign National, Children's of Indian workers in Gulf Countries along with the vacant seats after CAP, on the notice board and shall publish the same on the website of the institution.
- (e)The Minority or Non-Minority institution intending to surrender the Institutional Quota (in part or full) of specified courses to the CAP shall communicate two days before the display of seat matrix of CAP Round I and the same shall be allotted as per the rules of CAP. The Institutes shall not be allowed to surrender Institutional quota seats thereafter All the admissions and cancellations shall be updated instantly through online system.
- (h) If any CAP seat remains or becomes vacant after the CAP Rounds, then the same shall be filled in by the Candidate from the same Category for which it was earmarked during the CAP. Further if the seats remain vacant then the seats shall be filled on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the applicants.

NOTE:- While filling these seats the preference shall be given to the Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit*.

#### 14. Approval of Merit List and the Admitted Candidates List. -

- (1) After completion of Admission process every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission- approval proposal to the Director Technical Education and the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the subsection (5) of the section 9 of the Act.
- (2) The Admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all Candidates admitted which shall have the quota, Candidature Type, Reservation, Qualification Marks, etc as well as the required documents of the Candidates admitted at institution level.
- (3) If a minority institution fails to admit minimum Fifty-One percent of its Sanctioned Intake from the persons belonging to the concerned minority, for a period of three consecutive years the Competent Authority shall inform the Department accordingly. The Department shall forward such cases along with observations to the Minorities Development Department as per provisions of Subsection (2) of the Section 6 of the Act.
- **15.** Cancellation of Admission and Refund of fees, return of documents by Institutions. -

- (a) The Candidate shall apply online for cancellation and submit duly signed copy of system generated application for cancellation of admission to the institution. Once the candidate submits online request for cancellation, his/her admission shall be treated as cancelled. The Institute shall consider the online request made by Candidate for cancellation as final irrespective of whether he/she has submitted duly signed copy of system generated application to the Institute. Upon such cancellation, the candidate shall lose the claim on the seat and such seat shall become available for further allotment. The candidate shall then become entitled to and the Institute shall refund the entire fees to the candidate after deduction of Rs.1000/- towards processing charges and return all his/her original documents submitted to the Institute within two days from submission of duly signed copy of system generated application to the Institute;
  - (b) Notwithstanding clause (a) above, candidate shall not be entitled to any refund of his/her fee except the Security Deposit and Caution Money Deposit if the online cancellation is effected by the candidate after 5.00 p.m. of the cut-off date prescribed by the Competent Authority;
  - (c) No institution, who has in its possession or custody, of any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited with it by a person for the purpose of seeking admission in such institution, shall refuse to return such degree, certificate award or other document with a view to induce or compel such person to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or program of study which such person does not intend to pursue or avail any facility in such institution.

#### 16. Change of Course or Institution after First, Second or Third year. -

- (1)The Candidate seeking for a change in course or shift after successfully completing the First Year of studies or both first and Second Semester examination in full or failed in one of the heads of passing will be allowed to do so in the same institution subject to the availability of sets and changes will be carried out based on the marks of First Year or First and Second Semester together. The Principal shall be responsible for ascertaining the eligibility of the Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;
- (2) Transfer of Candidates (Course and/or Institution) after One/ Two/ Three year shall be made in the following manner, -
  - (a) The Candidate once admitted in First Year / Second Year shall not be eligible for transfer to any other institution during the same academic year;
  - (b) The Candidate passing the First Year (both first and second semester) or second year (both third and fourth semester) or third year (both fifth and sixth semester) examinations in full or failed in one of the heads of passing are considered as eligible for transfer of Institution or course, provided that for transfer after second year the candidate should have passed the first year, and for transfer after third year the candidate should have passed first and second year;

- (c) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage in any case from Unaided Institutions, to Government or Government Aided Institutions or University Departments or University Managed Institutions. However, the Candidate from Government or Government Aided Institution or University Departments or University Managed Institutions may seek transfer to Unaided Educational Institution;
- (d) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage to Autonomous Institutions;
- (e) Transfer to Unaided Institutions. The Principals of Unaided Institutions shall consider the Candidates from other institutions for transfer with prior approval from the Directorate of Technical Education on submission of No Objection Certificate (NOC) from institution, Eligibility Certificate from University and Vacancy position. The Principal or Director of the institute shall ascertain the eligibility of Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred; Transfer in Government or Government aided Institutions- Eligible Candidates aspiring for a transfer from Government or Government Aided or University Departments and University Managed Institutions to other Government or Government Aided or University Department or University Managed Institutions, shall apply in writing to the Principal/ Director of the institute in which he/she studied first year or second semester. The Principal or Director shall forward the consolidated branch wise merit list of eligible candidates giving details like Name, Course, percentage of Marks, Names of Courses and Institution in order of preference to which candidates desires to seek transfer, reasons for transfer and Remarks, along with course wise vacancy position in institution, to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, so as to reach him as per the schedule given by him. All the Principals of Government and Government Aided Institutions, University Departments, and University Managed Institutions shall submit vacancy position of all courses to the Directorate of Technical Education, Mumbai before stipulated date.
- (f) No application without recommendation of the Principal / Director of Institution shall be entertained by the Directorate of Technical Education;
- (g) If the result of the University or Institution is not declared before the process of transfer, Candidates of that University will lose claim on transfer;
- (3) The Candidates admitted under Supernumerary Quota seats are not eligible for change of Course or Institution;
- (4) The candidates from the professional educational institutions which are outside the purview of the act shall be eligible for transfer to the unaided private professional educational institutions subject to the fulfilment of eligibility criterion and requirements stipulated under the provisions of sub section (1) of section 3 of the Act and the fulfilment of the conditions stated in sub-rule (2).
- (5) List of all such transfers shall be communicated by the Directorate of Technical Education to the office of the Admissions Regulating Authority for final approval.

The candidates are required to carry **ALL Original Certificates/Documents** in support of their claim at the time of filling up of Application Form for Admission for the scrutiny and verification at identified Facilitation Centre. #### 18. Miscellaneous provisions

#### a) Conduct and Discipline

- (i) Failure of the candidate in making **full and correct Statements** in the application form and/or **suppression** of any information and/or submission of false documents shall **lead to disqualification** of the candidate from the examination or at later stage during the Admission Process such candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.
- (ii) Adopting any unfair means or engaging in malpractice in the examination shall render a candidate liable for punishment under, "Maharashtra Prevention of Malpractices Act, Universities, Board and Other Specified Examination Act, 1982" and disqualify him/her for examination.
- (iii) Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority.
- (iv) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Government takes any policy decision pertaining to admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect from that point of time as per the directives from the Government from time to time.
- (v) Students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.
- **b) Action against ragging**: Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 and Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging (Appendix 12 published in AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2011-12) and their amendments which may be published from time to time. The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 is in effect from 15th May, 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.
- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited,
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty, which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the

educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is located, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that prima facie there is no substance, in the complaint received; he / she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final.

- e) If the Head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above.
- f) Undertaking from the candidate shall be taken while admitting the candidate in the Institute.
- g) Any Acts or its amendments which may be published from time to time by AICTE, Government or Judgments by Hon. Supreme Court of India, Hon. High Court of Bombay etc will be applicable to Candidates and Institutions covered under these rules of admission.
- h) If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied or any certificate(s) submitted by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal/Director. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be sent within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final. Such candidates are also liable for penal action as per the provisions in the law.

#### c) Others:

- (i) The medium of instruction for degree courses is English.
- (ii) The candidates are advised to ensure before applying that he/she is eligible for admission to the program as per the prevailing eligibility norms of the University. Admission of candidate will be treated as finally confirmed only on production of the Eligibility Certificate from the University to which the college is affiliated.
- (iii) Physical fitness: Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action.
- (iv) The Head of the institution shall have the right to satisfy himself about the conduct and character of a candidate by verifying the antecedents of a candidate through the appropriate police-authority, before admitting him / her to the college / institution.

#### d) Hostel accommodation:

Accommodation in Hostel cannot be guaranteed to the admitted candidates. All the Candidates are advised to personally verify the availability of Hostel, Hostel fees payable etc. from the Director/Principal of the college to which they intend to take admission. The Director/Principal of the colleges shall consider on priority the applications of Persons with Disability candidates, Sons and Daughters of Jammu and Kashmir migrant candidates and Government of India nominees for Hostel accommodation.

**e)** The English version of the notified gazette shall be considered for the purpose of interpretation of the meaning and correctness of any provisions made in the Admission Rule and its amendment.

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#### 1. Introduction,-

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules to regulate the admissions to the First year of Full Time Professional Undergraduate Technical Courses (Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Hotel Management and Catering Technology) and Direct Second Year of Engineering and Technology and Pharmacy. These rules are in accordance with the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Technical Courses) Rules, 2017 published on 24.04.2017. This brochure gives information regarding the eligibility and rules of admission to First and Second year of various technical professional undergraduate degree courses in the State of Maharashtra. This also provides information about invitation of applications for admission, preparation of merit list, distribution of seats, details of reservation, various rounds and stages of Centralised Admission Process (CAP), admissions in Institutional Quota seats and vacant seats after CAP, supernumerary seats, refund of fees, etc.

These rules are also applicable for admissions in Government and Government Aided professional educational institutions vide Government Resolution of Higher & Technical Education Department No. TEM-2016/CR (473/16)/ TE-4 Dated 25<sup>th</sup> April 2017.

#### 2. Definitions.-

- (a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015);
- (b) "Admission Reporting Centre" means a centre where the Candidate shall report for confirmation of admission by verification of documents and payment of fees;
- (c) "All India Seats" means seats available to an eligible Indian National Candidate;
- (d) "Application Form" means prescribed form filled up online by the Candidate for admission:
- (e) "Autonomous Institution" means the institution to which autonomy is granted by the University Grants Commission;
- (f) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority;
- (g) "Competent Authority" means the Commissioner of State CET appointed by the Government under section 10, for conducting CET through CAP for the admissions into Private Professional Educational Institutions;
- (h) "Courses" means the full time Undergraduate technical courses in Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Hotel Management and Catering Technology;
- (i) "Department" means Higher and Technical Education Department of Government of Maharashtra;
- (j) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;
- (k) "Facilitation Centre" means a centre where the facilities like sale of

- application kits, filling online forms, verification of documents and grievances, etc, are provided;
- (l) "Home University (HU)" means the university area as specified in rule 5(1)herein;
- (m) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (n) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time;
- (o) "Inter-Se-Merit" means the order of merit declared by the Competent Authority in respect of various classes/category of Candidates;
- (p) "JEE Main" means the Joint Entrance Examination conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (q) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;
- (r) "Non-Autonomous Institution" means those institutions which are not 'Autonomous Institutions';
- (s) "OHU" means the area Outside Home University area;
- (t) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate/person registered as an Overseas Citizen of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955 and includes Persons of Indian Origin (PIO).
  - **Explanation:** For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders registered under notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F. No. 26011/04/98- F. I dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I. Dated 9th January, 2015;
- (u) "Qualifying Examination" means examinations on the basis of which a candidate becomes eligible for admission or its equivalent examination;
- (v) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Board;
- (w) "Supernumerary Seats" means seats which are over and above the Sanctioned Intake approved by the appropriate authority and the Government, from time to time;
- (x) "TFWS" means the Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme of All India Council for Technical Education.
- **3. Invitation of Application. (1)** The Competent Authority shall invite Online Applications from Candidates for participating in CET and / or CAP for seeking admission to the Professional Courses for which State CET or alternative entrance examination is required for the academic Year
- (2) The Competent Authority shall invite online applications in the prescribed form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process

- (CAP) for seeking admission to the undergraduate technical courses, which are exempted from CET as per provisions of the act.
- (3) The Competent Authority shall invite online application form, from the eligible candidates for participating in Centralized Admission Process (CAP) to the undergraduate technical courses for which the entrance test is conducted by the appropriate authority under any Central Act and shall be applicable for seeking admission to such professional courses, as per the provisions of the Central Act, rules and regulations made there under.
- (3) The Candidates seeking admissions to the professional courses for the seats provided in -
  - (a) 7(1)-Maharashtra State Candidature Seats,7(2)- All India Candidature Seats, 7(3)- Minority Quota Seats and 7(5)(b)- Supernumerary Seats for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature-For these seats the candidates shall apply to the Competent Authority for admission through Centralised Admission Process(CAP).
  - (b) 7(4)- Institutional Quota Seats and 7(5)(a) Supernumerary Seats for OCI/ PIO, Foreign Students and the Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries Candidates - For these seats the candidates shall initially apply to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to respective institutes, to enable the institutions to give admissions to such eligible applicants on the basis of inter-se merit. It is pre-requisite and mandatory to apply for verification of documents to the Competent Authority to be eligible for admission under this quota.
- (4) The Candidate should submit the necessary Certificates issued by the concerned Appropriate Authority, along-with the application, in the given Proforma. The list of documents to be submitted is given in the clause of this Information Brochure.

#### 4. Role of Competent Authority and its representatives in the process of Admission.-

- a) The Competent Authority, the Commissioner of State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra State, shall be the authority for Centralised Admission Process and shall direct the students as per their allotment through CAP to all institutions i.e. Government, Government Aided, University Department, University Managed Colleges, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University, Lonere (BATU) & Institute of Chemical Technology (ICT), Mumbai and Unaided Private Professional Technical Educational Institutions.
- The Competent Authority shall deal with the representations received from the candidates pertaining to allotment and admissions as Grievance Redressal Authority.
- All the decisions taken in relation to Admission to First/ Direct Second Year of courses, by the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all concerned

- and Kashmir to combat terrorist activities and joined the post on or before the last date for submission of application for admission; or
- (c) The children of staff and officers of Jammu and Kashmir police engaged in combating terrorism are eligible under this category;
- 6. Sanctioned Intake and Supernumerary Seats for various Courses.-
- 6(1) The Sanctioned Intake for First Year Degree Course, Direct Second Year (Lateral entry) and Direct Second Year separate division Degree Courses shall be as per the approval given by the authority which is competent for giving approval to respective courses and affiliation given by the respective affiliating University.

The Institute Information, Courses and the Sanctioned Intake displayed on the web site of the Competent Authority shall be treated as authentic for admissions for the year 2017-18. Candidates shall refer the web site for the revised and final Institute Information before filling the Option/Preference Form.

For admission to Direct Second Year (Lateral entry), the number of seats available shall be calculated as given in **Schedule - II**.

- **6(2)** The supernumerary seats shall be available to the Institutions as approved by the appropriate authority, from time to time.
- **7. Allocation of Seats.** The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates in the Home University, Other than Home University and State Level shall be in accordance with the policy of the Government as specified in **Schedule-I** for First Year and **Schedule -II** for Direct Second Year of various Under Graduate Courses.
- **7(1) Maharashtra State Candidature Seats.-** The Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature as specified in 5(1), shall be eligible for these seats.
- **7(2) All India Candidature Seats.**-The Candidates having Candidature as given in 5(2) shall be eligible for these seats.
- **7(3) Minority Quota Seats.-**The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in 5(3) shall be eligible for these seats as specified in **Schedule-I** and **Schedule-II**. These seats shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 6, of the Act.
- **7(4) Institutional Quota Seats.-** The Institution can admit Eligible Candidates as specified in Schedule I and Schedule II, subject to following conditions.-

- (i) The Candidates having candidature as given in 5(5) and the children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries shall be eligible for these supernumerary seats.
- (ii) These seats shall be subject to the maximum of 15% of the Sanctioned Intake seats or as prescribed by the appropriate authority, from time to time. Out of 15% seats, one third shall be reserved for the children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries and two third seats shall be reserved for OCI / PIO or Foreign Students candidates or as prescribed by the appropriate authority, from time to time.
- (iii) These seats shall be filled in by the institution on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of candidates as given in 8.
- (iv) Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Foreign Nationals/ PIOs/Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries/ Child or Ward of NRI shall send their applications to

#### (c) Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) Seats:

#### (I) Scheme

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The scheme shall be mandatory for all Technical Institutions offering undergraduate programs and lateral entry (Separate Division) to these programs that are approved by the All India Council for Technical Education.
- (iii) Seats up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and will be available to such courses in an Institute where a minimum of 30% of sanctioned seats in the respective courses are filled up in respective CAP Round. For calculation of 30%, the Institutional Quota seats retained by institute for the course shall be considered as completely filled.
- (iv) The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the Fee Regulation Authority for unaided Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other fees except tuition fees shall be paid by the beneficiary.
- (v) The Candidates admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change Institution/course at any stage under any circumstances.
- (vi) These seats shall be available for admission to First Year of Engineering & Technology and Hotel Management & Catering Technology courses as well as in Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology (Separate Division).

#### (II) Eligibility

- (i) Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates are eligible for these seats
- (ii) Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates having their parent's annual income less than Rs.6.00 Lakhs from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall submit Income certificate issued by Appropriate Authority.

#### (III) Admissions Procedure

These seats are allotted by the Competent Authority as per inter-se merit. For this purpose the Competent Authority shall invite applications, prepare a separate merit list for this category by following the same criteria as for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.

#### (d) Jammu and Kashmir Candidates and North East States:

- (i) The admission to the candidates as per *Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)* for the students belonging to Jammu and Kashmir and the scheme of Government of India of allocation of supernumerary seats in AICTE approved colleges to North Eastern States and UTs (NEUT) which lack in such facilities of technical education shall be done by the competent authority appointed by the Central Government as per their eligibility criteria.
- (ii) The Fees shall be as that of for the Non Autonomous Government Institutes.

#### 7(6) Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to **candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only** subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

#### (a) Reservation for Backward Class category Candidates:

#### (b) Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five percent (5%) seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAP shall be reserved for Children of ex- service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1), Children of active service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2), Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) Who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State, or Who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

- (i) These seats are within the sanctioned intake and are available as **State Level seats**.
- (ii) A combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 and DEF3 candidates shall be prepared.
- (iii) Candidates claiming these seats shall produce additional documents in Proforma C, D and/or E as applicable.
- (iv) This provision is NOT available to the children of **CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working /who has worked in the Indian Defence Service.

#### (c) Reservation for Persons with Disability Candidate:

Three percent (3%) seats of total sanctioned intake of all the Institutions under CAP shall be reserved for Candidates with Disability.

- (i) 1% seats for Visually impaired (blind) candidates (P1),
- (ii) 1% seats for Speech & hearing impaired (deaf & dumb) candidates (P2),
- (iii) 1% seats for Orthopedic disorders, learning disabilities, Dyslexia, Dyscalculia, Dysgraphica, Spastic (P3)

The allotment of seats reserved for the Candidates with Disability shall be done on the basis of an inter-se merit of respective type of handicap of such candidates. These seats are available in HU / SL seats for Maharashtra domiciled candidates.

The candidates claiming reservation under this category shall submit the certificates strictly as per the Proforma– F/F-1.

#### (a) Eligibility criteria for Candidates belonging to Persons with Disability:

#### 8. Preparation of Merit List.-

- 8(1) Assignment of merit number.- All the eligible Candidates who have submitted Application Form on or before the last date specified for the submission of Application Form for Admission through CAP shall be assigned a merit number.
- 8(2) Change of Marks due to verification.-If the marks in the qualifying examination are modified due to verification and the same is duly certified by the concerned Competent Authority or Board, the same shall be reported to the Competent Authority for admission through CAP or its designated representatives immediately. However the effect of such change will be taken into consideration only for the subsequent round (s) of admission.
- 8(3) Method of calculating marks at qualifying examination for deciding eligibility.-While deciding the eligibility of the Candidates following procedure shall be adopted,-

#### 9. Centralised Admission Process (CAP).-

#### 9 (1) Centralised Admission Process CAP stages

The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act. The Government, Government Aided institutes, University Departments and University managed Institutions shall also admit the candidates through CAP. The stages of CAP shall be as stated below,-

- (a) Display or Publishing of Information Brochure by the Competent Authority. The Information Brochure shall be published on the website of the Competent Authority
- (b) Filling Online Application Form by Candidate for participation in the Centralised Admission Process.
  - (i) For First Year Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Pharm D., Hotel management & Catering Technology: All the aspiring candidates shall fill in the Online Application Form for admission through their login which is provided to them at the time of applying to the Common Entrance Test (CET)conducted for that course. For admissions to first year Engineering and Technology, the eligible candidates aspiring for admission on the basis of JEE (Main) Paper 1 (who did not appear for MHT-CET 2017) should apply, by paying required fees, to be eligible for admission under All India Quota seats and Institutional Quota seats.
  - (ii) For First and Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology, and Pharmacy and First Year Architecture: The eligible candidates are required to fill the application form Online

- (iv) The Application processing fee will be verified from time to time as notified by the Competent Authority and the amount is Non Refundable.
- (v) The candidate should read the information brochure carefully
- (vi) The candidate should fill the Online Application Form as per the notified schedule for respective admission.
- (vii) The list of the Facilitation Centers shall be published on the website. The Facilitation center shall facilitate the candidate to fill the Online Application Form, scan and upload the required documents without any charges.
- (viii)The Candidates will also be able to fill in Online Application Form and upload the scanned copies of the required documents through any computer connected to internet from home, cybercafé.
- (ix) Candidates are required to fill in all the details as per the instructions.
- (x) After filling the information and submission of Application Form, the Candidates shall verify the data filled and correct it if required. The candidate shall take printout of the form and sign it.
- (xi) The Printout of form shall have list of documents required to be produced by the candidate for substantiating his claim made in the application form.
- (xii) Candidate can edit/update the information in his application form before he confirms it at any of the Facilitation Centre.
- (c) Document Verification at Facilitation Centre by the Candidate in person;
  - The Candidates shall report to any convenient Facilitation Centre in person along with signed printout of application form filled online and the required original documents for verification.
  - (ii) The Facilitation Centre In-charge shall verify the information from the original copies of required documents and collect the duly signed application.
  - (iii) The Facilitation Centre In-charge shall confirm candidate's Application Form through online system and issue the Receipt cum Acknowledgement of Application Form.

#### (iv) After confirmation of application form information cannot be changed by candidate.

- (d) Display or Publishing of Provisional merit list, Submission of grievances, if any, and Display or Publishing of Final Merit Lists;
  - i. Provisional Merit List of eligible candidates will be displayed on the website.
  - ii. For discrepancy if any, in the provisional merit list, Within Specified Grievance period, Candidates can submit the grievances in writing along with necessary documents to substantiate, at Facilitation Centre where candidate has confirmed application form.
  - iii. No document shall be accepted to substantiate the claim made in application after scheduled dates.
  - iv. Final merit lists will be displayed on the website.

# NOTE: - The merit list gives relative position of the candidate and it does not guarantee admission to any course/ institute.

