3. To examine the public confidence in the fairness transparency, and security of electoral systems to address concerns and enhance trust in the democratic process.
4. To explore public sentiments towards current voting policies.

In a democratic system, the right to vote empowers individuals to shape the course of their government, fostering a collective voice that reflects diverse perspectives. This fundamental right not only guarantees political agency but also serves as a safeguard against tyranny and discrimination.

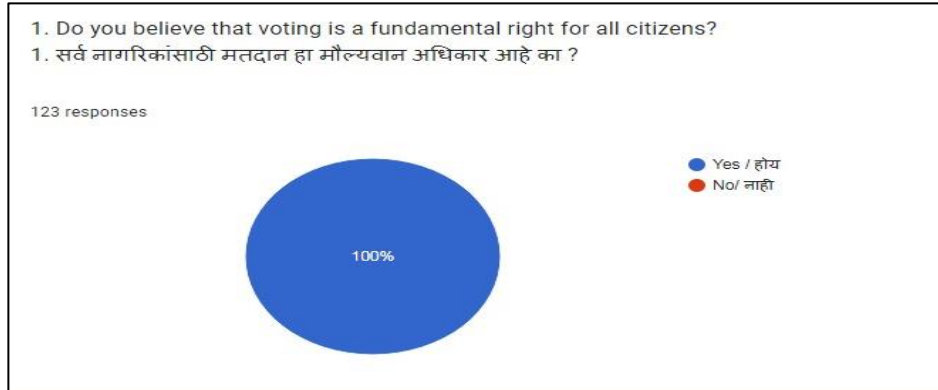
Our main objective is to raise awareness among the people about voting rights. To fulfill this goal, we conducted a survey, collecting responses to various questions. The survey was carried out using a Google Form on December 8, 2023, in the vicinity of Sawantwadi taluka.

Following questions are asked are as follows:-

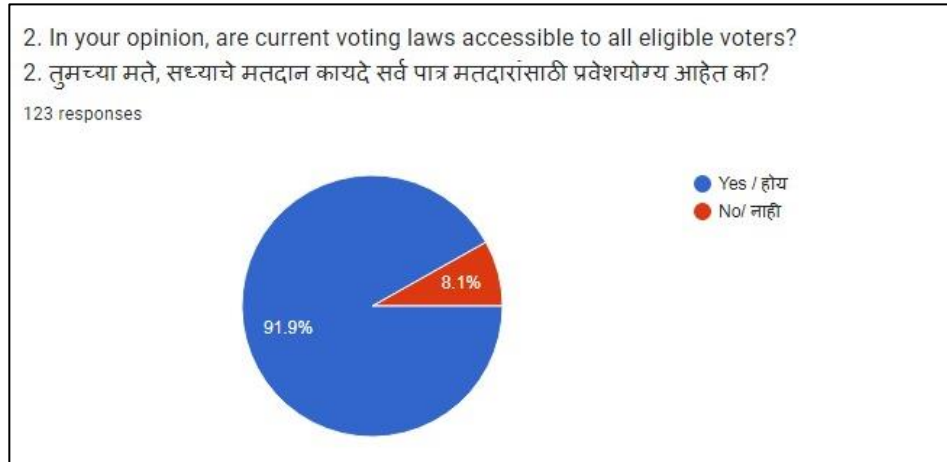
1. Do you believe that voting is fundamental right for all citizens?
2. In your opinion, are current voting laws accessible to all eligible voters?
3. Do you feel informed about recent changes or discussion regarding voting rights?
4. Should there be any additional measures in place to protect voting rights?
5. Do you think voting rights issues have significant impact on the overall democratic process?
6. What do you think, voting papers are required for validity of elections?

The survey gathered a total of 123 responses, and the collected opinions of the individuals were compiled and presented in the form of a pie chart.

Survey Analysis



From this above pie chart, it was observed that 100% respondent believed that voting is fundamental rights.

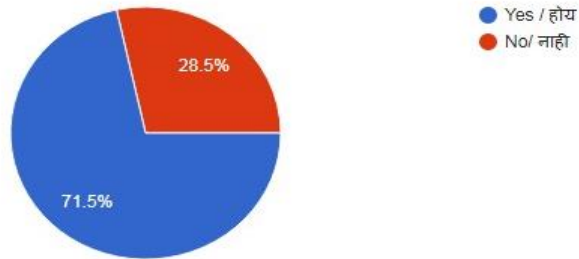


In the given pie chart, it was noted that 91.9% of respondents agreed that existing voting laws are accessible to all eligible voters, while 8.1% expressed the view that these laws are not accessible to everyone eligible.