- (e) Display of available Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) for CAP Round I— The competent authority shall publish the information on the website about institutes, courses offered, Sanctioned intake and number of seats available for each category before each round.
- (f) Filling up and Confirmation of Online Option Form having preferences of Courses and Institutions before CAP Round I Candidates may fill in **maximum 300 choices** of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference. The Option Form once confirmed by the Candidate through their login shall be considered for allotment in CAP Round I;
  - (i) In order to participate in the CAP (subject to fulfillment of the eligibility requirements of respective CAP round), it is MANDATORY to fill the Online Option Form for CAP Round I.
  - (ii) Candidates will be able to fill in the online option form through their login.
  - (iii) It is mandatory for all candidates to confirm the online option form by himself / herself.
  - (iv) After confirmation of Option form, the candidate will not be able to change the Options.
  - (v) Candidates should not disclose their Application ID & Password to others to avoid impersonation. Competent Authority shall not be responsible for submissions done by others on behalf of the candidate. For Security reasons, candidates are instructed to keep changing the password and keep note of it in secured place.
  - (vi) The serial number of block in the option form indicates preference of choice. Thus the choice code of the institute filled by the candidate in block No. 1 will be his/her first preference (Highest Priority Choice).
  - (vii) Option form received through online submission only will be considered for further processing.
  - (viii) Candidate shall confirm the submitted on-line Option Form himself/herself by re-entering Application ID and Password. The candidate can take a printout of the confirmed Option form for his record and future reference
  - (ix) The candidate can fill in minimum 1 and maximum 300 options. The candidate shall fill the institute choice code against the option number in the online option form.

- (g) Display of Provisional Allotment of CAP Round I indicating allotted institute and Course.
- (h) Reporting and accepting the offered seat as per the allotment of the CAP Round I by the Candidate at Admission Reporting Centre.

#### 9 (2) Choice of academic programme for subsequent round(s)

During the CAP, before accepting the allotted seat, if any, in Round I, a Candidate can select the choice of 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' for subsequent round(s), of seat allocation, as provided below,-

- (a) **Freeze:** Candidates accept the offered seat and they do not want to participate in any further rounds of seat allocation. Such Candidates will not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission;
- (b) **Slide:** Candidates accept the offered seat and indicate that, if admission to the academic program of higher preference is offered within the same Institution, they will accept it. Such Candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of admission;
- (c) **Float:** Candidates accept the offered seat and indicate that, if admission to an academic program of higher preference in any Institution is offered, they will accept it. Else, they will continue with the currently accepted academic program. Such Candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of admission;
- (d) Candidate should select the reporting option as 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' through their login.
- (e) If candidate gets better choice in CAP Round II and /or III, Candidate may change the reporting option as 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' through their login, otherwise earlier option will be carried forward.
- (f) For Candidates who choose the Float or Slide option, and secures a seat of his choice of higher preference, then it would automatically result in the forfeiture of the seat accepted by the Candidate in the earlier round;
- (g) Slide and Float options will not be available to a Candidate who is offered admission to his first choice.
- (h) If a candidate fails to report for the acceptance of allotted seat at Admission Reporting Center in scheduled time, It will be treated as if he has rejected the allotted seat and such candidate shall not be eligible for CAP Round II and / or III unless he fills in fresh option form for the CAP Round II and/ or CAP Round III.

#### 9(3) Conduct of CAP Round-II and III.-

- (a) The seats available for CAP Round II and III shall be published on the website. The Candidates are allowed to fill in or edit the already filled online option form. The seats to be allotted during these rounds shall be subject to following conditions.-
  - (i) Before start of these rounds, the Candidates can change their seat acceptance option from Slide or Float to Freeze or viceversa by submitting an application at Admission Reporting Centre (ARC) where he has confirmed his admission by paying the seat acceptance Fee;
  - (ii) Following candidates will be considered eligible for this round;
    - a. The Candidates who have not been allotted any seat in any of the previous rounds or who did not participate (Failure of filling option form) in previous rounds; or

- b. Those who have taken and cancelled their admission in the earlier rounds; or
- c. Those who have rejected the offered seat by not reporting to the Admission Reporting Centre; or
- d. Those who had selected Freeze option in earlier rounds but are desirous of changing the option to Float or Slide in these round.
- (iii) Candidates who have opted for Float or Slide and also applying for these round shall not fill in the allotted institution in their choice list, it will be added by the software at the end of the list. Once the upward allotment is made the earlier allotment automatically stands cancelled;
- (iv) Slide and Float options are not available for the seats allotted in CAP Round III, as it is final CAP Round.
- (b) Reporting and accepting the offered seat as per the allotment of the CAP Round IV by the Candidate at Admission Reporting Centre.
- **9(4) Reporting and confirmation of admission.** After final CAP Round, the Candidate shall report to the institution finally allotted to him and confirm his/her admission in the institution.

#### 9(5) Fees and Concessions:

# (a) Fees Prescribed for Government and Government Aided Institutes and University Managed Engineering / Technology Degree Programes:

I) For Engineering Course: As per the Government Resolution No. TEM-2003/(249/03)/TE-1, dated 11th September 2003, has decided the tuition fee, development fee and other fees per year for Government, Government Aided, University Managed Colleges and University Departments. As per the policy of State Government, the fees for Government, Government Aided Autonomous Institutes is raised by 10% every year after grant of Autonomous Status to the institute. Accordingly, the fee structure for the Engineering Programs for academic year 2017-18 shall be as follows.

#### **Important Notes:**

- 1. No tuition fee for SC/ST category and for candidates admitted under TFWS.
- 2. In case the Government revises the fees for the Government institutes for the year 2017-18, then the admitted candidates will be required to pay the difference in fees as per the Government order.
- 3. The Department of Technology, Shivaji University offers courses on Self Financing basis, and hence the fees shall be as per the Fees approved by Appropriate Authority.

#### (b) Fees prescribed in Unaided Private Professional Educational **Institutions:**

The Adhoc/Interim fee structure shall be as approved by the Fee Regulating Authority established under the Act. The final fee approved and published by the Fee Regulating Authority for that year shall be the fee payable by the candidate for that course for that academic year.

#### (c) Details of Concession in fees for Backward Class Category Candidates (belonging to Maharashtra State only)

SC/ST/VJ DT NT(A)/NT(B)/NT(C)/NT(D)/SBC /OBC category candidates, the scheme/mode of concessions, scheme of loan scholarship (if any) for eligible candidates, in tuition and other fees will be announced by the Central/ State Government. These candidates will get only that amount of waiver as notified in the circulars issued by the Government Department from time to time, subject to fulfillment of norms and conditions laid down by these Departments.

Candidates claiming fee concession under various categories shall produce the requisite certificates as may be specified by the respective Government Departments.

#### (d) Fees for Jammu & Kashmir Migrant Candidates and North East and Union Territory Candidates admitted by appropriate authority:

These candidates shall pay the fees as applicable to the Non Autonomous Government institutes (as given in 9(5)(a)). Candidates shall also pay additional fees as prescribed by the concerned University from time to time.

#### (e) Caution Money Deposits:

Caution money deposit received from the students shall be refunded after successful completion of the course or after canceling the admission. Unless there is any recovery, no deduction shall be made from the caution money deposit. However, if candidate does not apply for refund, within 3 complete financial years after the student actually leaves the institution; or, within 3 complete financial years after the date of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier the amount of caution money deposit shall be transferred to Students Aid Fund in case of Un-Aided/Autonomous colleges and credited to Government in case of Government and Government-Aided Non Autonomous Colleges.

- 10. CAP allotment stages and process of allotment.-Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner,-
- 10(1) Maharashtra State Candidature Candidate.- (1) The stages of computerised allotment are as follows,-

#### Stage -I: For all the Candidates.-

(a) All the Candidates (Open, Reserved, Male, Female, Tuition Fee Waiver) belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their *Inter-Se-*Merit.

- (b) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-Se-Merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.
- (c) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category by virtue of their merit and in case of SBC Candidates who were in Backward Class prior to their inclusion in SBC Category shall be considered in their original Backward Class Category.
- (d) Persons with Disability Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them otherwise in Open Category as per their *Inter-Se-Merit* if the seats reserved for them are not available at their merit.
- (e) Defence Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them by virtue of their merit or in Open Category as per their *Inter-Se-Merit* if the seats reserved for them are not available at their merit
- (f) If a seat is available for a candidate in more than one category, then the seat allotment shall be done in the sequence as given below,
  - (i) Seat for ladies
  - (ii) Seat for Persons with disability candidates
  - (iii) Seat for Defence category candidates
- (g) The TFWS seat shall be allotted to the eligible Candidate only to such course in an Institute where a minimum of 30 % of sanctioned seats in the respective course are allotted.
- <u>Stage II</u>: For allotment of seats reserved for Female to Male Candidates.- If the seat remains vacant after allotment to Female Candidates of the Backward Class Category or Open Category, such seat shall be allotted to the Male Candidates belonging to respective Backward Class or Open Category.
- <u>Stage -III</u>: For SBC Category Candidates.-If the Backward Class Category seat remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates of SBC Category, limited to the extent of 2% seats.
- <u>Stage -IV</u>: For respective groups of Backward Class Category Candidates.- If the seats remain vacant in the respective group of following Categories, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates from within the respective group,-
  - **Group 1**: (i) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Castes converted to Buddhism (SC),
    - (ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside the specified areas (ST).
  - **Group 2**: (i) Vimukta Jatis/De- Notified Tribes (VJ/DT),NT(A), (ii) Nomadic Tribes 1 (NT-B).
  - Group 3: (i) Nomadic Tribes 2 (NT-C),
    - (ii) Nomadic Tribes 3 (NT-D),
    - (iii) Other Backward Class (OBC).
- **Explanation.** For Group 1, if the seat remains vacant in ST Category due to non-availability of its Candidates, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate belonging to the SC Category or vice versa.
- <u>Stage-V</u>: For all Backward Class Category Candidates.-If the seat reserved for Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of any Backward Class Category.

- Stage -VI: For Persons with Disability Candidates.-If the seat reserved for Persons with Disability remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to any Persons with Disability Candidates.
- Stage -VII: For all Candidates (without any type of Reservation).- The seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Candidates based on Inter-Se-Merit.
- Stage-VIII: For All Candidates (without any Candidature Type):- The seats remaining vacant shall be allotted to the All India Candidates.
  - (ii) In case of Direct Admission to Second Year (Lateral Entry) of Engineering and Technology: If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Diploma Candidates based on Inter-Se-Merit and further, if the seats remain vacant such seats shall be filled in on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the Bachelor of Science Candidates.
- Stage -IX: For First year Engineering admission to Diploma and Bachelor of Science Candidates.-After completion of stage VIII, If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to the Diploma Candidates based on Inter-Se-Merit and further, if the seats remain vacant such seats shall be considered for allotment to the Bachelor of Science Candidates on Inter-Se-Merit.
- (2) In addition to above while allotting a seat for Direct Second Year of Engineering (Lateral Entry) and separate division, seat shall be allotted as follows.-
  - (i) The seat of Degree Course shall be allotted to the Candidate having same sub-group Diploma Course;
  - (ii) Vacant seats, if any, shall be allotted to the Candidate having the same main group Diploma Course.
  - (iii) If further seats remains vacant, it shall be allotted to the Candidate having any other Diploma Course.

The Groups and Subgroups are given in Schedule III.

- (3) For seats reserved for Female Candidate, the procedure for reservation as given in Government Circular of General Administration Department No. RSV 1012/CN-16/12/16A Dated 13th August 2014 shall be adopted.
- 10(2) All India Candidature Candidates- The allotment to these seats shall be done through CAP on the basis of score of,-
  - First Year Engineering JEE (Main) 2017 Paper 1 score and then if (a) the seats remains vacant, on the basis of MHT-CET 2017 score:
  - First Year Pharmacy and Pharm. D. MHT-CET 2017 Score;
  - First Year Architecture Score obtained by giving 50% weightage to HSC marks and 50% weightage to valid score for 2017 of National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA);
  - First Year Hotel Management and Catering Technology MAH-B.HMCT-CET 2017 Score.

All these seats are treated as "General Category" seats and no reservation is provided in these seats for Candidates of Backward Class Category, Ladies, Persons with Disability and Defence, etc.

10(3) Minority Quota Seats:- The stages of computerised allotment are as follows,-

**Stage-I:** The seats under minority quota in the minority institution linguistic or religious) shall be allotted to the respective minority candidates.

**Stage-II:** If the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the Maharashtra State candidature Candidates.

**Stage-III:** Further, if the seats remain vacant, they shall be allotted to the All India candidature Candidates.

**10(4) Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature Candidate-** The supernumerary seats for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature Candidates shall be allotted to the eligible candidates as in 5(6), on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit in the entrance test conducted by the appropriate authority and if seats remain vacant on the basis of CET conducted by competent authority.* 

#### a) Application Form Filling, Submission and Admission Centers

The eligible candidate shall fill the Online Application Form, take the printout, upload scanned copies of the required documents and send duly filled in and signed Application Form by speed post/courier/by hand delivery for verification & confirmation to Admission Centre identified for these admissions.

- i. The application should reach on or before the last date as notified. Application received after last date or incomplete application will not be verified and confirmed and name of such candidate will not appear in the merit list prepared for the purpose of CAP.
- ii. The Competent Authority shall publish the provisional Merit List as specified in Rule 8(4).
- iii. The candidates not appeared for CET conducted by competent authority but appeared for any other CET conducted by appropriate authority can also apply, however such candidates are required to pay the Application Fee through payment gateway (Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Net Banking).
- iv. The candidates whose names do not appear in the merit list(s) will not be able to participate in entire Admission Process.

### b) Counselling Round For J and K Migrant Candidates at identified Admission Centre

- i. Candidate seeking admission against these seats shall report to the Admission Centre of Admission Authority for admission as per the schedule.
- ii. The candidates shall produce the documentary evidence strictly as per the Proforma(s) in support of their claims.

- iii. These Admissions will be made strictly in the order of merit from amongst the candidates who report in person for admission at the concerned identified admission centre (as per 10(4)a) as per schedule, against the seats available in the various institutes at the time when the candidate actually reports for admission.
- iv. Admissions once confirmed shall be final and candidate shall not be allowed to seek transfer of their admission to any other institute and/or any other course during entire duration of the course.
- v. The candidates reporting late for the admission shall be considered for allotment against seats which are available at that time. The decision of the admission centre in-charge shall be final and binding.

#### c) Reporting at institutes:

- i. Candidate shall confirm the admission by paying the requisite amount of fee and by submitting required documents in original to respective institute, to which admission is granted as per schedule.
- ii. If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting necessary original documents within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- iii. If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured to some other institution, he or she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the institution where he/she has already taken admission indicating that he/she has been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of the certificates duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. Such candidates shall be required to pay the fees immediately at the time of admission and such candidates shall be permitted to submit the required original certificates within 04 working days after the date of payment of fees.

#### d) Important note

Candidates <u>admitted</u> under this provision are not allowed to change course or college in any year of study.

#### 11. Allotment of seats by CAP Round I, II and III-

- (1) CAP Round I, II and III shall be conducted by computerised allotment.
- (2) In CAP Round I.-
  - (a) For Minority Institutes the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference,-
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:—
    - (i) Stages I and II of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules.

- (3) In CAP Round II.-
  - (a) for Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:-
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I to V of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Stage II of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (iv) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10,
    - (v) Stage III of sub-rule (3) of rule 10 of these rules;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:—
    - (i) Stages I to V of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (4) In CAP Round III.-
  - (a) for Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference:-
    - (i) Stage I of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (ii) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10,
    - (iii) Stage II of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (iv) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10,
    - (v) Stage III of sub-rule (3) of rule 10,
    - (vi) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
  - (b) for other than Minority Institutions, the allotment shall be given to the candidates as per following preference,—
    - (i) Stages I to VIII of sub-rule (1) of rule 10;
    - (ii) Sub-rule (2) of rule 10 of these rules;
    - (iii) Stage IX of sub-rule (1) of rule 10 of these rules.
- (5) If the seat remains vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting, such seat will be considered for allotment in subsequent round.
- (6) Every stage in CAP Round I, II and III shall be executed with HU and OHU tag and if the seats remain vacant then the same stage shall be executed without HU and OHU tag. If further seats remain vacant for any reason in 7(1), 7(2) and 7(3) of these rules they shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates as in 5(1), 5(2) and 5(3) irrespective of the seat type on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit.

#### 12. General provisions.-

- (a) Allotment in CAP Round-I, II and III of Home University Seats, Other than Home University seats and State Level Seats will be carried out as per Inter-Se-Merit of Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature. The seats will be allotted to Candidates as per Inter-Se-Merit, options filled and seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAP Round-I, II and III;
- (b) All Candidates eligible for a particular stage of allotment will be considered for allotment of a seat in that stage, even if they have been allotted or not allotted a seat in the previous stage;
- (c) During the allotment of any stage, the Candidate may get upward shift in the allotment with reference to the options filled by the Candidate according to availability of seats at that point of time;
- (d) There shall not be any reservation under different categories in an Unaided Professional Educational Institution, for allocation of seats stated in 7(2), 7(3), 7(4) and 7(5);
- (e) All reserved Category Candidates (including SBC in their original Category) shall be considered for allotment in all stages;

- (f) Due to upward shifts, the seats falling vacant shall be considered for allotment in further iterations of the same stage as per the provisions of that stage of allotment;
- (g) Allotment against the first available option in the order of preference filled in shall be retained as final allotment;
- (h) The allotment list displayed on website will show the provisional allotment offered to the Candidates. No personal communication or allotment letters in this regard shall be issued to the Candidates;
- (i) A Candidate who has been allotted a seat shall download the "Provisional Seat Allotment Letter". For Seat Acceptance, Candidate has to pay Seat Acceptance Fee through Online Payment (Credit Card / Debit Card/Internet Banking/ etc) or the mode as decided by Competent Authority and shall report to any one of the identified Admission Reporting Centre. (List shall be available on website). Seat will be confirmed by the Admission Reporting Centre after verification of the original documents and ensuring that the candidate meets all the eligibility norms. The centre in-charge shall issue the Online Receipt of acceptance;
- (j) The Seat Acceptance Fee shall be Rs. 5,000/- for Candidates of General Category, VJ/DT, NT, SBC/OBC Category and Rs.1,000/- for SC, ST Category Candidates. The candidate has to pay the Seat Acceptance Fee during first reporting only. This fee shall be transferred electronically to the bank account of the institution, after deducting Rs. 1,000/- towards processing fee, if the Candidate reports to the institution after completion of CAP process which shall be adjusted towards fees to be paid by the Candidate to the institution. The candidate should opt 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' through Login only and submit the duly signed printout to the Reporting Officer. The Officer shall issue the acknowledgement of the Reporting. The candidate can change the options as 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' whenever there is change in the allotted institute and course, however if the candidate do not wish to change the option, previous option shall be carried forward for CAP Round II and/ or III.
- (k) For cancellation of admission before reporting to the institution, the candidate shall apply to the Admission Reporting Center to which he has paid Seat Acceptance Fee. On cancellation of such admission through Online System before reporting to the institution, the amount shall be refunded electronically to the Candidate, after deduction of Rs. 1,000/-towards processing charges.
- (l) Failure to report in person for Seat acceptance will be considered as if the Candidate has rejected the offer;
- (m) Allotted Seat will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document or certificate is found to be invalid or fraudulent and/or the Candidate does not meet the eligibility norms;
- (n) Candidates who want to reject the allocated seat can do so by not remitting the seat acceptance fee at the Admission Reporting Centre in scheduled period. Candidates who reject allocated seat shall be considered for admission in subsequent rounds only if they submit fresh option form for subsequent round of admission as per schedule.
- (o) The seat acceptance fee paid by the candidate shall be forfeited if the Candidate fails to report to the institute after reporting to the ARC, as per schedule.

- **13.** Admissions in Institutional Quota and vacant seats after CAP.- The Director or Principal of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these seats in the following manner. -
  - (a) Admissions shall be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Candidates who have applied to the Competent Authority for verification of documents and then to the Institution.
  - (b) Information brochure or prospectus of the Institution which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institution's website.
  - (c) Institution shall invite applications by notifying schedule of admission and the number of seats in each course to be filled by the institution, by advertisement on the website of the institution and also on the website of the Competent Authority by paying charges as decided by the Competent Authority.
  - (d) Aspiring Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria as notified by the Government and specified by the appropriate authority, from time to time, shall apply to the Principal or Director of the respective institution for admission at the Institution level as provided in rule 3(4)(b) and shall be filled in on the basis of *Inter-Se-Meirt* prepared by following the procedure specified in 8(3).
  - (e) The institution shall display the *Inter-Se- merit* lists of the Candidates to be filled in at the institution level, in the Institutional Quota and Supernumerary Quota of OCI / PIO, Foreign National, Children's of Indian workers in Gulf Countries along with the vacant seats after CAP, on the notice board and shall publish the same on the website of the institution.
  - (f)The Minority or Non-Minority institution intending to surrender the Institutional Quota (in part or full) of specified courses to the CAP shall communicate two days before the display of seat matrix of each CAP Round and the same shall be allotted as per the rules of CAP.
  - (g) All the admissions and cancellations shall be updated instantly through online system.
  - (h) If any CAP seat remains or becomes vacant after the CAP Rounds, then the same shall be filled in by the Candidate from the same Category for which it was earmarked during the CAP. Further if the seats remain vacant then the seats shall be filled on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the applicants.

#### 14:- Institution Level Round

These admissions shall be made at the institute level by inter se merit from among the candidates appeared in the General Merit List and the list of registered and eligible candidate declared by Competent Authority. And admissions for this round will be as per reference rule no.10.1 as applicable

#### 15. Approval of Merit List and the Admitted Candidates List.-

- 15(1) After completion of Admission process every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission- approval proposal to the Director Technical Education and the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the subsection (5) of the section 9 of the Act.
- 15(2) The Admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all Candidates admitted which shall have the quota, Candidature Type, Reservation,

- Qualification Marks, etc as well as the required documents of the Candidates admitted at institution level.
- 15(3) If a minority institution fails to admit minimum Fifty One percent of its Sanctioned Intake from the persons belonging to the concerned minority, for a period of three consecutive years the Competent Authority shall inform the Department accordingly. The Department shall forward such cases along with observations to the Minorities Development Department as per provisions of Subsection (2) of the Section 6 of the Act.

#### 16. Refund of fees after cancellation of admission by Institutions.-

- (a) The Candidate shall apply online for cancellation and submit duly signed copy of system generated application for cancellation of admission to the institution.
- (b) After receiving duly signed admission cancellation request letter from the Candidate as per schedule published by the Competent Authority, the institution shall cancel the admission immediately and generate online acknowledgement of cancellation of admission through institution login and issue a signed copy to the Candidate.
- (c) The refund of fees on or before cut-off date of admission declared by the Competent Authority, shall be made within two days i.e. total fee minus the processing charges of Rs.1,000/-, or refund rule shall be as per the guidelines of the appropriate authorities or the State Government, as the case may be.
- (d) If the admission is cancelled after the cut-off date of the admission declared by the Competent Authority, there shall be no refund except the Security Deposit and Caution Money Deposit.
- (e) No institution, who has in its possession or custody, of any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited with it by a person for the purpose of seeking admission in such institution, shall refuse to return such degree, certificate award or other document with a view to induce or compel such person to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or program of study which such person does not intend to pursue or avail any facility in such institution

#### 17. Change of Course or Institution after First, Second or Third year.

- 17(1)The Candidate seeking for a change in course or shift after successfully completing the First Year of studies or both first and Second Semester examination in full or failed in one of the heads of passing will be allowed to do so in the same institution subject to the availability of sets and changes will be carried out based on the marks of First Year or First and Second Semester together. The Principal shall be responsible for ascertaining the eligibility of the Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;
- 17(2) Transfer of Candidates (Course and/or Institution) after One/ Two/ Three year shall be made in the following manner,-
  - (a) The Candidate once admitted in First Year / Second Year shall not be eligible for transfer to any other institution during the same academic year;

- (b) The Candidate passing the First Year (both first and second semester) or second year (both third and fourth semester) or third year (both fifth and sixth semester) examinations in full or failed in one of the heads of passing are considered as eligible for transfer of Institution or course, provided that for transfer after second year the candidate should have passed the first year, and for transfer after third year the candidate should have passed first and second year;
- (c) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage in any case from Unaided Institutions, to Government or Government Aided Institutions or University Departments or University Managed Institutions. However, the Candidate from Government or Government Aided Institution or University Departments or University Managed Institutions may seek transfer to Unaided Educational Institution;
- (d) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage to Autonomous Institutions:
- (e) Transfer to Unaided Institutions.- The Principals of Unaided institutions shall consider the Candidates from other institutions for transfer with prior approval from the Directorate of Technical Education on submission of No Objection Certificate (NOC) from institution, Eligibility Certificate from University and Vacancy position. The Principal or Director of the institute shall ascertain the eligibility of Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;

Transfer in Government or Government aided Institutions- Eligible Candidates aspiring for a transfer from Government or Government Aided or University Departments and University Managed Institutions to other Government or Government Aided or University Department or University Managed Institutions, shall apply in writing to the Principal/ Director of the institute in which he/she studied first year or second semester. The Principal or Director shall forward the consolidated branch wise merit list of eligible candidates giving details like Name, Course, percentage of Marks, Names of Courses and Institution in order of preference to which candidates desires to seek transfer, reasons for transfer and Remarks, along with course wise vacancy position in institution, to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, so as to reach him as per the schedule given by him. All the Principals of Government and Government Aided Institutions, University Departments, and University Managed Institutions shall submit vacancy position of all courses to the Directorate of Technical Education Mumbai before stipulated date.

- (f) No application without recommendation of the Principal / Director of Institution shall be entertained by the Directorate of Technical Education;
- (g) If the result of the University or Institution is not declared before the process of transfer, Candidates of that University will lose claim on transfer;
- 17(3) The Candidates admitted under Supernumerary Quota seats are not eligible for change of Course or Institution;
- 17(4) The candidates from the professional educational institutions which are outside the purview of the act shall be eligible for transfer to the unaided private professional educational institutions subject to the fulfilment of eligibility criterion and requirements stipulated under the provisions of sub section (1) of section 3 of the Act and the fulfilment of the conditions stated in sub-rule (2).

17(5) List of all such transfers shall be communicated by the Directorate of Technical Education to the office of the Admissions Regulating Authority for final approval.

### 18. Documents to be attached along with "Application Form for Centralized Admission Process".-

The candidates are required to carry **ALL Original Certificates/Documents** in support of their claim at the time of filling up of Application Form for Admission for the scrutiny and verification at identified Facilitation Centre. The candidates are required to scan the document in .jpg or .gif format ( minimum 150 dpi resolution, file size upto 1 MB) and upload the scanned copies of the required documents at the time of filling up Application Form for Admission. **The Facilitation Center shall assist the candidate, free of cost, to scan and upload the documents**.

#### 19. Miscellaneous provisions

#### a) Conduct and Discipline

- (i) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct Statements in the application form and/or suppression of any information and/or submission of false documents shall lead to disqualification of the candidate from the examination or at later stage during the Admission Process such candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.
- (ii) Adopting any unfair means or engaging in malpractice in the examination shall render a candidate liable for punishment under, "Maharashtra Prevention of Malpractices Act, Universities, Board and Other Specified Examination Act, 1982" and disqualify him/her for examination.
- (iii) Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority.
- (iv) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Government takes any policy decision pertaining to admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect from that point of time as per the directives from the Government from time to time.
- (v) Students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.

- **b) Action against ragging**: Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 and Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging (Appendix 12 published in AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2011-12) and their amendments which may be published from time to time. The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 is in effect from 15th May, 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.
- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited,
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty, which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is located, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that prima facie there is no substance, in the complaint received; he / she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final.
- e) If the Head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above.
- f) Undertaking from the candidate shall be taken while admitting the candidate in the Institute.
- g) Any Acts or its amendments which may be published from time to time by AICTE, Government or Judgments by Hon. Supreme Court of India, Hon. High Court of Bombay etc will be applicable to Candidates and Institutions covered under these rules of admission.
- h) If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied or any certificate(s) submitted by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal/Director. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be sent within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final. Such candidates are also liable for penal action as per the provisions in the law.

#### c) Others:

- (i) The medium of instruction for degree courses is English.
- (ii) The candidates are advised to ensure before applying that he/she is eligible for admission to the program as per the prevailing eligibility norms of the University. Admission of candidate will be treated as finally confirmed only on production of the Eligibility Certificate from the University to which the college is affiliated.

- (iii) Physical fitness: Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action.
- (iv) The Head of the institution shall have the right to satisfy himself about the conduct and character of a candidate by verifying the antecedents of a candidate through the appropriate police-authority, before admitting him / her to the college / institution.

#### d) Hostel accommodation:

Accommodation in Hostel cannot be guaranteed to the admitted candidates. All the Candidates are advised to personally verify the availability of Hostel, Hostel fees payable etc. from the Director/Principal of the college to which they intend to take admission. The Director/Principal of the colleges shall consider on priority the applications of Persons with Disability candidates, Sons and Daughters of Jammu and Kashmir migrant candidates and Government of India nominees for Hostel accommodation.

## For the Academic Year 2016-17

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### 1. Introduction,-

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. XXVIII of 2015), the Government of Maharashtra has notified the rules to regulate the admissions to the First and Direct Second Year of Full Time Professional Undergraduate Technical Courses (Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Pharm D., Architecture, Hotel Management and Catering Technology). These rules are called the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions to the Full Time Professional Undergraduate Technical Courses) Rules, 2016. This brochure gives information regarding the eligibility and rules of admission for these courses to first year of various technical professional undergraduate degree courses in the State of Maharashtra. This also provides information about invitation of applications for admission, preparation of merit list, distribution of seats, details of reservation, various rounds and stages of Centralised Admission Process (CAP), admissions in Institutional Quota seats and vacant seats after CAP, supernumerary seats, refund of fees, etc.

These rules are also applicable for admissions in Government and Government Aided professional educational institutions vide Government Resolution of Higher & Technical Education Department No. TEM-2016/CR 536/TE-4 Dated 15th March 2016.

#### 2. Definitions.-

- (a) "Act" means the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions and Fees) Act, 2015 (Mah. Act XXVIII of 2015):
- (b) "Admission Reporting Centre" means a centre where the Candidate shall report for confirmation of admission by submission of documents and payment of fees;
- (c) "All India Seats" means seats available to an eligible Indian National Candidate;
- (d) "Application Form" means prescribed form filled up online by the Candidate for admission;
- (e) "Autonomous Institution" means the institution to which autonomy is granted by the University Grants Commission;
- (f) "CAP Seats" means the seats filled in through the centralized process of admission carried out by the Competent Authority;
- (g) "Competent Authority" means the Commissioner of State CET appointed by the Government under section 10, for conducting CET through CAP for the admissions into Private Professional Educational Institutions;
- (h) "Courses" means the undergraduate technical courses in Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture and Hotel Management and Catering Technology;
- (i) "Eligible Candidates" means the candidates who are eligible for different professional courses as notified by the Government, from time to time under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act;
- (j) "Facilitation Centre" means a centre where the facilities like sale of application kits, filling online forms, verification of documents and

- grievances, etc, are provided;
- (k) "Home University (HU)" means the university area as specified in rule 5(1)herein:
- (1) "HSC" means the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Boards;
- (m) "Institutional Quota" means seats available for admission to eligible Candidates at Institution level as declared by the Government or appropriate authority from time to time;
- (n) "Inter-Se-Merit" means the order of merit in respect of various classes/category of Candidates;
- (o) "JEE Main" means the Joint Entrance Examination conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi for the concerned academic year;
- (p) "Minority Quota" means seats earmarked for the Minority Community students from within the State, belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs;
- (q) "Non-Autonomous Institution" means those institutions which are not 'Autonomous Institutions';
- (r) "Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)" means a candidate/person registered as an Overseas Citizenship of India as declared by the Central Government under section 7A of the Citizenship Act 1955 and includes Persons of Indian Origin (PIO).

Explanation: For the purposes of this clause, all the existing Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders registered under notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs No. F. No. 26011/04/98- F. I dated 19th August 2002 and shall now be deemed to be Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) card holders by virtue of Notification of Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, No. 25024/9/2014-F.I. Dated 9th January, 2015;

- (s) "OHU" means the area Outside Home University area;
- (t) "Qualifying Examination" means examinations on the basis of which a candidate becomes eligible for admission or its equivalent examination;
- (u) "SSC" means the Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) examination conducted by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent certificate awarded by a recognised Boards;
- (v) "Supernumerary Seats" means seats which are over and above the Sanctioned Intake approved by the appropriate authority and the Government, from time to time:
- (w) "TFWS" means Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme.
- 3. Invitation of Application. The Candidates seeking admissions to the professional courses for the seats provided in -
  - (a) 7(1)-Maharashtra State Candidature Seats,7(2)- All India Candidature Seats, 7(3)- Minority Quota Seats and 7(5)(b)- Supernumerary Seats for Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature- For these seats the candidates shall apply to the Competent Authority for admission through Centralised Admission Process(CAP).

- (b) 7(4)- Institutional Quota Seats- For these seats the candidates shall first/initially apply to the Competent Authority, who shall prepare Merit List of all such applicants, to enable the institutions to give admissions to such applicants on the basis of inter-se merit, as specified by the appropriate authority.
- (c) 7(4)- Institutional Quota Seats and 7(5)(a) Supernumerary Seats for OCI/ PIO, Foreign Students and the children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries Candidates - For these seats the candidates after applying to the Competent Authority shall thereafter apply to the concerned institution for admission at Institution level and the Institution shall give admission on the basis of inter-se merit in the Merit List prepared by the Competent Authority. It is pre-requisite and mandatory to apply to the Competent Authority to be eligible for admission under this quota.

The Candidate should submit the necessary Certificates issued by the concerned Appropriate Authority, along-with the application, in the given Proforma. The list of documents to be submitted is given in 18 of this Information Brochure.

### 4. Role of Competent Authority and its representatives in the process of Admission.-

- a) The Competent Authority, the Commissioner of State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra State, shall be the authority for Centralised Admission Process and shall direct the students as per their allotment through CAP to all institutions i.e. Government, Government Aided, University Department, University Managed Colleges, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University, Lonere (BATU) & Institute of Chemical Technology (ICT), Mumbai and Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions.
- b) The Competent Authority shall deal with the representations received from the candidates pertaining to allotment and admissions as Grievance Redressal Authority.
- All the decisions taken in relation to Admission to First/ Direct Second Year of courses, by the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all concerned

### 4.1 Jurisdiction of the Universities:

The following table shows the details about the Home Universities in Maharashtra State along with their Head Quarters and their Jurisdiction.

The Director, Technical Education shall act as a Nodal Officer to carry out the admissions under the supervision & control of the Competent Authority.

- **5(2) All India Candidature.**-The Candidates having Indian Nationality are eligible under this Category.
- **5(3) Minority Candidature.-** The Maharashtra domiciled Candidate belonging to a particular Linguistic or Religious Minority Community from within the State and as notified by the Government are eligible under this Category.
- **5(4) NRI Candidature.**-The Candidate who fulfils the conditions as defined in clause (n) of section 2 of the Act are eligible under this Category.
- **5(5) Foreign Student or OCI or PIO Candidature.** The Foreign Student Candidates, as defined in clause (i) of section 2 of the Act, the Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) candidate, as defined under clause (q) of rule-2 and Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) as defined in clause (o) of Section 2 of the Act are eligible under this Category.

### 5(6) Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature.-

- (a) The children of citizens, who are displaced from Jammu and Kashmir to any part of India or from unsafe border area of Jammu and Kashmir to a relatively safer place in Jammu and Kashmir from 1990 onwards due to terrorist activities; or
- (b) The children of officers belonging to Indian Administrative Services (IAS) or Indian Police Services (IPS) or Indian Foreign Services (IFS) and children of staff belonging to military and paramilitary forces transferred to Jammu and Kashmir to combat terrorist activities and joined the post on or before the last date for submission of application for admission; or

- (c) The children of staff and officers of Jammu and Kashmir police engaged in combating terrorism are eligible under this category;
- 6. Sanctioned Intake and Supernumerary Seats for various Courses.-
- 6(1) The Sanctioned Intake for First Year Degree Course, Direct Second Year (Lateral entry) and Direct Second Year separate division Degree Courses shall be as per the approval given by the authority which is competent for giving approval to respective courses and affiliation given by the respective affiliating University before cut-off date as laid down for that year.

The Institute Information, Courses and the Sanctioned Intake displayed on the web site of the Competent Authority shall be treated as authentic for admissions for the year 2016-17. Candidates shall refer the web site for the revised and final Institute Information before filling the Option/Preference Form.

For admission to Direct Second Year (Lateral entry), the number of seats available shall be calculated as given in **Schedule - II**.

- **6(2)** The supernumerary seats shall be available to the Institutions as approved by the appropriate authority, from time to time.
- 7. Allocation of Seats. The percentage of allocation of seats for various types of candidates in the Home University, Other than Home University and State Level shall be in accordance with the policy of the Government as specified in **Schedule-I** for First Year and **Schedule-II** for Direct Second Year of various Under Graduate Courses.
- **7(1) Maharashtra State Candidature Seats.-** The Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature as specified in 5(1), shall be eligible for these seats.
- **7(2) All India Candidature Seats.**-The Candidates having Candidature as given in 5(2) shall be eligible for these seats.
- **7(3) Minority Quota Seats.-**The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in 5(3) shall be eligible for these seats as specified in **Schedule-I** and **Schedule-II**. These seats shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 6, of the Act.
- **7(4) Institutional Quota Seats.-** The Institution can admit Eligible Candidates against 20 % of the Sanctioned Intake, subject to following conditions.-
  - (i) The Candidates having Candidature mentioned in 5(1), 5(2) 5(3), 5(4) and 5(6) shall be eligible for these seats;
  - (ii) The maximum 5% seats may be filled in from the NRI Candidates, if it is approved by the Appropriate Authority, at the Institution level.
  - (iii) If the seats reserved for NRI quota remains vacant, those vacant seats may be filled in by the Institution, from the Eligible Candidates of All India Candidature;

Provided that while filling these vacant seats the preference shall be given to the Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit*.

### 7(5) Supernumerary Seats for,-

## (a) OCI/ PIO, Foreign Students and the children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries (CIWGC) Candidates.-

- (i) The Candidates having candidature as given in 5(5) and the children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries shall be eligible for these supernumerary seats.
- (ii) These seats shall be subject to the maximum of 15% of the Sanctioned Intake seats or as prescribed by the appropriate authority, from time to time. Out of 15% seats, one third shall be reserved for the children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries and two third seats shall be reserved for OCI / PIO or Foreign Students candidates.
- (iii) These seats shall be filled in by the institution on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of candidates as given in 8.
- (iv) Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Foreign Nationals/ PIOs/Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries/ Child or Ward of NRI shall send their applications to The Director, College of Engineering, Shivaji Nagar, Pune-411005.

### (b) Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature:

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The Candidates having candidature as given in 5(6) shall be eligible for these seats.
- (ii) The number of seats for this quota shall be as per the policy of the Government.

### (c) Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) Seats:

### (I) Scheme

- (i) These seats shall be filled in by the Competent Authority.
- (ii) The scheme shall be mandatory for all Technical Institutions offering Bachelor programs and lateral entry (Separate Division) to these programs that are approved by the All India Council for Technical Education.
- (iii) Seats up to maximum 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and will be available to such courses in an Institute where a minimum of 30% of sanctioned seats in the respective courses are filled up in respective CAP Round. For calculation of 30%, the Institutional Quota seats retained by institute for the course shall be considered as completely filled.
- (iv) The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the State Level Fee Regulation Authority for unaided Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other fee except tuition fees shall be paid by the beneficiary.
- (v) The Candidates admitted under this scheme shall not be allowed to change Institution/course at any stage under any circumstances.
- (vi) These seats shall be available for admission to First Year of Engineering & Technology and Hotel Management & Catering Technology courses as well as in Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology (Separate Division).

### (II) Eligibility

(i) Only Maharashtra State Candidature candidates are eligible for these seats

(ii) Eligible Maharashtra State Candidates having their parent's annual income less than Rs.6.00 Lakhs from all sources shall only be eligible for these seats. The candidate shall submit Income certificate issued by Appropriate Authority.

### (III) Admissions Procedure

These seats are allotted by the Competent Authority as per inter-se merit. For this purpose the Competent Authority shall invite applications, prepare a separate merit list for this category by following the same criteria as for Maharashtra State Candidature Candidates. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.

### (d) Jammu and Kashmir Candidates and North East States:

- (i) The admission to the candidates as per *Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS)* for the students belonging to Jammu and Kashmir Candidates and the scheme of Government of India of allocation of supernumerary seats in AICTE approved colleges to North Eastern States and UTs (NEUT) which lack in such facilities of technical education shall be done by the competent authority appointed by the Central Government as per their eligibility criteria.
- (ii) The Fees shall be as that of for the Non Autonomous Government Institutes.

### 7(6) Reservations:

All the reservations given below shall be applicable to **candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only** subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities from time to time.

### (a) Reservation for Backward Class category Candidates:

The percentage of seats reserved for candidates of backward class categories belonging to Maharashtra State is as given below. The percentage of reservation is the percentages of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates, coming under the CAP. Backward class candidates shall claim the category to which they belong to at the time of submission of application form for CAP.

### (b) Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five percent (5%) seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institute, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats in each institute coming under CAP shall be reserved for Children of ex- service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1), Children of active service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2), Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) Who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State, or Who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

- (i) These seats are within the sanctioned intake and are available as **State Level seats**.
- (ii) A combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 and DEF3 candidates shall be prepared.
- (iii) Candidates claiming these seats shall produce additional documents in Proforma C, D and/or E as applicable.
- (iv) This provision is NOT available to the children of **CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working /who has worked in the Indian Defence Service.

### (c) Reservation for Persons with Disability Candidate:

Three percent (3%) seats of total sanctioned intake of all the Institutions under CAP shall be reserved for Candidates with Disability.

- (i) 1% seats for Visually impaired (blind) candidates (P1),
- (ii) 1% seats for Speech & hearing impaired (deaf & dumb) candidates (P2),
- (iii) 1% seats for Orthopedic disorders, learning disabilities, Dyslexia, Dyscalculia, Dysgraphica, Spastic (P3)

The allotment of seats reserved for the Candidates with Disability shall be done on the basis of an inter-se merit of respective type of handicap of such candidates. These seats are available in HU / SL seats for Maharashtra domiciled candidates.

The candidates claiming reservation under this category shall submit the certificates strictly as per the Proforma– F/F-1.

### Note:-

Candidates with Disability should note that on admission to degree course they will not be given any exemptions or additional facility in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the respective Universities.

#### (a) Eligibility criteria for Candidates belonging to Persons with Disability:

Female candidates are not eligible for admission to Mining Engineering course.

#### 8. Preparation of Merit List.-

- **8(1) Assignment of merit number.** All the eligible Candidates who have submitted Application Form on or before the last date specified for the submission of Application Form for Admission through CAP shall be assigned a merit number. The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of score obtained by adding CET score.
- **8(2)** Change of Marks due to verification. If the marks in the qualifying examination are modified due to verification and the same is duly certified by the concerned Competent Authority or Board, the same shall be reported to the Competent Authority for admission through CAP or its designated representatives immediately. However the effect of such change will be taken into consideration only for the subsequent round (s) of admission.
- **8(3)** Method of calculating marks at qualifying examination for deciding eligibility. While deciding the eligibility of the Candidates following procedure shall be adopted,-
  - (a) The percentage of marks shall be calculated by rounding off to two places after decimal and if the percentage of marks comes out to be 44.50% to 44.99% then it shall be rounded to 45% and if the percentage of marks comes out to be 44.01% to 44.49% shall be rounded to 44% for deciding the eligibility.
  - (b) In case the maximum marks in an individual subject is other than 100, convert the marks out of 100 for individual subject without rounding, If sum of the converted marks of individual subjects without rounding off works out to be a figure with fraction then fraction up to two decimal places shall only be considered for calculation of percentage of marks considering maximum marks as 300 and, If the percentage comes in fraction, then rounding off shall be done as above to decide the eligibility.
  - (c) If letter grades are assigned at SSC, HSC, Diploma, Bachelor of Science or its equivalent examination, the Candidate must submit the certificate of conversion of letter grades into equivalent marks from the concerned Competent Authority or Board at the time of submission of Application Form. The eligibility shall be decided on the basis of equivalent marks.
  - (d) If the Candidate reappears for the qualifying examination with all subjects then the marks obtained in the latest examination shall only be considered.

#### 8(4) Assignment of Merit Number for various Courses.-

(a) For admission to First Year Engineering and Technology.-

(i)The merit list for the Candidates at 5(1), 5(2), 5(3) and 5(6), shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score secured by the Candidate in the CET conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses.

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below,-

- (a) higher marks in Mathematics at CET;
- (b) higher marks in Physics at CET;
- (c) higher percentage of marks in Board or qualifying examination for Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry taken together;
- (d) higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics at HSC;
- (e) higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- (f) higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.
- (ii) The merit list for the NRI /OCI / PIO and Foreign Students Candidates stated at 5(4) and 5(5) shall be prepared on the basis of the percentage of marks in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together at Qualifying examination:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of Candidates shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below,-

- (a) higher percentage of marks in Board or qualifying examination for Physics, Mathematics and Chemistry taken together;
- (b) higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics at HSC;
- (c) higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC;
- (d) higher percentage of marks in Aggregate at HSC.