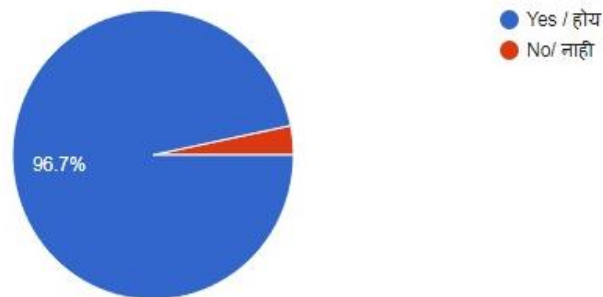

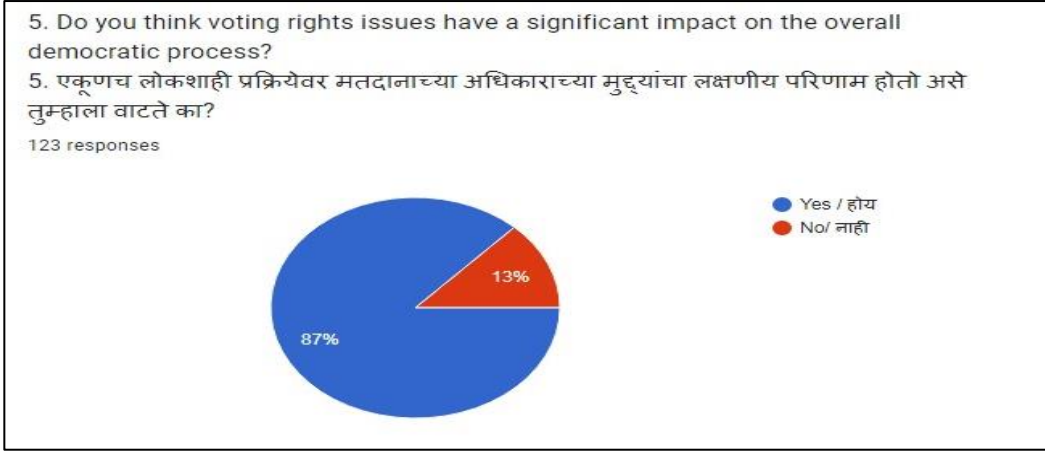
4. Should there be any additional measures in place to protect voting rights?

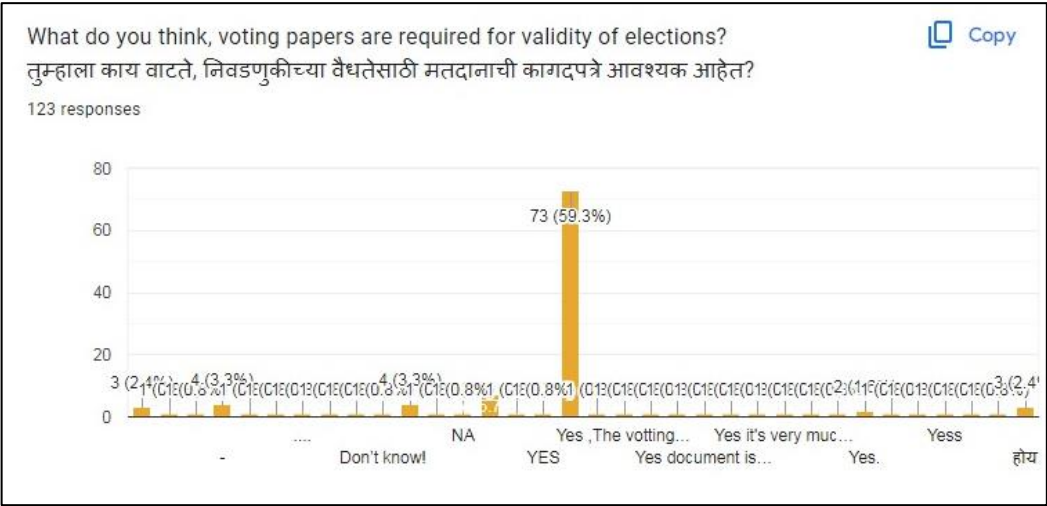

From this above pie chart, it was observed that 96.5% respondents think that additional measures are needed to protect voting rights.



From this above pie chart, it was observed that 87% respondents think that voting rights give significant impact on democratic process whereas 13% respondent think that voting rights does not give significant impact on democratic process.



From above bar graph, it was observed that 59.3% respondents think that voting papers are required for validity of elections.