(b) For admission to Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology.-

The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained by the Candidate, on the basis of which Diploma / Degree is awarded by the examining authority:

Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below,-

- (a) higher percentage of marks in SSC;
- (b) higher percentage of marks in Mathematics at SSC;
- (c) higher percentage of marks in Science at SSC;

#### (d) higher percentage of marks in English at SSC. (c) For Admission The merit list for the Candidates at 5(1), 5(2), 5(3) and First Year 5(6) shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score Pharmacy.secured by the Candidate in the CET conducted by the Competent Authority or marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses. Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below,-(a) higher marks in Mathematics or Biology at CET; (b) higher marks in Physics at CET; (c) higher percentage marks of Mathematics and Chemistry added together at Board or qualifying examination; (d) higher percentage of marks in the subject Mathematics or Biology at HSC; (e) higher percentage of marks in the subject Physics at HSC; higher percentage of marks in aggregate in HSC. (d) For Admission The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of marks to Direct Second obtained by the Candidate on the basis of which Diploma Year Pharmacy.is awarded by the examining authority: Provided that, in case of tie, the relative merit of different Candidatures shall be resolved in the following order of preference and the methodology as specified below.-(a) higher percentage of marks in Physics at HSC; (b) higher percentage of marks in Chemistry at HSC; (c) higher percentage of marks in SSC; (d) higher percentage of marks in Science at SSC First Year (i) The merit list for the Candidates at 5(1), 5(2), 5(3) and (e) 5(6) shall be prepared on the basis of marks or score Hotel Management and secured by the Candidate in the CET conducted by the Catering Competent Authority (MAH-B.HMCT-CET-2016) or Technology.marks or score secured in any other examination conducted by the concerned appropriate authority for the purpose of admission to these Courses. #### 9. Centralised Admission Process (CAP).-

**9** (1) The Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall admit Candidates through the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) as referred in sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Act. The Government, Government Aided and University Department shall also admit the candidates through CAP. The stages of CAP shall be as stated below,-

- (a) Display or Publishing of Information Brochure by the Competent Authority. The Information Brochure shall be published on the website of the Competent Authority and the hard copy shall also be provided to candidates on producing the original Hall Ticket of the CET conducted by Competent Authority or at the time of purchasing the Application Kit for Admission.
- (b) Filling Online Application Form by Candidate for participation in the Centralised Admission Process.
  - (i) For First Year Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Pharm D., Hotel management & Catering Technology: All the aspiring candidates shall fill in the Online Application Form for admission through their login which is provided to them at the time of applying to the Common Entrance Test conducted for that course. For admissions to first year Engineering and Technology, the eligible candidates aspiring for admission on the basis of JEE (Main) Paper 1 (who could not register for MHT-CET 2016) should apply, by paying required fees, through CAP under All India Seats or to be eligible for admission under Institutional Quota seats.
  - (ii) For First and Direct Second Year Engineering and Technology and Pharmacy and First Year Architecture: The eligible candidates are required to purchase the Application Kit from the nearest Facilitation Centre on payment in Cash as given below -

- (iii) The Application Kit is Non Transferable and amount is Non refundable.
- (iv) The candidate should read the information brochure carefully
- (v) The candidate should fill the Online Application Form as per the

- notified schedule for respective admission.
- (vi) The list of the Facilitation Centers shall be published on the website. The Facilitation center shall facilitate the candidate to fill the Online Application Form, scan and upload the required documents without any charges.
- (vii) The Candidates will also be able to fill in Online Application Form and upload the scanned copies of the required documents through any computer connected to internet from home, cybercafé.
- (viii) Candidates are required to fill in all the details as per the instructions.
- (ix) After filling the information and submission of Application Form, the Candidates shall verify the data filled and correct it if required. The candidate shall take printout of the form and sign it.
- (x) The Printout of form shall have list of documents required to be produced by the candidate for substantiating his claim made in the application form.
- (xi) Candidate can edit/update the information in his application form before he confirms it at any of the Facilitation Centre.
- (c) Confirmation of Online Application Form and Document Verification at Facilitation Centre by the Candidate in person;
  - (i) The Candidates shall report to any convenient Facilitation Centre in person along with signed printout of application form filled online and the required original documents for verification.
  - (ii) The Facilitation Centre In-charge shall verify the information from the original copies of required documents and collect the duly signed application.
  - (iii) The Facilitation Centre In-charge shall confirm candidate's Application Form through online system and issue the Receipt cum Acknowledgement of Application Form.

### (iv) After confirmation of application form information cannot be changed by candidate.

- (d) Display or Publishing of Provisional merit list, Submission of grievances, if any, and Display or Publishing of Final Merit Lists;
  - i. Provisional Merit List of eligible candidates will be displayed on the website.
  - ii. For discrepancy if any, in the provisional merit list, Candidates can submit the grievances in written along with required document at Facilitation Centre where candidate has confirmed application form within the specified grievance period given in the schedule.
  - iii. No document shall be accepted to substantiate the claim made in application after scheduled dates.
  - iv. Final merit lists will be displayed on the website.

#### NOTE: - The merit list gives relative position of the candidate and it does not guarantee admission to any course.

- (e) Display of available Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) for CAP Rounds I-The competent authority shall publish the information about institutes, courses offered, Sanctioned intake and number of seats available for each category before each round.
- (f) Filling up and Confirmation of Online Option Form having preferences of Courses and Institutions before CAP Round I - Candidates may fill in maximum 300 choices of Institutes and Courses in decreasing order of their preference. The Option Form once confirmed by the Candidate through their login shall be considered for allotment in CAP Round I, II and III:
  - In order to participate in the CAP (subject to fulfillment of the eligibility criterion of respective CAP round), it is MANDATORY to fill the Online Option Form for CAP Round I.
  - Candidates will be able to fill in the online option form through (ii) their login.
  - (iii) It is mandatory for all candidates to confirm the online option form by himself / herself.
  - (iv) After confirmation of Option form, the candidate will not be able to change the Options.
  - Candidates should not disclose their Application ID & Password to others to avoid impersonation. Competent Authority shall not be responsible for submissions done by others on behalf of the candidate. For Security reasons, candidates are instructed to keep changing the password and keep note of it in secured place.
  - (vi) The serial number of block in the option form indicates preference of choice. Thus the choice code of the institute filled by the candidate in block No. 1 will be his/her first preference (Highest Priority Choice).
  - (vii) Option form received through online submission only will be considered for further processing.
  - (viii) Candidate shall confirm the submitted on-line Option Form himself/herself by re-entering Application ID and Password. The candidate can take a printout of the confirmed Option form for his record and future reference
  - (ix) The candidate can fill in minimum 1 and maximum 300 options. The candidate shall fill the institute choice code against the option number in the online option form.
- (g) Display of Provisional Allotment of CAP Round I indicating allotted institute and Course.
- (h) Reporting and accepting the offered seat as per the allotment of the CAP Round I by the Candidate at Admission Reporting Centre.
- (i) Display of available Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) for CAP Rounds II-
- (j) Display of Provisional Allotment of CAP Round II indicating allotted institute and Course.
- (k) Reporting and accepting the offered seat as per the allotment of the CAP Round II by the Candidate at Admission Reporting Centre.
- (1) Display of available Category wise Seats (Seat Matrix) for CAP Rounds III-
- (m) Display of Provisional Allotment of CAP Round III indicating allotted institute and Course.

- (n) Reporting and accepting the offered seat as per the allotment of the CAP Round III, by the Candidate at Admission Reporting Centre.
- **9 (2)** During the CAP, before accepting the allotted seat in Round I, II and III, a Candidate can select the choice of 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' for subsequent round(s), if any, of seat allocation, as provided below,-
  - (a) **Freeze:** Candidates accept the offered seat and they do not want to participate in any further rounds of seat allocation. Such Candidates will not be considered in subsequent rounds of admission;
  - (b) **Slide:** Candidates accept the offered seat and indicate that, if admission to the academic program of higher preference is offered within the same Institution, they will accept it. Such Candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of admission;
  - (c) **Float:** Candidates accept the offered seat and indicate that, if admission to an academic program of higher preference in any Institution is offered, they will accept it. Else, they will continue with the currently accepted academic program. Such Candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of admission;
  - (d) Candidate should select the reporting option as 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' through their login.
  - (e) If candidate gets better choice in CAP Round II and /or III, Candidate may change the reporting option as 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' through their login, otherwise earlier option will be carried forward.
  - (f) For Candidates who choose the Float or Slide option, and secures a seat of his choice of higher preference, then it would automatically result in the forfeiture of the seat accepted by the Candidate in the earlier round;
  - (g) Sliding and Floating options will not be available to a Candidate who is offered admission to his first choice.
  - (h) If a candidate fails to report for the acceptance of allotted seat at Admission Reporting Center in scheduled time, It will be treated as if he has rejected the allotted seat and such candidate shall not be eligible for CAP Round II and / or III. However such candidates will be able to participate in CAP Round IV.

#### 9(3) Conduct of CAP Round-IV.-

- (a) The seats available for this round shall be published on the website. The Candidates are allowed to fill in or edit the already filled online option form. The seats to be allotted during this round shall be subject to following conditions.-
  - (i) Before start of this round, the Candidates can change their option from Sliding or Floating to Freezing or vice-versa;
  - (ii) Following candidates will be considered eligible for this round;
    - a. The Candidates who have not been allotted any seat in any of the previous rounds or not participated by the way of not filling the Option form in CAP Round I; or
    - b. Those who have taken and cancelled their admission in the earlier rounds; or
    - c. Those who have rejected the offered seat by not reporting to the Admission Centre; or
    - d. Those who have Freezed the admission in earlier rounds but are desirous of changing the option to Floating or Sliding in

this final round.

- (iii) Candidates who have opted for Floating and Sliding and also applying for this round shall fill in the allotted institution in their choice list. Once the upward allotment is made the earlier allotment automatically stands cancelled;
- (iv) Sliding and Floating options are not available for the seats allotted in this round as it is final CAP Round.
- (b) Reporting and accepting the offered seat as per the allotment of the CAP Round IV by the Candidate at Admission Reporting Centre.
- **9(4) Reporting and confirmation of admission.** After final CAP Round, the Candidate shall report to the institution finally allotted to him and confirm his/her admission in the institution.

#### 9(5) Fees and Concessions:

#### (a) Fees Prescribed for Government and Government Aided Institutes:

As per the Government Resolution No. TEM-2003/(249/03)/TE-1, dated 11th September 2003, has decided the tuition fee, development fee and other fees per year for Government, Government Aided, University Managed Colleges and University Departments. As per the policy of State Government, the fees for Government, Government Aided Autonomous Institutes is raised by 10% every year after grant of autonomous status to the institute. Accordingly the fee structure for the academic year 2016-17 shall be as follows.

#### **Important Notes:**

- 1. No tuition fee for SC/ST/VJ/DT NT(A)/NT(B)/NT(C)/NT(D)/SBC/OBC category and for candidates admitted under TFWS.
- 2. In case the Government revises the fees for the Government institutes for the year 2016-17, then the admitted candidates will be required to pay the difference in fees as per the Government order.
- 3. The Department of Technology, Shivaji University offers courses on Self Financing basis, and hence the fees shall be as per the Fees approved by Appropriate Authority.

#### (b) Fees prescribed in Unaided Private Professional Educational Institutes:

The Adhoc/Interim fee structure shall be as approved by the Fee Regulating Authority established under the Act. The final fee approved and published by the Fee Regulating Authority for that year shall be the fee payable by the candidate for that course for that academic year.

### (c) Details of Concession in fees for Backward Class Category Candidates (belonging to Maharashtra State only)

These candidates will get only that amount of waiver as notified in the circulars issued by the Government Department from time to time, subject to fulfillment of norms and conditions laid down by these Departments.

Candidates claiming fee concession under various categories shall produce the requisite certificates as may be specified by the respective Government Departments.

# (d) Fees for Jammu & Kashmir Migrant Candidates and North East and Union Territory Candidates admitted by appropriate authority:

These candidates shall pay the fees as applicable to the Non Autonomous Government institutes (as given in 9(5)(a)). Candidates shall also pay additional fees as prescribed by the concerned University from time to time.

#### (e) Caution Money Deposits:

Caution money deposit received from the students shall be refunded after successful completion of the course or after canceling the admission. Unless there is any recovery, no deduction shall be made from the caution money deposit. However, if candidate does not apply for refund, within 3 complete financial years after the student actually leaves the institution; or, within 3 complete financial years after the date of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier the amount of caution money deposit shall be transferred to Students Aid Fund in case of Un-Aided/Autonomous colleges and credited to Government in case of Government and Government-Aided Non Autonomous Colleges.

**10. CAP allotment stages and process of allotment.** Allotment of seats under CAP shall be made in the following manner,-

#### 10(1) Maharashtra State Candidature Candidate.-

(1) The stages of computerised allotment are as follows,-

#### Stage -I: For all the Candidates.-

- (a) All the Candidates (Open, Reserved, Male, Female, Tuition Fee Waiver) belonging to various categories shall be considered for allotment of seats as per their *Inter-Se-*Merit.
- (b) The Minority Quota seats shall be allotted to the Candidates of the State belonging to the Minority Community to which the institution belongs by virtue of merit or in Open Category as per their *Inter-Se-Merit* if the seats reserved for them are not available at their merit.
- (c) Backward Class Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category seat by virtue of their *Inter-Se-Merit* or in their respective Category of reservation, if Open Category seats are not available at their merit.
- (d) SBC Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment in Open Category by virtue of their merit and in case of SBC Candidates who were

- in Backward Class prior to their inclusion in SBC Category shall be considered in their original Backward Class Category.
- (e) Persons with Disability Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them otherwise in Open Category as per their *Inter-Se-Merit* if the seats reserved for them are not available at their merit.
- (f) Defence Category Candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them by virtue of their merit or in Open Category as per their *Inter-Se-Merit* if the seats reserved for them are not available at their merit.
- (g) The TFWS seat shall be allotted to the eligible Candidate only to such course in an Institute where a minimum of 30 % of sanctioned seats in the respective course are allotted.
- <u>Stage II</u>: For allotment of seats reserved for Female to Male Candidates.- If the seat remains vacant after allotment to Female Candidates of the Backward Class Category or Open Category, such seat shall be allotted to the Male Candidates belonging to respective Backward Class or Open Category.
- <u>Stage -III</u>: For SBC Category Candidates.-If the Backward Class Category seat remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates of SBC Category, limited to the extent of 2% seats.
- <u>Stage -IV</u>: For respective groups of Backward Class Category Candidates.- If the seat remains vacant in the respective group of following Categories, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidates of within the respective group,-
  - **Group 1**: (i) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Castes converted to Buddhism (SC),
    - (ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside the specified areas (ST).
  - **Group 2**: (i) Vimukta Jatis/De- Notified Tribes (VJ/DT),NT(A), (ii)Nomadic Tribes 1 (NT-B).
  - **Group 3**: (i) Nomadic Tribes 2 (NT-C),
    - (ii) Nomadic Tribes 3 (NT-D),
    - (iii) Other Backward Class (OBC).

<u>Explanation.</u>- For Group 1, if the seat remains vacant in ST Category due to non-availability of its Candidates, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate belonging to the SC Category or vice versa.

- <u>Stage-V</u>: For all Backward Class Category Candidates.-If the seat reserved for Backward Class Category Candidate remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to the Candidate of any Backward Class Category.
- <u>Stage -VI</u>: For Persons with Disability Candidates.-If the seat reserved for Persons with Disability remains vacant, such seat shall be considered for allotment to any Persons with Disability Candidates.
- <u>Stage -VII</u>: For all Candidates (without HU and OHU Seat Tag).-If the seat remains vacant after completion of Stage -VI then for allotment of such vacant seats, Stage-I, Stage-II, Stage-IV, Stage-V and Stage VI shall be executed by removing the HU and OHU Seat Tag.

#### Stage -VIII: For all Candidates (without any type of Reservation).-

(i) The seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit*.

(ii) In case of Direct Admission to Second Year (Lateral Entry) of Engineering and Technology: If the seats remain vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to all the Diploma Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit* and further, if the seats remain vacant such seats shall be filled in on the basis of *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Bachelor of Science Candidates.

<u>Stage -IX</u>: For First year Engineering admission to Diploma and Bachelor of Science Candidates.-After completion of stage VIII, If the seats remains vacant then such seats shall be considered for allotment to the Diploma Candidates based on *Inter-Se-Merit* of CET and further, if the seats remain vacant such seats shall be considered for allotment to the Bachelor of Science Candidates on *Inter-Se-Merit* of CET.

- (2) In addition to above while allotting a seat for Direct Second Year of Engineering (Lateral Entry) and separate division, seat shall be allotted as follows,-
  - (i) The seat of Degree Course shall be allotted to the Candidate having same sub-group Diploma Course;
  - (ii) Vacant seats, if any, shall be allotted to the Candidate having the same main group Diploma Course.
  - (iii) If further seats remains vacant, it shall be allotted to the Candidate having any other Diploma Course.

The Groups and Subgroups are given in Schedule III.

- (3) For seats reserved for Female Candidate, the procedure for reservation as given in Government Circular of General Administration Department No. RSV 1012/CN-16/12/16A Dated 13th August 2014 shall be adopted.
- **10(2) All India Candidature Candidates** The allotment to these seats shall be done through CAP on the basis of score of ,-
  - (a) First Year Engineering MHT-CET 2016 score and then if the seats remains vacant, on the basis of JEE (Main) 2016 -Paper 1;
  - (b) First Year Pharmacy and Pharm. D. MHT-CET 2016 Score;
  - (c) First Year Architecture Score obtained by giving 50% weightage to HSC marks and 50% weightage to valid score for 2016 of National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA);
  - (d) First Year Hotel Management and Catering Technology MAH-B.HMCT-CET 2016 Score.

All these seats are treated as "General Category" seats and no reservation is provided in these seats for Candidates of Backward Class Category, Ladies, Persons with Disability and Defence, etc.

#### 10(3) Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Candidature Candidate-

#### a) Application Form Filling and Submission

The eligible candidate shall fill the Online Application Form, take the printout, upload scanned copies of the required documents and send duly filled in and signed Application Form by speed post/courier/by hand delivery for verification & confirmation to Admission Centre identified for these admissions.

The Director, Sardar Patel College of Engineering(SPCE), Versova Road, Munshi Nagar, Andheri (West), Mumbai-400 058

- i. The application should reach on or before the last date as notified. Application received after last date or incomplete application will not be verified and confirmed and name of such candidate will not appear in the merit list prepared for the purpose of CAP.
- ii. The Competent Authority shall publish the provisional Merit List as specified in Rule 8(4).
- iii. The candidates not appeared for MHT-CET 2016 but appeared for JEE(Main) Paper 1, can also apply, however such candidates are required to pay the Application Fee through payment gateway (Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Net Banking).
- iv. The candidates whose names do not appear in the merit list(s) will not be able to participate in entire Admission Process.

#### b) Counselling Round For J and K Migrant Candidates at SPCE

- i. Candidate seeking admission against these seats shall report to the Admission Centre of Admission Authority for admission as per the schedule.
- ii. The candidates shall produce the documentary evidence strictly as per the Proforma(s) in support of their claims.
- iii. These Admissions will be made strictly in the order of merit from amongst the candidates who report in person for admission at SPCE as per schedule, against the seats available in the various institutes at the time when the candidate actually reports for admission.
- iv. Admissions once confirmed shall be final and candidate shall not be allowed to seek transfer of their admission to some other institute and/or some other course during entire duration of the course.
- v. The candidates reporting late for the admission shall be considered for allotment against seats which are available at that time. The decision of the admission centre in-charge shall be final and binding.

#### c) Reporting at institutes:

- i. Candidate shall confirm the admission by paying the requisite amount of fee and by submitting required documents in original to respective institute, to which admission is granted as per schedule.
- ii. If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting necessary original documents within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- iii. If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured to some other institution, he or she shall produce a certificate from the Head of the institution where he/she has already taken admission indicating that he/she has been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The candidate shall produce the attested copies of the certificates duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. Such candidates shall be required to pay the fees immediately at the time of admission and such candidates shall be permitted to submit the required original certificates within 04 working days after the date of payment of fees.

#### d) Important note

Candidates <u>admitted</u> under this provision are not allowed to change course or college in any year of study.

#### 11. Allotment of seats by CAP Round I, II, III and IV-

- (a) All the CAP Rounds (CAP Round I, II, III and IV) shall be conducted by computerised allotment.
- (b) In CAP Round I, II and III, the Stages I to III of rule 10 of these rules shall be executed.
- (c) If the seat remains vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting for admission, such seat will be considered for allotment in subsequent round.
- (d) For the CAP Round-IV, the Stage-I to IX of rule 10 of these rules shall be executed.
- (e) For First Year of Engineering and Technology Admissions, the Diploma candidates and Bachelor of Science candidates shall be considered for allotment only in stage IX of CAP round IV.

#### 12. General provisions.-

- (a) Allotment in CAP Round-I, II, III and IV of Home University Seats, Other than Home University seats and State Level Seats will be carried out as per *Inter-Se-Merit* of Candidates having Maharashtra State Candidature. The seats will be allotted to Candidates as per *Inter-Se-Merit*, options filled and seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAP Round-I, II, III and IV;
- (b) All Candidates eligible for a particular stage of allotment will be considered for allotment of a seat in that stage, even if they have been allotted or not allotted a seat in the previous stage;
- (c) During the allotment of any stage, the Candidate may get upward shift in the allotment with reference to the options filled by the Candidate according to availability of seats at that point of time;
- (d) There shall not be any reservation under different categories in an Unaided Professional Educational Institution, for allocation of seats stated in 7(2), 7(3), 7(4) and 7(5);
- (e) All reserved Category Candidates (including SBC in their original Category) shall be considered for allotment in all stages;
- (f) Due to upward shifts, the seats falling vacant shall be considered for allotment in further iterations of the same stage as per the provisions of that stage of allotment;
- (g) Allotment against the first available option in the order of preference filled in shall be retained as final allotment;
- (h) During CAP Round I, II and III, stage I and II shall be repeated after stage III for betterment to all the Candidates due to allotment to SBC Candidates in stage III;
- (i) The allotment list displayed on website will show the provisional allotment offered to the Candidates. No personal communication or allotment letters in this regard shall be issued to the Candidates;
- (j) A Candidate who has been allotted a seat shall download the "Provisional Seat Allotment Letter". At the time of seat acceptance Candidate has to pay a demand draft in favour of Competent Authority and produce ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS for verification at any Admission Reporting Centres (List shall be available on website). Seat will be confirmed by the Reporting Centre after verification of the original documents and ensuring that the Candidate

- meets all the eligibility norms. The centre in-charge shall issue the Online Receipt of acceptance;
- (k) The Seat Acceptance Fee shall be Rs. 5,000/- for Candidates of General Category, VJ/DT, NT, SBC/OBC Category and Rs.1,000/- for SC, ST Category Candidates. The candidate has to pay the Seat Acceptance Fee during first reporting only. This fee shall be transferred to the institution after deducting Rs. 1,000/- towards processing fee, if the Candidate reports to the institution after completion of CAP process which shall be adjusted towards fees to be paid by the Candidate to the institution. The candidate should opt 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' through Login only and submit the duly signed printout to the Reporting Officer. The Officer shall issue the acknowledgement of the Reporting. The candidate can change the options as 'Freeze', 'Slide' or 'Float' whenever there is change in the allotted institute and course, however if the candidate do not wish to change the option, previous option shall be carried forward for CAP Round II and/ or III
- (l) For cancellation of admission before reporting to the institution, the candidate shall apply to the Reporting Center to which he has paid Seat Acceptance Fee. On cancellation of such admission through Online System before reporting to the institution, the amount shall be refunded after deduction of Rs. 1,000/- towards processing charges. Candidates of General Category shall pay Demand Draft of Rs. 1000/- and shall get the Demand Draft of Rs. 5000/- back.
- (m) The fees is to be paid by **Demand Draft** in favour of 'Commissioner, State CET Cell, Maharashtra State' payable at 'Mumbai'.
- (n) Failure to report in person for Seat acceptance will be considered as if the Candidate has rejected the offer;
- (o) Allotted Seat will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the documents or certificates is found to be invalid or fraudulent and/or the Candidate does not meet the eligibility norms;
- (p) Candidates who want to reject the allocated seat can do so by not remitting the seat acceptance fee at the Reporting Centre in scheduled period. Candidates who reject allocated seat cannot participate in CAP Round II and / or III.
- **13.** Admissions in Institutional Quota and vacant seats after CAP.- The Director or Principal of the institution shall carry out the admissions for these seats in the following manner.-
  - (a) Admissions shall be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the *Inter-Se-Merit* of the Candidates who have applied to the Institution.
  - (b) Information brochure or prospectus of the Institution which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institution's website.
  - (c) Institution shall invite applications by notifying schedule of admission and the number of seats in each course to be filled by the institution, by advertisement in at least two leading newspapers and on the website of the institution.
  - (d) Aspiring Candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria as notified by the Government and specified by the appropriate authority, from time to time, shall apply to the Principal or Director of the respective institution for admission at the Institution level as provided in rule 3(2)(b).

- (e) The institution, as specified by the appropriate authority, shall fill the seats in the NRI Quota, based on the Merit list prepared and published by the Competent Authority.
- (f) The institution may give admission to the applicants on the basis of their inter-se merit derived from Merit list declared by the Competent Authority for filling the seats in the Institutional Quota, excluding the NRI seats. Provided that, where the appropriate authority specifies that such admissions shall be based on the basis of CET, in that case the Institutional quota, excluding NRI seats, shall be filled on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit prepared by following the procedure specified in 8(4).
- (g) The institution shall prepare and display the Inter-Se merit lists of the Candidates to be filled in at the institution level, in the Institutional Quota and Supernumerary Quota of OCI / PIO, Foreign National, Children's of Indian workers in Gulf Countries along with the vacant seats after CAP, on the notice board and shall publish the same on the website of the institution.
- (h) The Minority or Non-Minority institution intending to surrender the Institutional Quota (in part or full) of specified courses to the CAP shall communicate two days before the display of seat matrix of each CAP Round and the same shall be allotted as per the rules of CAP.
- (i) All the admissions and cancellations shall be updated immediately through online system.

If any CAP seat remains or becomes vacant after the CAP Rounds then the same shall be filled in by the Candidate from the same Category for which it was earmarked during the CAP. Further if the seats remain vacant then the seats shall be filled on the basis of Inter-Se-Merit of the applicant.

14. Institution Level Round.-If the seats remain vacant after all CAP Rounds, the said seats shall be filled in by the institution through Institution Level Round with the prior approval of the Competent Authority.

#### 15. Approval of Merit List and the Admitted Candidates List.-

- 15(1) After completion of Admission process every Unaided Private Professional Educational Institution shall submit the Admission- approval proposal to the Director Technical Education and the Admission Regulating Authority in accordance with the subsection (5) of the section 9 of the Act.
- 15(2) The Admission-approval proposal shall include the list of all Candidates admitted which shall have the quota, Candidature Type, Reservation, Qualification Marks, etc as well as the required documents of the Candidates admitted at institution level.

#### 16. Refund of fees after cancellation of admission by Institutions.-

- (a) The Candidate shall apply online for cancellation and submit signed copy of system generated application for cancellation of admission to the institution.
- (b) After receiving admission cancellation request from the Candidate, the institution shall cancel the admission immediately and generate online acknowledgement of cancellation of admission through institution login and issue a signed copy to the Candidate.
- (c) The refund of fees before cut-off date of admission shall be made within two days i.e. total fee minus the processing charges of Rs.1,000/-, or refund rule shall be as per the guidelines of the appropriate authorities or the State Government, as the case may be.

If the admission is cancelled after the cut-off date of admission declared by the Competent Authority, there shall be no refund except the Security Deposit and Caution Money Deposit.

#### 17. Change of Course or Institution after First, Second or Third year.-

- 17(1)The Candidate seeking for a change in course or shift after successfully completing the First Year of studies will be allowed to do so in the same institution subject to the availability of seats and changes will be carried out based on the marks of First Year or First and Second Semester together. The Principal shall be responsible for ascertaining the eligibility of the Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred. List of such changes shall be communicated to the office of the Admissions Regulating Authority;
- 17(2) Transfer of Candidates (Course or Institution) after one year shall be made in the following manner,-
  - (a) The Candidate once admitted in First Year shall not be eligible for transfer to any other institution during the same academic year;
  - (b) The Candidate passing the First Year or both first and second semester examinations in full or failed in one of the heads of passing are considered as eligible for transfer of Institution or course;
  - (c) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage in any case from Unaided Institutions to Government or Government Aided Institutions. However, the Candidate from Government or Government Aided Institution may seek transfer to Unaided Educational Institution;
  - (d) There shall be no transfer of students at any stage to Autonomous Institutions:
  - (e) Transfer to Unaided Institutions.- The Principals of Unaided institutions shall consider the Candidates from other institutions for transfer with prior approval from the Admissions Regulating Authority on submission of No Objection Certificate (NOC) from institution, Eligibility Certificate from University and Vacancy position. The Principal or Director shall ascertain the eligibility of Candidates as laid down by the concerned University for the course to which the Candidate is being transferred;

Transfer in Government or Government aided Institutions- Eligible Candidates aspiring for a transfer from Government or Government Aided Institution to other Government or Government Aided Institution, shall apply in writing to the Principal in which he/she studied first year or second semester. The Principal or Director shall forward the consolidated branch wise merit list of eligible candidates giving details like Name, Course, percentage of Marks, Names of Courses and Institution in order of preference to which candidates desires to seek transfer, reasons for transfer and Remarks, along with course wise vacancy position in institution, to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, so as to reach him as per the schedule given by him. All the Principals of Government and Government Aided Institutions shall submit vacancy position of all courses to the Directorate of Technical Education Mumbai before stipulated date

- (f) No application without recommendation of the Principal of Institution shall be entertained by the Admissions Regulating Authority;
- (g) If the result of the University is not declared before the process of transfer, Candidates of that University will lose claim on transfer;
- 17(3) The Candidates admitted under Supernumerary Quota seats are not eligible for change of Course or Institution;

### 18. Documents to be attached along with "Application Form for Centralized Admission Process".-

The candidates are required to carry **ALL Original Certificates/Documents** in support of their claim at the time of filling up of Application Form for Admission for the scrutiny and verification at identified Facilitation Centre. The candidates are required to scan the document in .jpg or .gif format ( minimum 150 dpi resolution, file size upto 1 MB) and upload the scanned copies of the required documents at the time of filling up Application Form for Admission. The Facilitation Center shall assist the candidate, fee of cost, to scan and upload the documents.

#### 19. Miscellaneous provisions

#### a) Conduct and Discipline

- (i) Failure of the candidate in making full and correct Statements in the application form and/or **suppression** of any information and/or submission of false documents shall lead to disqualification of the candidate from the examination or at later stage during the Admission Process such candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.
- (ii) Adopting any unfair means or engaging in malpractice in the examination shall render a candidate liable for punishment under, "Maharashtra Prevention of Malpractices Act, Universities, Board and Other Specified Examination Act, 1982" and disqualify him/her for examination.
- (iii) Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority.
- (iv) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Government takes any policy decision pertaining to admission, then the same shall be brought in to effect from that point of time as per the directives from the Government from time to time.
- (v) Students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.

#### b) Action against ragging:

Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 and Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging (Appendix 12 published in AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2011-12) and their amendments which may be published from time to time. The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 is in effect from 15th May, 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.

- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited,
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty, which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is located, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that prima facie there is no substance, in the complaint received; he / she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final.
- e) If the Head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above.
- f) Undertaking from the candidate shall be taken while admitting the candidate in the Institute.

Any Acts or its amendments which may be published from time to time by AICTE, Government or Judgments by Hon. Supreme Court of India, Hon. High Court of Bombay etc will be applicable to Candidates and Institutions covered under these rules of admission.

If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied or any certificate(s) submitted by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal/Director. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be sent within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final. Such candidates are also liable for penal action as per the provisions in the law.

#### c) Others:

- (i) The medium of instruction for degree courses is English.
- (ii) The candidates are advised to ensure before applying that he/she is eligible for admission to the program as per the prevailing eligibility norms of the University. Admission of candidate will be treated as finally confirmed only on production of the Eligibility Certificate from the University to which the college is affiliated.
- (iii) Physical fitness: Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action.

(iv) The Head of the institution shall have the right to satisfy himself about the conduct and character of a candidate by verifying the antecedents of a candidate through the appropriate police-authority, before admitting him / her to the college / institution.

#### d) Hostel accommodation:

Accommodation in Hostel cannot be guaranteed to the admitted candidates. All the Candidates are advised to personally verify the availability of Hostel, Hostel fees payable etc. from the Director/Principal of the college to which they intend to take admission. The Director/Principal of the colleges shall consider on priority the applications of Persons with Disability candidates, Sons and Daughters of Jammu and Kashmir migrant candidates and Government of India nominees for Hostel accommodation.

- 1. Application form Receipt Center (ARC) is an institution/center where a candidate can fill the Online application form, submit and upload it.

- 7. 'Diploma' means Diploma awarded by the various State Board of Technical Education/ Diploma awarded by AICTE approved autonomous polytechnics in Maharashtra state.
- 8. 'Director' means the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State.
- 9. Foreign Nationals: Citizens of all countries other than India, who are not of Indian origin as defined under PIO.
- 10. 'Government Polytechnic' means the Polytechnic run by the Government of Maharashtra.
- 11. 'Government Aided Polytechnic' means Polytechnic run by private management which receives financial assistance from the Government of Maharashtra.
- 12. 'Inter se merit' means the order of merit.
- 13. NRI: Non Resident Indian as per definition given in the section 6 of the Income Tax Act 1961.
- 14. 'Polytechnic' means an institution imparting technical education in Engineering and allied technical subjects leading to Diploma in Engineering / Technology.
- 15. Persons of Indian Origin (PIO): Persons who are citizens of other countries (except Pakistan and Bangladesh) who at any time held an Indian Passport or that person or either of his / her parents or any of his / her grand parents was a citizen of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of India or Sec 2 (b) of Citizenship Act, 1955 (Act No. 57 of 1955).
- 16. 'Representative of the Competent Authority' means an officer appointed to assist Competent Authority for smooth conduct of Admission Process as per the directives of the Competent Authority.
- 17. State Government' means the Government of Maharashtra.
- 18. 'Sanctioned Intake' (SI) means the course-wise number of seats sanctioned by the Government with reference to the AICTE's approval.
- 19. 'Sandwich Pattern' is 4 year duration course with the provision of Industrial Training during the course in Diploma.
- 20. 'Un-Aided Polytechnic' means Polytechnic run by private management on self financing basis.
- 21. Website means www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in

# 1.3 Role of Competent Authority in the process of Admission to First year Diploma of Engineering/ Technology through centralised process

- 1. The Competent Authority shall direct the students as per their allotment through CAP to all Government/Government Aided/Un Aided Polytechnics for reporting within specified time period. The authority will also implement the admissions in unaided courses in Aided Polytechnics participating in CAP.
- 2. All the decisions taken in relation to Admission to First Year of Engineering/Technology Diploma courses, by the Competent Authority shall be final and binding on all concerned.

- 3. Competent Authority shall also deal with the representations received from the candidates pertaining to allotment and admissions in Government., Government. Aided Polytechnics which acts as Grievance Redressal Authority.
- 4. Merit list of the students finally admitted in various Government., Government. Aided & Unaided polytechnics in the state whether participating or not participating in CAP shall be submitted for the approval of competent authority within the specified period.

#### 1.4 Seats available for Admission Process:

Break up of the seats available for admission through CAP for all types of institutes and seats available for Institute level admission/Seats for Minority community shall be as shown below.

- 2. Candidates willing to take admission in unaided polytechnics for institute level seats will have to apply separately to unaided polytechnic in prescribed application form issued by the respective Unaided Polytechnic.
- 3. Candidates willing to take admission in Aided/Unaided Minority polytechnics under Minority quota will have to apply separately to respective Aided/Unaided Minority polytechnics. Admission under minority quota will be as per circular dated 18 June 2014 , issued by minority development department of Government of Maharashtra.
- 4. As per the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, New Delhi vide its final judgment in order C.A.NO.9048 of 2012 dated 13th December 2012 has laid down cut off dates for the grant of approval by AICTE, University and State Government. Accordingly the intake of the courses approved for the AY 2015-16 will be considered for admission. Any approval granted after the aforesaid cut off dates will not be considered for admission. The details of the judgment may be accessed at www.aicte-india.org>bulletin>circulars.

Changes in sanctioned intake capacity for the course in existing institutes communicated after the printing of the information brochure shall be displayed only on the website http://www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015 and will not be separately notified in any newspaper.

#### 1.5 Seats available Over & Above Sanctioned Intake

#### 1.5.1 Seats for PIO / Foreign Nationals / Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries

15% of the sanctioned Intake Capacity seats may be available over and above the sanctioned intake in the institutes for the children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries/ PIO / Foreign Nationals subject to prior permission to be obtained by the concerned institute from AICTE. The 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of these 15% seats shall be reserved for children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries and 2/3<sup>rd</sup> of these 15% seats shall be reserved for the PIO/ Foreign Nationals etc. However, any vacant seats out of 1/3rd category shall be reverted to the quota of 2/3rd meant for PIO/ Foreign Nationals.

#### 1.5.2 Seats for Jammu & Kashmir (J&K)Migrant Candidates:

Provision of one seat per course over and above the sanctioned intake in all Polytechnics / Institutes in the Maharashtra state is available for;

- 1. **J-1 Type:** The children of citizens who are displaced from Jammu and Kashmir to any part of India or from unsafe border area of J & K to a relatively safer place in J & K from 1990 onwards due to terrorist activities.
- 2. **J-2 Type:** The children of officers belonging to Indian Administrative Services, Indian Police Services, Indian Forest Service, other officers and children of staff belonging to military and paramilitary forces, transferred to Jammu and Kashmir to combat terrorist activities.
- 3. **J-3 Type:** The children of staff of J & K police engaged in combating terrorism.

Admission against these seats is made strictly on the basis of *inter se* merit of **combined single merit list** of all eligible J & K Migrant candidates. The candidates seeking admission against the seats reserved for J&K migrant have to submit relevant Certificates shown in proforma J/K/L in support of their claim at the time of admission.

Under any condition the seats remaining vacant in this quota will not be offered to Candidates from any other category. Candidates seeking admission under this provision shall submit their duly filled application forms to the following address as per the notified schedule.

The Principal, S.B.M. Polytechnic, Vile Parle (West), Near Cooper Hospital, Mumbai- 400 056 Candidates admitted under this provision are not allowed to change course or college in any year of study. Candidates who are eligible to apply against the provision of Jammu & Kashmir Migrant Candidate seats as well as against the Maharashtra State seats are only entitled to claim for one of these seats.

#### 1.5.3 Seats for Government of India Nominees:

A number of seats as decided by Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India will be available for the nominees from states and Union Territories which lack the facility in Technical Education. These seats are over and above the sanctioned intake of the institutes in which these admissions are provided. The admission procedure for these seats is as under:

- 1. The candidate shall report to the Directorate of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, for scrutiny of original certificates and for collecting the admission letter as per schedule.
- GOI Nominee candidate shall not report directly to the Institute without collecting admission letter from **Directorate of Technical Education**, **Maharashtra state**, **Mumbai-400 001**.
   The Principal of the institute should not admit such candidate and ask the candidate to approach above mentioned office.

#### These admissions are subject to the following conditions-

- 1. Candidates nominated by the concerned States shall be admitted only and only if they fulfil the educational qualifications as mentioned in Rule 2.0. Candidates so admitted will have to obtain eligibility certificate from the MSBSHSE.
- 2. GoI nominees belonging to backward class category does not get any exemption in tuition fees.
- 3. Candidates admitted under this provision are not allowed to change course or college in subsequent years.

# 1.5.4 Seats under centrally sponsored scheme of Ministry of Human Resource Development of GoI for Persons with Disabilities (PWD)

Under centrally sponsored scheme of Ministry of Human Resource Development of GoI for persons with disabilities, Five (5) seats in each course (Max 25 seats per Institute) are available over and above the sanctioned intake in the following institutes.

- 1. Government. Polytechnic, Mumbai,
- 2. Government. Polytechnic, Pune
- 3. Government. Polytechnic Kolhapur

The disability criteria and other conditions of eligibility for these candidates will be as per the guidelines of Ministry of Human Resource Development of GoI. Each of the above institute shall issue advertisement to invite the applications for admission in specified branches and as approved by the AICTE.

#### 1.5.5 Seats for Marathi speaking candidates of Mauritius (MR)

A total of **five** seats are available in the state for the sons and the daughters of the Marathi speaking persons from Mauritius. These seats will be allotted to any of the Polytechnics in the state **over and above** the sanctioned intake by Director, Technical Education (M.S), Mumbai.

The applications for these seats are required to be submitted to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State,3, Mahapalika Marg, Opp. Metro Cinema, Mumbai- 400 001 as per schedule. The allotment of seats shall be done by the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, based on the merit of Candidates in this category, as per the details given in the admission schedule.

- 1. The father/ mother of these candidates must be citizens of Mauritius and the candidate is required to produce a certificate from Indian High Commission to the effect that applicant is from Marathi speaking Community in Mauritius.
- 2. Candidates shall bear all related expenses for studies in Maharashtra and no concession whatsoever shall be admissible to them for admission or continuation of education.

#### 1.5.6 Seats reserved for National Cadet Corps (N.C.C.):

Provision of 15 seats over and above of SI shall be allotted to NCC Students. The candidate seeking admission under N.C.C. quota, must fulfil following conditions in addition to eligibility criterion mentioned in 2.0

- 1. Certification of representation of Maharashtra at All India level.
- 2. Certificate of minimum 70% attendance in two years of N.C.C.
- 3. N.C.C. `A' certificate.

The allotment of these seats shall be carried out in the branch & institute as selected by the candidate. No institute shall be given more than one seat over & above SI under this category.

#### Note:-

- 1. Candidates seeking admission under over & above under thisquota, who has secured admission in any other institute under Normal quota shall produce certificate indicating his/ her original documents are retained with the previous institute.(Proforma N)
- 2. Candidates seeking admission under NCC quota shall execute their applications such that their applications shall reach to the N.C.C. admission authority as per the schedule notified by the N.C.C. authority.
- 3. Candidates seeking admission under rule 1.5.5 shall apply to appropriate authority before the last date of admission under these rules.
- **1.5.7 TFWS Seats**: Maximum 5% seats of sanctioned intake per course are available for admissions. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and to be filled through centralized admission process conducted by Competent Authority only. (For detail read Rule No. 18.2)

#### 1.6 Seats for OMS candidates:

The seats remaining vacant, if any, in Un-Aided Polytechnics, after offering admissions to all Maharashtra candidates on the merit list will be offered to the eligible candidates from the states other than Maharashtra State as per the following guidelines.

- 1. All OMS candidates will be considered as general category candidates and will have to fulfil the eligibility criteria as mentioned in Rule 2.0
- 2. These admissions are made on the basis of *inter se* Merit of the OMS candidates.
- 3. The Head/Principal of concerned unaided institute shall effect these admissions.

#### 1.6.1 D. D. Daruwala Memorial Scholarship Trust Seat

One seat for D. D. Daruwala Memorial Scholarship Trust is available in Walchand College of Engineering, Sangli (Diploma Wing). The seat can be allotted to any of the course available in the institute. Candidate seeking admission against this seat shall apply directly to the Principal of the Institute.

#### 1.7 Distribution of seats available under General Admission Process:

The seats available for admission through admission Authority shall be distributed as per the details given below

#### 1.7.1 District Level 70% Seats:

- 1. The eligibility of a candidate for 70% district level seats shall be decided on the basis of the location of the school from which the candidate has passed the qualifying examination.
  - e.g., Candidate passing Std. X examination from Ichalkaranji in Kolhapur district is eligible for 70% district level seats of Kolhapur district.
- 2. In the Government/ Government Aided and Un-aided Polytechnics / Institutions running post SSC Diploma courses in Mumbai and Mumbai Suburban Candidates passing Std. X examination from any of the two districts are eligible for 70% district level seats offered by all the two districts. Home District for the candidates applying from above districts seeking admission will be considered under Mumbai district.
- 3. Admissions to the unique courses in the Polytechnics, as shown in Annexure 5, shall be carried out on the basis of **State level merit**.

#### 1.7.2 Government Institutes with Second shift Courses for Religious Minority Students:-

70 % seats for Religious Minority Students belonging to Muslim, Buddhist, Christian, Sikh, Parsi and Jain community and 30% seats for general & backward class category candidates are reserved in selected Second shift Courses for Religious Minority Students in Government polytechnics (For details see Annexure 7). **These seats will be filled through CAP at State Level**.

For each course with sanctioned intake of 60, 70% seats (42) will be reserved for above mentioned religious minority candidates as indicated in the following table, 30 % seats shall be available to all other general candidates and shall be filled as per the existing rules of the admission process.

- 1. In a particular Minority Religious Group, if sufficient numbers of candidates are not available and available seats could not be filled then in such case vacant seats shall be filled with the candidates from amongst other Minority Religious Groups on the basis of Inter se Merit.
- 2. As per rule 6.4, if sufficient number of female candidates is not available against the specified reservation, then such seats shall be given to the male candidates from the respective Minority Religious Group.

#### 2.0 Eligibility Criteria:

2.1 Eligibility criteria for Maharashtra State/ Outside Maharashtra State/ Jammu & Kashmir Migrant/ Government of India Nominee Candidates for admission to First year of diploma courses in Engineering/ Technology:

Candidate should be an Indian National and should have passed the SSC (Std.X) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education or its equivalent, with subjects Maths/Mathematics, General Science and English, with minimum 35% aggregate marks.

#### Note:

The term 'aggregate marks' used here shall mean as follows

#### A. For Maharashtra State Board Candidates: -

- I. The candidates who have passed SSC Examination prior to March 2009, the aggregate marks shall be grand total of marks obtained by the candidate in any 5 subjects where he/she has scored maximum marks.
- II. The candidates who have passed SSC Examination after March 2009, the **aggregate marks** shall be total marks of 5 subjects taken into consideration and mentioned on the Mark sheet.
- III. Candidates who have passed Maths/Mathematics (Code 71 for Maharashtra State Board candidates) and Science & Technology (Code 72 for Maharashtra State Board candidates) are only eliqible for admission.
- IV. In case marks against sports activities are given on the marksheet, these shall be added to the aggregate marks for deciding merit.

#### **B. For ICSE Candidates-**

- **a.** Student seeking admission on the basis of Group 1 & Group 2 subjects only, the **aggregate marks** shall be the grand total of marks in any of the 5 subjects from Group 1 & Group 2 where he/she has scored maximum marks.
- **b.** Student seeking admission on the basis of Group 1, Group 2 & Group 3, **aggregate marks** shall be the grand total of all subjects from all groups.

#### C. For CBSE Candidates-

The **aggregate mark** means the grand total of marks obtained by the candidate, including all subjects as declared on Mark sheet.

#### D. For CBSE/ICSE Candidates: -

In case the result of the candidate is given in terms of grades, such Candidates are required to submit the graded result into the equivalent marks authorised from the concerned institute /Board.

Candidates passing SSC from other than State Boards or Central Boards shall bring equivalent certificate from Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education (MSBSHSE).

E. Any amendments/Acts/Judgments which may be published by Government/Hon. Courts of India from time to time will be applicable to Candidates and Institutes covered under these rules of admission.

# 2.2 Eligibility Criterion for NRI / PIO / Foreign Nationals / Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries

Candidate should have passed the SSC (Std.X) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination, with subjects Maths/Mathematics, General Science and English, with minimum 35% marks in aggregate.

#### Note:

- 1. The NRI candidates are eligible to apply for admission against the <u>Institute level seats</u>, only in Unaided Polytechnics /Institutes. The extent to which such NRI candidates shall be admitted is limited to 5% of the sanctioned intake.
- 2. The eligibility of the candidates passing the SSC (Std. X) equivalent examination from a school/college/Examination Board situated outside India shall be further verified by the Institute to which the candidate is admitted. Hence such candidates are advised to get their equivalence certificates from MSBSHSE at the time of admission. (Refer Annexure 4)

#### 3.0 Type of Candidature

#### 3.1 Types of Maharashtra State Candidates and Home District:

A candidate is considered eligible for admission to the seats of Maharashtra State coming under the purview of competent authority subject to fulfillment of any one of the eligibility requirements as listed in the following table.

#### 3.2 OMS Candidate:-

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#### 4.0 Admission to Mining and Mine surveying & Mining Engineering course:

The female candidates are not allowed to take admission in Mining and Mine Surveying & Mining Engineering courses.

# 5.0 Admission to the Candidates who want to take repeat fresh admission in First year of Engineering/Technology diploma course during current academic year:

The candidates who had already admitted to any diploma course during the previous academic years are eligible for fresh admission to first year diploma course during the current academic year **subject to the condition that** such candidates will not be eligible for exemption in any subjects passed during the earlier academic years. Such candidates shall have to produce NOC (No Objection certificate) from the institute of earlier admission in the "**proforma N**" given in the brochure.

#### 6.0 Reservations:

The various reservations provided for the seats available under General Admission Process under the purview of competent authority are detailed here.

The seats available over & above sanctioned intake of the institute as prescribed under **Rule-1.5** do not have any further internal reservation.

#### 6.1 Provision of 15% seats for candidates passing SSC examination with Technical/ Vocational subjects from SSC Board Maharashtra state:

1. 15 % seats of the seats available under General Admission Process as prescribed in rule 1.4 shall be reserved for Candidates passing Std. X examination with Technical/ Vocational subjects as prescribed by the Directorate of Vocational Education, Maharashtra State.

- 2. For deciding the merit of such candidates, the marks scored by the candidate in the SSC Examination, without considering the marks scored in the Technical/ vocational subjects, shall be considered.
- 3. The seats reserved for these candidates shall have further reservation among themselves for the Backward Class category candidates mentioned in these Rules.

#### 6.2 Reservation for sons / daughters of Defence Service Personnel:

Five per cent (5%) of the seats available under general admission process as prescribed in Rule 1.4 in each Polytechnic, subject to a maximum of five (5) seats, shall be reserved for children of active/Ex defence service personnel. **These seats are within the sanctioned intake capacity for the course.** 

- a) Children of Ex- service personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra State (D1).
- **b)** Children of active service personnel who are domiciled in Maharashtra State (D2).
- **c)** Children of active service personnel (D3)
  - ☐ Who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State.
  - □ Who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the last duty station on grounds of children education. Provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the SSC (Std.X) examination of Maharashtra State Board or its equivalent examination from a school situated in the State of Maharashtra.

These 5% seats should be offered to eligible children of defence service personnel on the inter-se merit of all Defence category candidates taken together. These seats are available as **state level seats**.

#### Note:

This provision is NOT available to the children of **CIVILIAN STAFF** who is working/ who has worked with the Indian Defence Services.

#### **6.3** Reservations for Persons with Disability Candidates:

As per the provisions in Clause 39 of Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation Act 1995, three per cent (3%) of the seats available under general admission process as prescribed in rule-1.4 in each Polytechnic, shall be reserved for Persons with Disability candidates. **These seats are within the sanctioned intake capacity.** 

This reservation shall be applicable for following types of Persons with Disability candidates:

These 3% seats should be offered to eligible Persons with Disability Candidates on the inter-se merit of respective PH candidates. These seats are allotted in Home District quota.

#### Note:

- 1. It should be noted that the Persons with Disability candidates on admission to Diploma course will not be given any exemptions or additional facilities in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the MSBTE.
- 2. No relaxation in educational qualification will be entertained for Persons with Disability candidates.

3. The certificate (proforma F/F-1) should clearly state that the extent of disability is more than **40%** and the disability is permanent in nature.

#### 6.4 Reservation for female candidates:

As per the provisions in Government. Resolution No. GEC-1000/ (123/2000)/ Tech. Edu.-1, dated 17<sup>th</sup> April, 2000, 30% seats shall be reserved for female candidates in all the courses of the institutions coming under CAP as well as in Unaided polytechnics which are not in CAP.

This reservation shall be applicable for General, SC, ST, VJ/DT (NT-A), NT-B, NT-C, NT-D and OBC categories. Seats reserved for Female candidates are available under both the 70% Home District seats and 30% Other than Home District seats coming under the CAP.

There shall be no reservation for Female candidates under Defence, Persons with Disability and SBC categories.

#### **6.5** Reservation for the Weaver Community of Solapur District :

10% seats of the sanctioned intake capacity of the Textile course at Government Polytechnic, Solapur shall be reserved for the weaver communities of Solapur district. These admissions shall be done at the institute level.

#### 6.6 Reservation for Backward Class Candidates:

The distribution of the seats available under General Admission Process as prescribed in rule-1.4 amongst the various backward class candidates from Maharashtra State are as per the details given in the table below. Backward class candidates shall have to claim at the time of submitting online application.

If a candidate fails to claim reservation for backward class on the application and subsequently claims reservation at the time of admission by producing necessary documents, such claim shall not be considered.

#### Note:

- 1. Reservation for backward class candidate i.e. 50% as stated above shall be available in Government, Government Aided, and Unaided Non-Minority Institutes.
- 2. The reservation for backward class candidates shall **not be available** in Unaided Minority Institutes/colleges.
- 3. Candidates belonging to **Special Backward Class (SBC)** will be offered reservation up to extent of 2% seats of the seats available for Maharashtra candidates which are coming under the purview of the Competent Authority subject to condition that any seats remain vacant in the reserved category at the end of stage—II of allotment. These seats are carved out during the allotment of stage-II and no separate seats are earmarked before the start of the allotment

process. However care shall be taken that reservation quota for S.B.C. category shall not exceed 2% of the seats available under General admission process and total reservation does not exceed 50%.

- 4. Even if the candidate belonging to Backward Class Category secures admission against a seat belonging to the General category by virtue of merit, such candidate has to produce all the necessary documents in support of the category claimed both at the time of admission and while filling up of the CAP admission form.
- 5. All OMS candidates are treated as GENERAL/OPEN category candidates and are not eligible to claim reservation.

# 7.0 Documents required to claim reservation for Backward Class candidates and fee waiver scheme:

The documents required for supporting the backward class reservation (as given in Rule 6.6) claim made by Candidates are as per the details given in the following table.

#### 8.0 Submission of Application form at ARC:

Eligible Candidates seeking admission to the first year of Diploma Courses in Government. /Government Aided/ Unaided polytechnics (participating in CAP) shall submit online application form on <a href="http://www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015">http://www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015</a> as per the schedule given in the Notification. Detail process of submission of online application is given in the **Annexure 1** 

#### 9.0 Documents required for various types of candidates:

The original documents required to be produced by various types of candidates (Type A, B, C, D & E) at the time of Submission & Confirmation of online filled application at ARC are given in **Annexure—4**. Candidates are required to attach the attested copies of the documents mentioned in **Annexure—4** along with printed copy of online application form.

#### 10.0 Attestation

Candidates shall note the following points while submitting the Application forms at ARC

- Candidates shall attach attested copies of all the required certificates as mentioned in these
  rules and enumerate the same in the given format. Candidates shall not attach a copy of any
  other certificate which is not asked under these rules such as certificates for participation in
  sports, cultural activities etc.
- 2. The copies of certificates or documents attached to the application form should be attested by the Principal of the College/Institute/School from which the candidate has passed qualifying examination or Gazetted Officer or Special Executive Magistrate or Police Inspector/ Government. Hospital Doctor or Head Master of a Secondary School or staff of a Government college / Polytechnic not below the rank of Class II Gazetted officer.

#### 11.0 Translation:

If the candidate produces any certificate, which is not in Marathi, Hindi or English language, then translated and authenticated Marathi, Hindi or English version of the same, duly attested by a Gazetted Officer is required to be produced.

#### 12.0 Assignment of merit number

#### 12.1 Merit Number:

Each eligible Maharashtra State Candidate as per **Rule 2.0** who has submitted and confirmed online application form on or before the last date prescribed for the submission of Application Form for Admission to Diploma in Engineering/Technology through CAP will be assigned a provisional merit number based on the following criterion.

- 1. Aggregate marks obtained at SSC (Std. X) or equivalent qualifying examination shall be the basis for the purpose of determining the *inter se* merit.
- 2. No rounding off of the marks secured by the candidate will be done in individual subject or grand total while converting marks of the individual subject out of 100.
- 3. Candidates passing SSC Examination from Maharashtra State Board having included marks for Sports etc. in Grand Total mentioned in the mark sheet shall be considered.
- 4. In any case externally additional weightage shall not be added to Grand Total.

Merit of all eligible Maharashtra State candidates will be based on the Aggregate (best of 5) marks obtained at SSC (Std. X) or equivalent qualifying examination only; relative merit in case of a tie (i.e. equal marks in Aggregate best of 5 marks obtained at SSC (Std. X) or equivalent qualifying examination) shall be resolved as per **Rule 12.2** 

#### Note:

- 1. Merit list of Maharashtra State Candidates so prepared shall indicate a State level General Merit No., State level Category Merit no. (as applicable), Home District General Merit No., Home District Category Merit no. (As applicable) etc.
- 2. Assignment of a Merit number does not indicate or ensure admission to any seat. Candidate appeared in the final merit list has to fullfill the necessary admission criteria.

#### 12.2 Relative Merit in case of tie:

In case of tie, i.e. candidates having equal best of 5 marks in qualifying examination i.e. S.S.C. examination, the inter-se merit of candidates shall be reassessed as laid down below:

- 1. A candidate who has secured higher % of marks in the subject of Mathematics at S.S.C. examination will have First priority.
- 2. A candidate who has secured higher % of marks in the subject of Science at the S.S.C. Examination will have Second priority.
- 3. A candidate who has secured higher % of marks in the subject of English at the S.S.C. Examination will have third priority.
- 4. A candidate passing H.S.C. (Std. XII) Science stream examination at (10 +2) level will have Fourth priority.
- 5. A candidate passing H.S.C. (Std. XII) Examination with M.C.V.C. will have Fifth priority.
- 6. A candidate passing ITI Trade of 2 Years will have Sixth Priority.
- 7. A candidate passing Intermediate grade drawing examination will have Seventh priority.
- 8. Date of Birth of candidate (Elder candidate will be given preference).

#### 12.3 Change of Marks due to verification:

- 1. If the marks in the qualifying examination are modified due to verification and the same is duly certified by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent, the same shall be reported to the ARC incharge immediately.
- 2. However the effect of the change will be taken into consideration only for the subsequent round (s) of admission.

#### 13.0 Rules of Admission through Centralized Admission Process (CAP)

This section briefly explains the various stages and procedure adopted for the CAP. Candidates seeking admission to Diploma in Engineering/Technology courses are required to fulfil the eligibility criterion as mentioned in Rule 2.0 for the academic year 2015-16, the Competent Authority shall conduct total three (3) rounds of Centralized Admission. The CAP shall consist of first Two (2) rounds of Centralized Allotment wherein eligible candidates of respective rounds will fill & confirm separate/fresh Online Option forms for respective rounds.

Third round of CAP shall be conducted by way of counselling at the notified admission center.

### Major Steps & guidelines in the Admission in Diploma Courses through CAP are summarized below:

- **1.** Candidate shall fill & submit Online Application form on website http://www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015 for admission to Diploma through CAP.
- **2.** Candidate should fill & submit only one online application form which shall be applicable for admission to all Diploma Institutes participating in CAP.
- **3.** Candidates filling/confirming more than one application will be treated as duplicate forms and shall be rejected without any communication to the candidates and only latest application shall be considered valid for admission.
- **4.** Document Verification and Confirmation of online application form at the Application form Receipt Centers (ARCs) by eligible candidates.
- **5.** Display of Merit of candidates who have confirmed the online Application Form at ARC for Centralized Admission process for admission to Diploma as per schedule.
- **6.** Fill in and confirm the Online Option Form(s) for CAP Round(s) I/II **at ARC** (by candidates eligible to participate in these respective CAP rounds).

- **7.** Display of Allotment(s) of respective CAP Round(s) I/II on website http://www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015.
- 8. Reporting to respective Institutes as per allotment of CAP Round(s) I/II.
- **9.** Conduction of CAP Round-III by counselling at the designated centers of admission and Reporting to respective Institute.

#### Note:

- 1. Above mentioned procedure is tentative and shall be taken as a suggestive guideline. A notification giving details such as schedule of activities, procedure of Centralized Admission will be displayed on the website and published in leading newspapers.
- 2. The scheme of allotment through Multiple Rounds and Rules of Reporting presented below is designed to prevent loss of academics and to make the CAP Rounds meaningful and effective rather than formal and ineffective in view of the previous experience of this Directorate as also the facts and figures available with this Directorate as to the seats remaining vacant at the end of each Round(s) and especially at the end of all the Round(s) of such Centralized Allotment Process.
- 3. The rounds are so designed with the purpose that, maximum vacant seats are filled in, without creating further resultant vacancies on account of shifting of students to whom already allotment has been made in earlier rounds of CAP.
- 4. This step is required to enable the colleges to start the academic activity immediately to complete the term in time.

#### 14.0 Admission Rounds:

### 14.1 Admissions to Foreign Nationals / NRI/ Persons of Indian Origin / Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries:

- Aspiring candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria for Foreign Nationals /PIOs/Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries/Children of NRI shall directly submit their applications to **The Director, Technical Education (M.S) Mumbai-400001**, for admissions to Government. / Government Aided Institutes.
- 2. As on today No Government /Government. Aided institutes are having the permission to admit Foreign Nationals/PIOs/Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries/Children of NRI.

#### 14.2 Admissions of Children/ward of NRI Candidates in Unaided Institutes

- 1. The eligible NRI candidates are eligible to apply for admission against the **Institute level seats**, only in unaided polytechnics/Institutes.
- 2. For admissions to unaided polytechnics/Institutes, candidates are required to contact the Principals / Directors of the respective Institutes.
- 3. The extent to which such NRI candidates shall be admitted is limited to 5% of the sanctioned intake.
- 4. NRI candidates will be required to pay fees as decided by the Shikshan Shulka Samiti, Mumbai.

#### Note:

- 1. These admissions will be made strictly as per merit on or before the commencement of academic session for the first semester/year for the current academic year.
- 2. The admission against these supernumerary seats is permitted to the institutes only after the institute gets a certificate from AICTE regarding the availability of facilities for creation of supernumerary seats.
- 3. If any seats available for Foreign Nationals / Persons of Indian Origin / Children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries remain vacant due to non-availability of eligible candidates for these seats, such vacant seats shall be kept vacant. **Under any condition these seats shall not be offered to any other candidates.**
- 4. The 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the 15 % seats shall be reserved for children of Indian workers in the Gulf countries and 2/3<sup>rd</sup> of the 15 % seats shall be reserved for the PIO/Foreign Nationals etc. However, any vacant seats out of 1/3rd category shall be reverted to the quota of 2/3rd meant for PIO/Foreign Nationals.

#### 14.3 Admissions Through CAP for Maharashtra State Candidates:

For the academic year 2015-16, the Competent Authority shall conduct total Three (3) rounds of Centralized Admission. The CAP shall consist of first two (2) rounds of Centralized Allotment wherein

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eligible candidates will fill separate/fresh Online Option forms for respective rounds. The CAP round III shall be conducted by way of counseling only for the eligible candidates at Center of Admission.

#### **Centralized Admission Process is summarized as below:**

Details of eligibility for participating in each round of CAP, method of reporting after each CAP round, availability of seats for each CAP round and other details are given in the Annexure 1.

Seats remaining vacant after completion of CAP will be filled at the Institute level. The guidelines for vacancy round of admission and for admission against Institute level are given in the **Annexure 6** 

Only one round of admission by counseling for J&K Migrant seats will be conducted. Various steps in the process of admission to Engineering/Technology Diploma courses are also given in the **Annexure 1**. The steps include issue of Information brochure, filling up & confirmation of Online CAP Application form, filling up & confirmation of Option form for each round of Centralized Allotment, Allotment process and Reporting Rules etc. Candidates are required to read carefully the details of CAP given in the **Annexure 1** and follow instructions given therein. **Annexure 4** gives various documents needed while attending the CAP.

#### ❖ CAP Rounds I/II by allotment and Round III by Counseling for Maharashtra State candidates (Type A,B,C,D,E)

**Eligible candidates:** All the eligible Maharashtra State candidates (Type A-E) who have been assigned Maharashtra State Merit number and whose name appear in the Final merit list for respective CAP rounds prepared by the Competent Authority shall be considered for allotment in these Rounds.

#### **CAP Rounds I/II: Direct Allotment:**

Allotment of seats for Home District (HD) seats (70%) and Other Than Home District (OHD) seats (30%) for other district candidates coming under CAP is carried out as per the logic explained in the rule.

For the CAP Round-I, Stage-I to Stage – III of rule shall be executed. Seats remaining vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting will be available for allotment in CAP Round-II.

For the CAP Round-II, Stage-I to Stage-IX of rule shall be executed. Seats remaining vacant due to non-allotment and non-reporting will be available for CAP Round-III (Counselling).

#### **CAP Round III- Admission by Counseling at District Level:**

This round of admission will be conducted only for eligible candidates of the respective district whose names have appeared in Final Merit list (subject to eligibility of participation as set out in the Annexure 1). During this round of admission by Counseling, no seat tag will be applied i.e. seats available shall be treated as GENERAL seats and shall be allotted solely on the basis of inter-se merit of eligible candidates without any reference whatsoever to the category of the candidate(s) (open /reserved) or the category to which the vacant seat belongs (such as District, other than District, Backward Class, Persons with Disability etc).

#### **General Notes:**

- 1. Allotment for Home District seats and Other than Home District seats will be carried out as per *inter se* merit of District area merit list and Maharashtra State merit list respectively of CAP Round-I & II.
- 2. Seats will be allotted to candidates as per their *inter se* merit, as per the options filled and the number of seats available at that point of time in the stage of CAP Round- I & II.
- 3. All candidates eligible for a particular stage of allotment will be considered for allotment for a seat in that stage, even if they have been allotted/not allotted a seat in the previous stage.
- 4. During the allotment of any stage, the candidate may get upward shift in the allotment with reference to the options filled by the candidate according to availability of seats at that point of time.

- 5. All reserved category candidates (including SBC in their original category) shall be considered for allotment (whether they are allotted any seat in earlier stage or not) in all stages.
- 6. Due to upward shifts, the seats falling vacant shall be considered for allotment in further iterations of the same stage as per the provisions of that stage of allotment and as per inter se merit.
- 7. Allotment against the first available option in the order of options filled is retained as final allotment.
- 8. The allotment will be displayed on DTE website http://www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015. The allotment list displayed will show only the provisional allotment offered to the candidates.
- 9. Allotment letters in this regard will be made available on the website and the concerned candidates are required to take a printout and submit to the allotted institute while reporting. The ARC will support to the concerned candidate for taking the printout of the allotment letter.
- 10. The logic for the following stages will be implemented using computer software for the direct allotment.
- 11. The candidates securing allotment will confirm the admission by reporting at the institute mentioned in allotment along with the original certificates needed for admission, by paying necessary fees on or before the last date specified for the same. No personal communication in this regard will be issued.
- 12. The admission will be online confirmed at the 'Respective Institute' only after scrutiny of documents and payment of fees.

#### Logic for Allotment:

The seats available for the implementation of logic will include Home District area seats and State level seats for other District area candidates coming under the purview of Competent Authority.

#### Stage -I: For all the candidates

- All the candidates (Technical/Non-technical/open/reserved/male/female) of all the categories shall be considered for allotment as per their *inter se* merit.
- Backward class category candidates shall be considered for allotment in open category seat
  by virtue of their merit or in their respective category of reservation if open category seats
  are not available at their merit.
- SBC category candidates shall be considered for allotment in open category by virtue of their merit. SBC Category candidates having original category OBC shall be considered for allotment in their original category of reservation by virtue of their merit if open category seats are not available as per their merit.
- Persons with Disability category candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them by virtue of their merit or in open category as per their inter-se merit if the seats reserved for Persons with Disability are not available at their merit.
- Defence category candidates shall be considered for allotment for the seats reserved for them by virtue of their merit or in open category as per their inter-se merit if the seats reserved for defence category candidates are not available at their merit.
- For the female candidates, the availability of seat shall be checked in the following order:
  - Seats reserved for females in open category,
  - In the general seats in open category,
  - Seats reserved for females in respective caste category as applicable,
  - In the general seats in their respective caste category as applicable.
- For the candidates with Technical/Vocational subjects in qualifying examination (Technical Candidates), the seat availability shall be checked in the following order.
  - Seats for technical candidates in Open category.
  - Seats for technical candidates in respective reserved category.
  - Seats for general candidates (Seats open for both technical and non-technical candidates) in Open category.

 Seats for general candidates (Seats open for both technical and non-technical candidates) in the respective reserved category.

## Stage – II: For respective Open/Backward Class category Candidates

- All open and backward class category candidates will be considered for allotment in this stage.
- If any of the open and backward class categories do not get the required number of female candidates with **technical** as per percentages laid down, the seats so remaining vacant shall be filled in from amongst all the candidates ( male / female) belonging to respective open and reserved categories with technical.
- If any of the open and backward class categories do not get the required number of female candidates as per percentages laid down, the seats so remaining vacant shall be filled in from amongst all the candidates (male / female) belonging to respective open and reserved categories.
- If any of the open and backward class categories, does not get the required number of candidates as per percentages laid down for the seats reserved for Technical candidates, the seats so remaining vacant shall be filled in from amongst all the candidates ( Technical /Non-Technical) belonging to respective open and reserved category. (This step shall be conducted in Round II )

# Stage -III: For Special Backward Class category candidates

On completion of Stage-II, if any of the backward class categories mentioned above, does
not get the required number of candidates for the percentages laid down, the seats so
remaining vacant shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates (male and female
taken together) of Special Backward Class (SBC) category, as per their *inter se* merit, limited
to the extent of two per cent seats of Maharashtra State seats (CAP) which are coming
under the purview of Competent Authority for the course. This stage will be carried out
for Home District seats only.

#### Stage -IV: For respective groups of Backward Class category candidates

- All the Backward class category candidates will be considered for allotment in this stage in the groups as mentioned below.
- **Group 1**: i) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Castes converted to Buddhism (SC)
  - ii) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside the specified areas (ST)
- Group 2: i) Vimukta Jati/De- Notified Tribes (VJ/DT) NT(A)
  - ii) Nomadic Tribes 1 (NT-B)
- **Group 3**: i) Nomadic Tribes 2 (NT-C)
  - ii) Nomadic Tribes 3 (NT-D)
  - iii) Other Backward Class (OBC)
- On completion of Stage –III, the seats remaining vacant in the respective group of
  categories as mentioned above, shall be considered for allotment to the candidates of
  respective group as per the *inter se* merit of the candidates.

#### Stage-V: For all Backward Class category candidates

• The seats reserved for Backward class category candidates remaining vacant after completion of Stage –IV, shall be considered for allotment to the candidates of all the reserved categories together, on the basis of their *inter se* merit.

#### Stage –VI: For Persons with Disability category candidates

• The seats remaining vacant after completion of Stage-IV, shall be considered for allotment to the candidates of the category of Persons with Disability (P-1, P-2 and P-3 taken together), on the basis of their combined inter se merit.

### Stage -VII: For Religious Minority candidates

• The seats remaining vacant after completion of Stage-IV, shall be considered for allotment to the candidates from amongst other Minority Religious Group on the basis of inter se merit. if sufficient number of female candidates is not available, then such seats shall be given to the male candidates from the respective Minority Religious Group.

## Stage -VIII: Merging of HD/OHD

Seats remaining vacant will be offered to all candidates solely on the basis of inter-se merit
of eligible candidates without any reference to the Home District, Other than Home District
of the candidate(s) (open /reserved). The seats remaining vacant after completion of Stage –
VII, Stage-I, Stage-II, Stage-IV and Stage-V shall be considered for allotment without HD &
OHD Seat Tag on the basis of inter se merit.

### Stage –IX: For all candidates (without any type of reservation)

- The seats remaining vacant after completion of Stage –VIII, shall be considered for allotment to all the candidates (open/reserved/male/female) on the basis of their *inter se* merit.
- For above step no seat tag will be applied i.e. seats available shall be treated as GENERAL
  seats and shall be allotted solely on the basis of inter-se merit of eligible candidates without
  any reference whatsoever to the category of the candidate(s) (open /reserved) or the
  category to which the vacant seat belongs (such as Backward Class, Persons with Disability)
  for HD and OHD candidates.
- Seats remaining vacant will be offered to all candidates solely on the basis of inter-se merit of eligible candidates without any reference whatsoever to the category of the candidate(s) (open /reserved) or the category to which the vacant seat belongs (such as HD, OHD, Backward Class, Persons with Disability etc).

#### 14.4 Reporting after CAP Rounds:

- 1. Principals of respective institutes are required to carefully scrutinize all the required documents submitted by the candidates at the time of reporting. Any discrepancy in the claims as type, category, eligibility etc. made by the candidates and/or such claims which are not supported by relevant documents should be immediately brought to the notice of the respective Regional Office of the Directorate of Technical Education before confirming the admission of such candidates. The Principals of the Institute shall be responsible for issues/litigation arising out of such admissions.
- 2. After the display of allotment of CAP Rounds, candidate should report to the respective Institutes where they have been allotted a seat as per the notified schedule of the admission process.
- 3. Candidates shall report to the concerned institute with all original certificates needed to substantiate the claims made in the application regarding eligibility and reservation as specified in Annexure- 4.
- 4. If the candidate fails to report to the allotted institute within specified schedule i.e. on or before the last date of reporting after each allotment round, then such a candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- 5. If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting necessary original documents within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat.
- 6. If a candidate is unable to produce original certificates at the time of his/her admission on account of admission already secured to some other institution, he or she shall produce a certificate (Proforma N) from the head of the institution where he/she has already taken admission indicating that he/she has been admitted to a particular course in that institution on a particular date and hence original certificates have been retained in that institution. The

candidate shall produce the attested copies of the certificates duly attested by the Head of the concerned institution. Such candidates shall be required to pay the fees immediately at the time of admission and such candidates shall be permitted to submit the required original certificates within 4 working days after the date of payment of fees.

- 7. After scrutiny of original documents, the candidate will have to pay prescribed full fees immediately in the form as prescribed by the concerned institute and confirm the admission offered. In case of Government, Government aided, University Managed institutes and University Departments, candidates are required to pay the tuition fees in the form of DD in favour of the Principal /Registrar/Director as the case may be.
- 8. If candidate fails to pay the prescribed full fees within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat immediately.
- 9. If a candidate is offered admission, his or her original School / College Leaving Certificate (after qualifying examination) will be retained by the concerned Institute. This original School / College Leaving certificate will not be returned to any candidate once admitted to a course at the institute unless the candidate cancels his/her admission. All other certificates will be verified by the Institute at the time of admission & returned to the candidate.

# **14.5** Additional Round: Counseling Round at Government Polytechnic including Government Aided, Autonomous Institutes: For all the Maharashtra State candidates.

If any vacancies remain after the end of CAP Round-III, Competant Authority shall conduct additional round of admission. This Round will be conducted concurrently in all Government Polytechnics in Maharashtra State. The nature and schedule of this round will be published on DTE website.

### **15.0** Retention of Original certificates:

If a candidate is offered admission, his or her original School / College Leaving Certificate (last attended) will be retained by the concerned Admission Authority / Principal effecting the admission. This original certificate will not be returned to any candidate once admitted to a course at the respective institute unless the candidate cancels his or her admission. Refer 17.0

#### 16.0 Mode of payment of fees:

- **a)** The candidate who has been offered a seat in any Polytechnic shall pay the prescribed tuition fees, development fees and other fees in the form of D.D./P.O. of Nationalised bank valid for minimum three month in favour of the Principal of the respective institute. No other mode of payment will be accepted. The admission shall be confirmed only after the payment of fees.
- **b)** All the candidates who are eligible for fee concession should produce documentary evidence issued by appropriate authority at the time of admission.

## 17.0 Fees, concessions, cancellations and refund:

All the schemes given below, regarding concession in tuition & other fees shall be available to candidates belonging to Maharashtra State only subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria specified by respective authorities offering such concession in fees from time to time.

#### 17.1 Tuition Fees & other fees:

# For Government and Government Aided Polytechnics-(Other than Rubber Technology course)

- 1. Tuition fee
  - a. General candidate Rs.6,000/- per year
- 2. Development fee Rs.1,000/- per year
- 3. Other Fees: As given below per year

4. Caution Money Deposit (Refundable):- Rs.200/- as a Caution Money Deposit to be paid only once, and not every year.

#### Note:-

- 1. No tuition fee for SC/ST/VJ/DT NT(A)/NT(B)/NT(C)/NT(D)/SBC/OBC category candidates and candidates admitted under TFWS seats.
- 2. In case the Government revises the fees for the Government institutes for the year 2015-16, then the admitted candidates will be required to pay the difference in fees as per the Government order.
- Rubber Technology course A self financing course conducted at Government Polytechnic, Mumbai This course shall be treated as un aided programme and the rules for fees in case of private un aided polytechnic shall be applicable to this course.

### For Unaided Private Institutes-

# a) For Open Category candidates:

The interim fee structure for unaided private institutes approved by the Shikshan Shulka Samiti will be made available on website. Unaided private institutes may have submitted their proposals for revision in fees to Shikshan Shulka Samiti. The revision in the fees, if any, by the Shikshan Shulka Samiti will be binding on the students will be admitted in the year 2015-16 and the students taking admission in these institutes will have to pay the fees accordingly.

b) Concession in Fees for Backward Class Category Candidates (belonging to Maharashtra State only) in Unaided Private Institutes:

For SC/ST/VI DT NT(A)/NT(B)/NT(C)/NT(D)/SBC /OBC category candidates

The scheme/mode of concessions, scheme of loan scholarship (if any) for eligible SC/ST/VJ DT NT(A)/NT(B)/NT(C)/NT(D)/SBC /OBC category candidates, in tuition & other fees in the Un-Aided Institutions will be announced by the State Government.

However, these candidates will get only that amount of waiver as notified in the circulars issued by the Social Justice and Tribal Welfare Departments from time to time, subject to fulfillment of various norms and conditions laid down by these Departments.

#### For NRI/PIO/Foreign Nationals/Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries

1. Tuition fee - a) US \$ 2000 per year for the students of SAARC countries excluding Bangladesh & Pakistan.

b) US \$ 3000 per year for Others

2. Other Fees - US \$ 2000 per year

#### > Fees for J&K Migrant Candidates and GoI nominees:

- 1. Jammu and Kashmir Migrant candidates shall pay the same fees as that of the fees of the Government. institutes to respective institutes where they have secured the admission.
- 2. Government of India Nominee candidates shall pay the same fees as that of the fees of the Government.Institutes to respective institutes where they have secured the admission.

#### 17.1.1 Note:

1. If the concerned Social Justice/Tribal welfare authority denies the claim or backward class category candidate fails to substantiate claim for fees reimbursement with

documents in respect of his/her category, then it will be the responsibility of the candidate to pay the prescribed fees to the admitted Institute.

- 2. <u>If candidate seeks admission to Diploma after XIth and/or XIIth standard Pass/Fail and availed the fee concessions shall pay full tuition, development & other fees for equivalent number of years.</u>
- 3. Candidates claiming for fee concession under Backward Class category shall produce the Caste Certificate. Candidates claiming for fee concession under OBC, SBC, VJ/ DT(A), NT-B, NT-C and NT-D category shall also produce Non-Creamy layer certificate Valid up to 31st March 2016. The candidates not having validity of Non-creamy layer up to 31st March 2016 may submit the Non-creamy Layer certificate issued in the previous academic year having validity up to the cut off date of the current admission process, subjected to the condition that the candidate will have to submit the revised validity up to 31st March 2016 within a period of one month from the date of his / her admission in the institute, failing which the candidates admission in the institute stands cancelled on its own.
- 4. Hostel Fees in case of candidates opting for hostel accommodation, Insurance etc. and any other fees as applicable to respective institute shall be charged at institute level from the candidates.
- 5. Changes if any in the fees will be notified later and will be binding on the candidates.
- 6. The admission shall be confirmed only after payment of fees as indicated above.

### 17.2 Caution Money:

Caution money deposits received from the students shall be refunded after successful completion of the course or after cancelling the admission. Unless there is any recovery, no deduction shall be made from the caution money deposit.

However, the amount of caution money deposit shall be transferred to Students Aid Fund in case of Un-Aided colleges and credited to Government in case of Government and Non Government-Aided Colleges, if candidate does not apply for refund, as given below.

1. Within 3 complete financial years after the student actually leaves the institution;

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2. Within 3 complete financial years after the date of successful completion of the course, whichever is earlier

#### 17.3 Cancellation of admission and Refund of fees:

(Reference: 1) AICTE Guidelines No- AICTE/Legal/04(01)/2007, April 2007 & Circular No.698 Dated: 24th August 2007 issued by Pravesh Niyantran Samiti, Mumbai.

2) Minutes of the meeting, Item No 5(e), Shikshan Shulka Samiti & H&T, Dated 9th January 2013] The admitted candidate can cancel admission by submitting an **online application through candidate's login** only.

Procedure for cancellation of admission:-

- a) The candidate shall submit duly signed online system generated application for cancellation of admission to the institute immediately. (Handwritten application for cancellation of admission will not be accepted.)
- b) After receiving admission cancellation request from the candidate, the institute shall cancel the admission immediately and generate online acknowledgement of cancellation of admission through institute login without fail. (In case of online submission of the admission cancellation

request but non generation of the acknowledgement of cancellation of admission by the institute, candidate's admission will not be cancelled)

The refund of fees as applicable shall be made in due course. It is made clear that such application for cancellation will be considered if and only if the admission is confirmed by paying the prescribed tuition fee and other fees in full and by submitting the original documents. Refund shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges as shown below:

**Note:** Entire amount of Security/Caution Money Deposit is to be refunded to candidate.

# 17.4 Actions to be taken in case of excess admissions and late uploading of admitted Candidates.

#### 17.4.1 Excess admissions

- a. Excess admissions over the sanctioned intake shall not be allowed under any circumstances.
- b. In case any excess admission is reported/noted by the DTE, appropriate penal action will be initiated against the Institution.
- c. The Institution shall be liable to any one or more of the following punitive actions by the DTE as per GR no NGC-2005/(821/05) HE-3, Dated  $22^{nd}$  January 2007 or any orders by the Government in this regards
  - I.Surcharge amounting five times the total fees collected per student shall be levied against each excess admission
  - II. Seats equal to double the number of excess admissions shall be reduced from intake in the subsequent academic year
  - III.Suspension of approval for supernumerary seats
  - IV. No admission status in one/more courses
  - V. Withdrawal of approval for programme/course
  - VI. Withdrawal of approval of the Institution
  - VII.Institution shall be listed as defaulter and defaulter list shall be communicated to AICTE and will be published on DTE website for the information of general public

#### 17.4.2 Late uploading of Admitted candidates on DTE web site.

- a. After the display of allotment list in each CAP Round, candidates should report to the "**Respective Institutes"** as per the notified schedule of the admission process. (Refer Annexure-I for procedure & rules of reporting of each Round of Centralized Admission)
- b. Candidates shall report to the concerned institute with all original certificates needed to substantiate the claims made in the application regarding eligibility and reservation.
- c. After scrutiny of original documents at the concerned institute by Principal /Director of the institute, the candidate will have to pay prescribed fees immediately **as prescribed by the concerned institute** and confirm the admission offered.

- d. The Director/Principal of the **respective Institute** is required to carry out "**Online Update**" of the **confirmation/cancellation** of the candidate's admission on website through their Institute login, at the time when the candidate is being **admitted/cancelled** at the Institute.
- e. The system shall automatically generate letter of **confirmation/cancellation** of the admission as an acknowledgement.
- f. The institute is required to take a printout of the acknowledgement and then the status of candidate will change to 'Reported Candidate'.
- g. If a candidate fails to substantiate the claims made at the time of submitting the application form by submitting the necessary original documents and fails to pay the prescribed fees in full within the reporting time for CAP Round, the candidate forfeits the claim on the allotted seat immediately.
- h. It is the responsibility of the Director/Principal of concerned institute to update the status of the reporting of the candidate. If the institute fails to update the status of reporting in scheduled time, then such unreported seat(s) will be filled in subsequent CAP rounds and the institute will have to adjust these unreported candidate(s) against the institute level seats.
- i. If the institute fails to update the status of Cancellation of the candidate on the date of cancellation through "Online Update", then strict action shall be taken against such institutes. It is mandatory to cancel the admission through online system only and issue the printout of the "Online Receipt of the Cancellation" to the candidate with due seal and signature of the authority of the institute.
- j. The CAP allotment list will be available to the institute through their Institute Login. The list can be collected from Regional Offices also. The Institute should update the information of the reported candidates, allotted under CAP "Online update" when a candidate is reporting to the Institute.
- k. Rounds of admission for Institute Level Seats and for the seats remaining vacant after CAP should be carried out separately and it should be clearly displayed on the Notice board of the institute
- I. The Director/Principal of the institute has to also update the list of all admitted candidates on the DTE website through their institute login clearly indicating the stage of their admission like CAP, Against CAP vacancy, OMS, Institute level/ Minority seats, J&K seats, PIO, FN, FS, NRI etc. within 5 days from the cut off date of the admission. However institute should note that they shall be able to upload candidate's admission of not more than 10% of SI per choice code after declared cut off date of admission. Uploading Link will be closed on the last day of cut off date of uploading.
- m. If the institute fails to update the reporting of the candidate through "Online Update within specified time period", the action shall be taken against the institute as per Government Resolution No. TEM-2008/(52/08)/TE-1 Dt. 29/03/2008 issued by Higher & Technical Education Department and modifications there in from time to time.
- n. **The Director/Princip**al of the institute is required to update the list of all admitted candidates of CAP and Against CAP Vacancy Seats immediately as **per the schedule of admission on the** DTE website through their institute login.
- o. Three copies of list are to be printed and to be submitted to the concerned Regional Office of Technical Education, duly signed by the Director/Principal / Head of the Institute within 15 days from the cut off date.
- p. The regional office of the Joint Director of Technical Education shall verify the supporting documents and give final approval to the list of admitted candidate.

#### **Important Note:**

All the institutes are required to complete their admission process on or before the cut-off date as specified in the schedule. Any admission carried out after cut-off date will not be approved by DTE/RO.

#### **18.0** Concessions in tuition fee:

#### 18.1 E.B.C Concession:

Candidates claiming concessions for Economically Backward Class (E.B.C.) shall produce **a certificate from** Tahsildar/ Sub Divisional Officer / Deputy collector / Collector of the district to the effect that the candidate belongs to EBC category (the income is Rs. One lakh per annum) at the time of admission. They shall, on admission, also submit an application in the prescribed form for being granted the concession in tuition fee, to the appropriate authority through the Polytechnic they are admitted within one month from the actual date of joining of polytechnic or as may be required.

The students shall note that applications received after the due date may not be considered and in that case, they will have to pay the necessary fees.

- a. The concessions in tuition fee at the time of admission will be given only for Government and Government-Aided Institutions.
- b. The scheme/mode of concessions, scheme of loan scholarship (if any) for eligible EBC candidates, in tuition & other fees in the Un-Aided Institutions will be announced by the State Government.

## 18.2 Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme (TFWS) of AICTE

#### The salient features of the scheme are:-

- 1. Under the Scheme, 5 percent of sanctioned intake per course shall be available for these admissions. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature and to be filled through centralized admission process conduacted by DTE irrespective of the institute participate in CAP or not. Institutes not participating in CAP are not allowed to fill these seats at institute level.
- 2. Sons and daughters of parent having annual income of **less than Rs. 6.0 lakhs** from all sources shall only be eligible for seats under this scheme.
- 3. The scheme shall be mandatory (subject to the following procedure as laid down below to be followed) for all Institutions approved by the council.
- 4. The Waiver is limited to the tuition fee as approved by the State Level Fee Committee for self-financing Institutions and by the Government for the Government and Government Aided Institutions. All other Fee except tuition fees will have to be paid by the beneficiary.
- 5. These seats are not available in second shift courses.

# **Tuition Fee Waiver scheme shall be implemented as follows:**

- 1. The competent authority to effect these admissions is the State Government or its designated Authority. State Admission authority shall invite applications under this category, make a separate merit list for this category and effect admissions on the basis of the merit list so generated.
- All such additional seats shall be treated as TFWS seats of Maharashtra state quota. These
  additional seats will be filled as State Level seats and will be made available to eligible candidates
  (Whose names are appeared in TFWS Merit List) of **Tuition Fee Waiver scheme as a**separate choice.
- 3. In the event of non-availability of students in this category the same shall not be given to any other category of applicants.
- 4. Candidates willing to opt for TFWS seats will have to specify their willingness in the option form as a separate choice code.
- 5. Only Maharashtra State candidates will be admitted against such additional seats.
- 6. These seats shall be filled only through Round-I, Round II and Round III of CAP process.
- 7. If the competent authority finds that there is inadequate number of beneficiaries available for the particular course at the institute at the end of CAP Round-III then such seats will not be filled and will remain vacant.

- 8. List of Technical Institutes having approvals for Tuition Fee Waiver scheme shall be made available before the submission of option form.
- 9. The Institutions should publish in their brochure and web site the number of tuition fee waivers available in each category in each course/division.
- 10. The Competent Authority will prepare merit list of applicants from eligible students and will effect admissions strictly on merit basis.
- 11. A letter in this respect shall be issued by the Competent Authority for admissions to each beneficiary.
- 12. Students admitted under this scheme shall **not be allowed to change Institution/course** under any circumstances.
- 13. The competent authority and Institutions will display the information regarding admitted candidates in their respective web sites for information to the students and other stakeholders.
- 14. Candidates willing to opt for these additional TFWS seats **will have to submit income certificate** stating that his/her parent's annual income is less than Rs. 6.0 lakhs from all sources from the appropriate competent authority of the Maharashtra State.

# 18.3 Concession for sons and daughters of Teaching and Non-teaching staff of Primary, secondary, higher secondary schools:

Candidates claiming concessions for sons and daughters of primary, secondary school and higher secondary schools (junior colleges) teachers or non teaching staffs who are admitted in Government., Government.-Aided Polytechnics according to the Rules shall, at the time of admission, produce a declaration in a format as prescribed by the Government.

- a. A certificate from Head of school or college in support of the statement made in declaration duly endorsed by the Education Officer.
- b. They shall, on admission, also submit an application in the prescribed form for being granted the concession of tuition fee, to the appropriate authorities through the college to which they are admitted within one month from the actual date of joining of college or as may be required. The students shall note that applications received after the due date may not be considered and in that case, they will have to pay the necessary fees.
- c. The concessions in tuition fee at the time of admission will be given only for Government and Government-Aided Institutions.
- d. In case of Un-Aided colleges, such candidates will be required to pay the fees at the time of admission. The fees paid by such candidates will be reimbursed by the respective colleges only after the concession (if any) is granted by the respective Authority.

#### **18.4** Issue of School/College Leaving Certificate:

- a) If during the course of studies, a candidate desires to discontinue studies for any reason whatsoever, he or she shall be allowed to do so and it shall be presumed that he or she has cancelled admission at that stage. The Principal shall issue Institution Leaving Certificate and fees shall be refunded as provided in these rules.
- b) If the admission is cancelled on or before 31<sup>st</sup> August of the admission year, the original school or college leaving certificate on the strength of which a candidate was admitted shall be returned.
- c) If the admission is cancelled after 31<sup>st</sup> August of the admission year, the leaving certificate from the institution where the candidate was finally admitted should be issued. A true copy of the original school or college leaving certificate retained by the institute may be issued, if requested by the candidate, duly attested by the Head of the Institute.

### 19.0 Miscellaneous:

- a. The medium of instruction for Diploma courses in Engineering / Technology in all the institutes is English.
- b. Physical fitness: Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action. It is to be noted that Persons with Disability candidates are not provided with any additional facilities as far as the academic activities pertaining to the course is concerned.
- c. Excess admissions: No excess admission above the approved sanctioned intake of the institution is permitted in any case.
- d. Details of exemptions for candidate admitted to first year and having higher qualification is available on <a href="http://www.msbte.com">http://www.msbte.com</a>

#### 20.0 Hostel Accommodation:

Accommodation in Hostel cannot be guaranteed to all the candidates admitted. Hostel fees payable etc. should be ascertained by the students from the Principal of the Polytechnic to which they intend to take admission. Candidates (both boys and girls) are advised to verify personally whether the hostel accommodation is available or not, by contacting Principals of Polytechnics where they are intending to seek admission.

The Principal of the Polytechnics shall consider sympathetically on priority the applications of Persons with Disability candidates, sons and daughters of Jammu and Kashmir migrants and GoI nominees for Hostel accommodation.

#### 21.0 Conduct and Discipline

- a. Failure of the candidate in making full and correct Statements in the application form and/or suppression of any information and/or submission of false documents shall lead to disqualification of the candidate for admission. Such a candidate will be debarred from the entire admission process. Therefore the candidate is required to make only such claims which could be substantiated by relevant original documents.
- b. The students while studying in any college, if found indulging in <u>anti-national</u> activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.
- c. Not withstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Government. takes any policy decision pertaining to Diploma admissions, then the same shall be brought in to effect at that point of time as per the directives from the Government. from time to time.
- d. Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authority.
- e. If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be preferred within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final.

# 21.1 <u>Action against ragging</u>: Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 which is in effect from 15<sup>th</sup> May 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging.

- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited,
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complaints, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that there is no substance, prima facie, in the complaint received, he /she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final. If the head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above.

# As per the Appendix 12 of the AICTE Approval process hand book "Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging" is given below:

In view of the directions of the Honorable Supreme Court in SLP No. 24295 of 2006 dated 16-05-2007 and in Civil Appeal number 887 of 2009, dated 08-05-2009 to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student, in all higher education institutions in the country, and thereby, to provide for the healthy development, physically and psychologically, of all students, Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

#### What Constitutes Ragging

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- 1. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- 2. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- 3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- 4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- 5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- 6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;

- 8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- 9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

# Actions to be taken against students for indulging and abetting ragging in technical institutions

- A. The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents.
- B. Every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.
- C. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, with regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging.
- D. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following,
  - i. Cancellation of admission
  - ii. Suspension from attending classes
  - iii. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
  - iv. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
  - **v.** Withholding results
  - **vi.** Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or International meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
  - **vii.** Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
  - **viii.** Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
  - **ix.** Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
  - **x.** Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

### 21.2 Undertaking:

All candidates who have applied for admission shall be deemed to have submitted the following undertaking:

I have read all the Rules of Admission and after understanding these rules thoroughly, I have filled in the application form for admission for the current year.

The information given by me in my application is true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I understand that if any of the statements made by me in the application form or any information supplied by me in connection with my admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, my admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and I may be expelled from the college by the Principal.

- a. I have not been debarred from appearing at any examination held by any Government constituted or statutory examination authority in India.
- b. I fully understand that the offer of a course will be made to me depending on my inter se merit and availability of a seat at the time of scrutiny of my application, when I will actually report to the admission authority according to the schedule of admission.

- c. I understand that no document after the last date of submission will be entertained for the purpose of claims or concessions etc. in connection with my admission unless otherwise mentioned in the rules.
- d. I am fully aware that the Competent Authority or its representative will not make any correspondence with me regarding admission. I am also aware that it is entirely my responsibility to see the notices on the notice boards of concerned Admission Centre.
- e. I am aware that any rule imposed by the Examination Authority of MSBTE / Autonomous Institutes such as 'imposing limits on the number of attempts permissible to pass any examination' shall be binding on me.
- f. I hereby agree to conform to any Rules, Acts and Laws enforced by Government and I hereby undertake that, I will do nothing either inside or outside the institution which may result in disciplinary action against me under these rules, acts and laws referred to.
- g. I fully understand that the Principal of the college where I would be admitted, has a right to expel me from the institution for any infringement of the rules of conduct and discipline prescribed by the institution or MSBTE / Governing body of Autonomous Institutes or Government and the undertaking given above.
- h. I am fully aware of Condition of minimum attendance that, I will not be allowed to appear for the examination if I do not attend minimum 75% theory classes, and 100% practical, drawing etc. I am also aware that I will not be allowed to appear for the examination, if I fail to submit satisfactorily all the assignments, jobs, journals, drawings, reports as specified by the MSBTE / Governing body of Autonomous Institutes within stipulated time limit.

### 22.0 Transfer of Student:

- a. A candidate once admitted in the first year or semester of a course shall not be transferred during the same year or first two semesters to any other institution or course for any reason.
- b. Candidates who got admission under TFWS/supernumerary seats are not eligible for transfer/change of branch during entire duration of the course.
- c. There shall be no transfer of students at any stage from Government. and Government. Aided Autonomous
  - Institutes to another Government , Government Aided autonomous institute.
- d. A candidate admitted in any Government or Government. Aided non autonomous polytechnic and passing the first year in a yearly pattern or both the semesters of first year of that any higher year as the case may be, in full or with only one ATKT, may be transferred to another Government or Government. Aided non autonomous polytechnic in next year on getting admission in the same course or another course, if eligible, provided vacancy exists and he/ she stands in merit in comparison to other candidates aspiring for such change. In this case, the Principal of the Government. Government Aided polytechnic if authorized by the Joint Director of respective region to admit such candidates by the following approved procedure. The aspiring candidate shall apply to the Principal of parent Institute & also seek NOC from the other Polytechnic where the candidate wish to take transfer. The priority for such admissions shall be in the following order:
  - a) Candidates from the same polytechnic aspiring for the change of course.
  - b) Candidates from other polytechnics aspiring for only transfer into their original discipline.
  - c) Candidates from other polytechnics aspiring for transfer as well as change of course.
- e. The candidate from unaided polytechnics shall not be eligible for transfer to Government or Government. Aided polytechnics.
- f. The above eligibility criterion for transfer of candidates from and among the Unaided polytechnics also will be applicable to unaided polytechnics provided both the polytechnics issue

- NOC in writing for the respective transfers and the examination authority issues NOC for change of branch and **Such transfers shall have prior permission/approval of the Joint Director of Technical Education of the concerned region(s).**
- g. Transfers made in accordance with these clauses should be reported immediately to the Director of Technical Education, (MS), Mumbai and also to the Secretary/Dy Secretary, MSBTE, Mumbai / Regional Offices of Board of Technical Education, by the Principal of the polytechnic to which the candidate is transferred along with a copy of approval order of transfer.
- h. In case of the transfer of the candidate from the Polytechnic in a particular region to the Polytechnic situated in other Region, such transfer shall be effected with prior approval of the Director of Technical Education, Mumbai.(M.S.)

### 23.0 Transfers due to closure of Course/Institute

If the AICTE has given permission for the closure of the Course/Institute for the current academic year AND the students on roll for Second &Third year [including candidates admitted in supernumerary quota] are less than 20 students for the respective Second or Third year then competent authority shall transfer the candidate admitted in the previous academic years [including candidates admitted in supernumerary quota] studying in that corresponding year (Second/Third) in any unaided Institutes to any other Unaided institutes the same district/region/outside region where vacancies within sanctioned intake exist on the request of the Institute & as per the preference given by students.

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# **Annexure 1**

### Procedure for Centralized Admission Process (CAP) for the academic year 2015-16

The procedure for CAP consists of following **major** stages:

- 1. **Sale of Information Brochure** along with Application Kit at designated ARCs
- 2. **Filling up** of Online Application form on website www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015, for each of the CAP rounds I/II/III by eligible candidates.
- 3. **Confirmation** of Online Option Form for each of the CAP rounds I/II by the eligible candidate **through his/her Login only.**
- 4. <u>Display of provisional Merit List</u> on website www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015, indicating State Merit No, Home District Merit No, State Category Merit No etc.
- 5. <u>Display of Provisional Allotment</u> indicating allotment after each of the CAP rounds I/II on the website <u>www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015</u> and at the <u>ARC</u>
- 6. **Reporting to the institute** as per allotment of the CAP rounds I/II and confirmation of admission by the candidate
- 7. Conduction of CAP round-III i.e. admission round by counselling at District Level.

#### NOTE:

OMS candidates are not permitted to fill Online Application Form & Online Option Forms of CAP rounds. However, such OMS candidate can apply separately for the seats coming under the purview of the Institute Authorities (Institute Level seats) to be filled by the respective unaided institute at the institute level.

The **Centralized Allotment Process** (CAP) has following stages:

### **Stage I – Availability of the Information brochure:**

- 1. All aspiring Candidates are required to procure/purchase the Information Brochure along with Application Kit from the designated ARCs.
- 2. The Application Kit consists of Application ID and Password as well as important instructions/guidelines and various stages for CAP Admission. The candidate can submit the application form with the help of the Application ID and password.
- 3. Rules & Institute Information brochure for Academic Year 2015-16 will be available for **Rs.400/**for General Category candidates and **Rs.300/** for reserved Category and Physical Handicap
  (belonging to Maharashtra State only) candidates at all the ARCs mentioned in Annexure 3.
- 4. All the information printed in the brochure will also be available on the website www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015 for browsing, downloading and printing.

## Stage II - Filling online Application form for CAP Admission

- 1. The candidate has to login to the website www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015 through his/her Application ID and Password provided in the Application Kit.
- 2. The Candidate has to fill online application for CAP Admission and take the printout of the online submitted application form.
- 3. The Candidates are required to attach the attested copies of required documents mentioned in the application form.

- 4. The Candidate should go to the any ARC **in person** for verification & confirmation of Online Application along with the Original and attested copies of required documents.
- 5. The ARC officer shall verify and scrutinise the online filled application with online printed copy of application form and documents attached and after verification, confirms the Application form of the candidate and shall issue the acknowledgement cum receipt of confirmation of Application Form.
- 6. Once the application is confirmed at ARC, no change in the application form is allowed.
- 7. The J & K Migrant candidates required to fill the Online Application Form by procuring Information brochure along with Application Kit from any ARC, and submit online printed application along with required documents as per the notified schedule by post/by hand to The Principal, S.B.M. Polytechnic, Near Cooper Hospital, Vile Parle (West), Mumbai as their admission shall be done by counselling.
- 8. Candidates claiming NCC seats shall submit the separate application along with required documents through their respective NCC units wherein these students has been enrolled. The NCC units shall forward applications to Director of N.C.C., Maharashtra State, A.F.I. Building, Mumbai Hospital Lane, Near Metro Cinema, Mumbai 400 020 for verification and recommendation. Only names of the recommended candidates by The Director of N.C.C., Maharashtra will appear in the Merit List.

## Stage- III: Display of provisional Merit list for Maharashtra Candidates

Provisional Merit List of eligible Maharashtra candidates will be displayed on dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015 and at the ARCs as per the schedule.

- For discrepancy in the provisional merit list, if any, get the corrections by lodging the grievance at ARCs, where the candidate has confirmed the application within the period specified in the schedule. No additional document to substantiate the claim made in application shall be accepted.
- 2. Final merit of the candidate will be displayed on the www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015 and at ARCs as per the Schedule.
- 3. Merit list of eligible J & K Migrant candidates will be displayed on <a href="https://www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015">www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015</a> after scrutiny of all documents as per schedule.

**Note:-**The merit list gives relative position of the candidate and it does not guarantee admission to any course.

## Stage- IV - Filling online option form for CAP Round(s)

- 1. The candidate whose names are appeared in the Merit List has to login to the website www.dtemaharashtra.gov.in/poly2015 through his/her Application ID and Password.
- 2. The candidate eligible for CAP Round I/II should fill the Online Option Form.
- 3. The Candidate should select the choice codes in order of preference i.e. first, second etc. for example, for CAP Round-I, candidates can fill minimum 1 and maximum 100 options.
- 4. The Candidate must confirm his/her filled in option form for CAP Round I & II through his/her login ID. For this it is **not mandatory** for candidates to approach to ARC for filling and confirmation of Option forms. They can do so from either home or from place convenient to them. However if candidate wishes to approach ARC, then he/she has to pay Rs.50/- as facilitation charges to ARC.
- 5. The candidate has to generate the acknowledgement cum receipt of confirmation of Option form for CAP Round(s) through his /her Login ID.

- 6. Once the options are confirmed by himself/herself through his/her login ID, no change in the options / preferences is allowed thereafter under any circumstances.
- 7. The status of Allotment will be available on the website only and no separate allotment letter will be issued to the candidate.
- 8. The J & K Migrant candidates not required to fill the Online Option Form, as their admission shall be done by counselling.

**Note:-** If candidate fails to confirm options/preference and get acknowledgement of confirmation he/she will not be considered for allotment.

# Stage-V: Display of Provisional Allotment for Round(s), Rules of Reporting to the "Respective Institutes" and confirmation of the admission of Cap Round(s).

These will be a direct allotment rounds. At the start of this round, total seats available for allotment will be the CAP seats for the Diploma courses. The allotment in this round will be done on the basis of options confirmed by the candidate, *inter se merit* of the eligible candidate and available seats at that point of time during the allotment stage/process.

- The allotment of eligible candidates for respective rounds will be displayed on the website.
- The candidate should to take a printout of the displayed allotment.
- No separate allotment letter will be issued to the candidate.
- The candidate will report to the allotted institute and confirm the admission at the respective Institute along with the necessary original documents as specified in Annexure-II and pay full fees.
- The respective Institute will carry out "Online Update" of the confirmation of the candidate's
  admission on website through their Institute login, at the time when the candidate is being
  admitted at the Institute.
- The system shall automatically generate letter of confirmation of the admission as an acknowledgement.
- The institute is required to take a printout of the acknowledgement and then the status of candidate will change to 'Reported Candidate'.
- If the candidate (to whom it is Mandatory to report after allotment) fails to report to and confirm the admission at the Institute, on or before the last date of reporting at the Institute then the candidate shall lose claim on the allotted seat
- Such seats will be treated as vacant seat for subsequent rounds of CAP.
- The candidates will be able to know the status of reporting, his/her eligibility for next round through login.

#### Rules of Reporting of CAP Round-I:

1. All candidates who have secured First choice allotment will not be eligible for subsequent CAP rounds irrespective of whether the candidate confirms the admission or not. Hence such candidates are advised to confirm the admission at the respective Institute as per the secured allotment in the CAP Round-I since names of such candidates will be automatically deleted from the subsequent lists of eligible candidates for subsequent CAP rounds.

- 2. Candidates (other than those covered in above stated rule no. 1)
  - who have secured an allotment which is not first option

#### And

• who are satisfied with the allotment of CAP Round-I

#### Δnd

• who are no more interested in participating in subsequent CAP rounds

may confirm the admission by reporting at the respective institute. If such candidate confirms the admission, then they will not be eligible to participate in subsequent CAP rounds. Names of such candidates will be automatically deleted from the subsequent list of eligible candidates for subsequent CAP rounds.

**3.** All such seats, on which the candidates have confirmed the admission on or before the last date of reporting of CAP Round-I, shall not be available for allotment in subsequent CAP rounds.

# Rules of Reporting for CAP Round-II:

- 1. All candidates who have secured **Any one of the first Seven options** will not be eligible for subsequent CAP rounds irrespective of whether the candidate confirms the admission or not. Hence such candidates are advised **to confirm the admission** at the respective Institute as per the secured allotment in the CAP Round-III since names of such candidates will be automatically deleted from the subsequent lists of eligible candidates for subsequent CAP rounds.
- 2. Candidates (other than those covered in above stated rule no. 1)
  - who have secured an allotment which is not out of first Seven options

#### And

who are satisfied with the allotment of CAP Round-II

#### And

who are no more interested in participating in subsequent CAP rounds

may confirm the admission by reporting at the respective institute. If such candidate confirms the admission, then they will not be eligible to participate in subsequent CAP rounds. Names of such candidates will be automatically deleted from the subsequent list of eligible candidates for subsequent CAP rounds.

**3.** All such seats, on which the candidates have confirmed the admission on or before the last date of reporting of CAP Round-II, shall not be available for allotment in subsequent CAP rounds.

# Stage-VI: CAP Round III- Counseling round of Admission

# **Eligible Candidates for CAP Round-III:**

The candidates whose names have appeared in the Maharashtra State Merit List of CAP round-IV published by the Directorate of Technical Education.

#### **Available Seats**

- 1. All Maharashtra State seats under purview of Competent Authority except the seats for which the candidates have reported in Round-I & Round II.
- 2. All vacant seats shall be available without any seat tag such as Backward, PH, HD, OHD etc. will be considered as State Level General seats.

# **Rules of Reporting for CAP Round-III:**

- Eligible candidates must report in-person at the venue of "Center of Counseling Round" in order to secure admission in this round of admission strictly as per the notified schedule. Candidate who reports late will not be allowed to participate in this round. Name of Center of Counseling Round for CAP Round III (counselling) will be notified in newspaper & DTE website.
- 2. Candidate is required to pay processing fees of CAP Round-III, **Rs.100/- in cash** at the **Center of Counseling Round** and obtain a receipt for the same.
- 3. The candidate will report as per schedule at the **Center of Counseling Round** along with the necessary original documents. Candidates excluding SC/ST category shall carry part payment of **non-refundable** fees of Rs. 3000/- in cash.
- 4. Eligible Candidates who report to the **Center of Counseling Round** will be offered admission to available seat as per the inter se merit of candidates.
- 5. All Candidates who secure admission in this round must confirm the admission on the spot by paying non-refundable fees of Rs. 3000/- (Excluding SC/ST) and producing necessary documents in original for verification.
- 6. The **Center of Counseling Round** will update the confirmation of the candidate's admission on DTE website through the login immediately.

Candidate will have to report later on to the respective Institute for paying balance fees (i.e. Total fees less Rs. 3,000/- paid by the candidate at Respective Institute) as per notified schedule. If the candidate fails to report to the Institute and pay the balance fees on or before the last date of reporting at the Institute then the candidate shall lose claim on the allotted seat as well on the Rs. 3000/- paid by the candidate at the **Center of Counseling Round**.

# **Guidelines for the Admission Process to be carried out by Unaided Polytechnics**

Application forms shall be available in respective unaided polytechnics for the period of 15 days after the day of declaration of SSC result of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Certificate Examination.

Candidates can submit duly filled Application to respective Unaided Polytechnics on or before 15<sup>th</sup> day after the day of declaration of S.S.C. Examination Result upto 5.00 p.m. (Excluding the day of declaration of result).

#### Admissions to CAP allotees for the institute

Admission authority in the institute shall follow the procedure mentioned under rule 14.3 for Reporting of candidates.

# Eligibility criteria of candidates for admission process to be carried out at institute level for the vacant seats after CAP Rounds:

## **Seats available:**

Vacancy within sanctioned intake due to the Non Reporting of candidates, Non Allotment and Cancellations (if any). In Unaided Non Minority Colleges, the vacancies in backward class category seats within sanctioned intake shall be filled after removing the seat tag i.e. by treating these seats as GENERAL seats. The seats thus shall be filled after preparing a common merit list of all the candidates who have applied for the Vacancy round at the respective Unaided Non Minority Colleges.

# The seats shall be filled in the following order of preference.

# a. Maharashtra State candidates (HD & OHD candidates)

Refer Eligibility as given in Rule No 2.1 of this Brochure

To resolve a tie i.e. more than one candidate securing equal marks in aggregate marks, the procedure given in Rule 12.2 of Information Brochure" shall be adopted.

### b. Outside Maharashtra State candidates (Refer Rule 1.4 & 1.6)

Refer Eligibility as given in Rule No 2.1 of this Brochure

To resolve a tie i.e. more than one candidate securing equal marks in aggregate marks, the procedure given in Rule 12.2 of Information Brochure" shall be adopted.

#### **Guidelines for the admission:**

- 1. All admissions shall be done in fully fair and transparent Manner & shall be Merit based.
- 2. Separate merit lists for Home Districts (70% quota) and Other than Home District (30% quota) shall be prepared and displayed for the admission purpose
- 3. Separate merit lists for OMS Candidates shall be prepared and displayed for the admission purpose. (This should be effected as per rule 1.4 & 1.6)
- 4. The Principals of the respective Un aided polytechnics shall invite applications for the seats available by giving publicity at least in two leading newspapers in state. Institutes are required to mention the name of newspaper in which sanctioned seats will be notified in their prospectus / brochure. Detailed schedule of the admission process shall display.
- 5. Aspiring candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria shall apply directly to the Principal of the respective colleges for admissions.

**6.** Information brochure/prospectus of the Institute which includes these rules formulated by DTE should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission for seats to be filled at the Institute Level. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institute's website.

# **Guidelines for the admission process for Institute level seats:**

All admissions shall be done in fully fair and transparent Manner & shall be Merit based. The Principals of the respective Un aided Polytechnics shall invite applications for the seats available by giving publicity at least in two newspapers. Institutes are required to mention the name of newspaper in which available seats will be notified in their prospectus/brochure. Detailed schedule of the admission process is also to be displayed.

Aspiring candidates fulfilling the eligibility criteria shall apply directly to the Principal of the respective Polytechnics/Institutes for admissions. These admissions will be made in a transparent manner and strictly as per the merit of the candidates who have applied to the institute.

Information brochure/prospectus of the Institute which specifies rules of admission should be published well before the commencement of the process of admission for seats to be filled at the Institute Level. All the information in the brochures should also be displayed on the Institute's website. For details refer **Rule No 1.4 & 1.6** 

### **General Notes:**

- 1. The allotment list of CAP rounds will be available to the institute through their Institute Login. The Institute should update the information of the reported candidates, allotted under CAP on the same day on which the candidate is reporting to the institute.
- 2. The Principal of the institute has to update the branch wise list of admitted candidates on DTE website through their institute login clearly indicating the stage of their admission like CAP, Maharashtra Candidate against vacancy, OMS candidate against vacancy, Institute Level seats, J&K Migrant seats etc. within 10 days from the cut off date of admission. Institutes not updating list of admitted candidates on website before cut off date will be penalised as per Government Resolution.
- 3. Institutes starting courses/filling seats over & above sanctioned intake without AICTE/Government approval will be penalised as per GR No NSG-2005/(821/05) HE-3 dated 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2007. (Refer Rule No 17.4)
